Fabric amounts based on yardage that is 42" wide.

Notes Before You Begin

- Read through all of the instructions before beginning.
- All of the seam allowances are 1/4" unless otherwise noted.
- Press seam allowances open unless otherwise noted.
- Width of fabric (WOF) is equal to at least 42" wide.
- Right sides together has been abbreviated to RST.
- Remember to measure twice and cut once!

From Fabric A, cut:

eleven 1" x WOF strips. Subcut: eighty 1" x 3" rectangles. eighty 1" x 2-1/2" rectangles.

From each of Fabrics B-I cut:

three 3" x WOF strips. Subcut: ten 3" x 5-1/2" rectangles. ten 3" squares. ten 2-1/2" squares.

From the Binding Fabric, cut:

five 2-1/2" x WOF strips.

Assemble the Quadrants

Step 1: Gather one 1" x 3" Fabric A rectangle, one 1" x 2-1/2" Fabric A rectangle, one 3" x 5-1/2" Fabric B rectangle, one 3" Fabric B square, and one 2-1/2" Fabric B square.


Step 2: Sew the 1" x 2-1/2" Fabric A rectangle to the left edge of the 2-1/2" Fabric B square. Press the seam toward the rectangle.

Step 3: Sew the 1" x 3" Fabric A rectangle to the top edge of the unit. Press the seam toward the rectangle.

Step 4: Sew the 3" Fabric B square to the top edge of the unit. Press the seam toward the square.

Step 5: Sew the 3" \times 5-1/2" Fabric B rectangle to the left edge of the unit. Press the seam toward the rectangle.

Step 6: Repeat Steps 1-5 using sets of Fabric B-I squares and rectangles to make:




Assemble the Blocks


Step 7: Gather one Fabric I quadrant, one Fabric F quadrant, one Fabric G quadrant, and one Fabric C quadrant. Arrange the quadrants in two rows of two as shown. Notice how the Fabric A pieces of each quadrant form a square in the center. Sew the quadrants together to form rows. Press the seam of the top row toward the left and the seam of the bottom row toward the right. Sew the rows together and press the seam toward the top to complete and an A Block. Make six A Blocks.

Step 8: Gather one Fabric D quadrant, one Fabric H quadrant, one Fabric B quadrant, and one Fabric E quadrant. Arrange the quadrants in two rows of two as shown. Notice how the Fabric A pieces of each quadrant are placed differently from the A Blocks. Sew the quadrants together to form rows. Press the seam of the top row toward the left and the seam of the bottom row toward the right. Sew the rows together and press the seam toward the bottom to complete and a B Block. Make six B Blocks.

Step 9: Gather one Fabric D quadrant, one Fabric H quadrant, one Fabric B quadrant, and one Fabric E quadrant. Arrange the quadrants in two rows of two as shown. Notice how the Fabric A pieces of each quadrant are placed to form the square in the center like the A Blocks. Sew the quadrants together to form rows. Press the seam of the top row toward the left and the seam of the bottom row toward the right. Sew the rows together and press the seam toward the bottom to complete and a C Block. Make four C Blocks.

Step 10: Gather one Fabric I quadrant, one Fabric F quadrant, one Fabric G quadrant, and one Fabric C quadrant. Arrange the quadrants in two rows of two as shown. Notice how the Fabric A pieces of each quadrant are placed differently from the A and C Blocks. Sew the quadrants together to form rows. Press the seam of the top row toward the left and the seam of the bottom row toward the right. Sew the rows together and press the seam toward the bottom to complete and a D Block. Make four D Blocks.



Assemble the Quilt



Step 11: Arrange the blocks into five rows of four blocks. Make note of the placement of Blocks A-D in the Quilt Assembly Diagram.

Step 12: Sew the blocks together to form rows. Press the seams to the left in the odd-numbered rows and to the right in the even-numbered rows.

Step 13: Sew the rows together to form the quilt center. Press the row seams open.

Your quilt top is complete! Baste, quilt, bind, and enjoy!

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
