## Notes Before You Begin

- Read through all of the instructions before beginning.
- All of the seam allowances are $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ unless otherwise noted.
- Press seam allowances open unless otherwise noted.
- Width of fabric (WOF) is equal to at least 42" wide.
- Right sides together has been abbreviated to RST.
- Remember to measure twice and cut once!


## Cutting Instructions

From Fabric A, cut:
twelve 4" x WOF strips. Subcut:
one-hundred and twenty 4" squares
twelve 3-7/8" x WOF strips. Subcut:
one-hundred and twenty 3-7/8" squares
From Fabric B, cut:
six 4" x WOF strips. Subcut:
sixty 4" squares
From each of Fabrics $C$ and $L$, cut:
one 7-1/4" x WOF strip. Subcut:
one $7-1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ square
two 4" squares
From each of Fabrics $D$ and $K$, cut:
one 7-1/4" x WOF strip. Subcut:
two 7-1/4" squares
four 4" squares
From each of Fabrics E and J, cut:
one 7-1/4" x WOF strip. Subcut:
three 7-1/4" squares six 4" squares

From each of Fabrics $F$ and $I$, cut:
one 7-1/4" x WOF strip. Subcut:
four 7-1/4" squares
one 4" x WOF strip. Subcut:
eight 4" squares
From Fabrics $\mathbf{G}$ and $H$, cut:
one 7-1/4" x WOF strip. Subcut: five 7-1/4" squares
one 4" x WOF strip. Subcut: ten 4" squares

From the Binding Fabric, cut:
seven 2-1/2" x WOF strips.

## Assemble the Half-Square Triangles (HSTs)

Step 1: Pair a 4" Fabric A square with a 4" Fabric B square, RST. Mark a diagonal line on the wrong side of one square. Sew $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ away from both sides of the marked line. Cut on the marked line creating two half-square triangles (HSTs). Press toward the darker fabric. Trim to 3-1/2" square. Repeat to make one-hundred and twenty HSTs.

Step 2: Repeat Step 1 to make:

## Assemble the Flying Geese

Step 3: Pin two 3-7/8" Fabric A squares in opposing corners of a 7-1/4" Fabric C square, RST. The squares will overlap slightly in the center of the large square. Using a ruler, draw a diagonal line through the squares.


Step 4: Sew scant 1/4" seam on each side of the diagonal line. Set the seam by pressing it flat. Cut along the diagonal line, creating two identical units.

Step 5: Press the fabric toward smaller triangles. Repeat with the second unit.


Step 6: Place one 3-7/8" Fabric A square at the corner of a sewn block unit. Draw a diagonal line in pencil. Sew a scant 1/4" seam on each side of the diagonal line. Set seam (press). Cut along the diagonal line, creating two identical units.


Step 7: Press the seam toward the smaller triangle. Trim off small dog ears left by the seam allowance. Trim to $3-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 6-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ if necessary. Make four A/C flying
 geese units.

Step 8: Repeat with all remaining 3-7/8" Fabric A squares and 7-1/4" Fabric D-L squares to make a total of:

eight $A / D$
Flying Geese

sixteen $A / I$ Flying Geese

twelve A/E Flying Geese

twelve A/J
Flying Geese

sixteen $A / F$ Flying Geese

eight A/K
Flying Geese

twenty A/G Flying Geese

four A/L Flying Geese

## Assemble the Pinwheel Units

Step 9: Gather four A/C HSTs. Arrange them in two rows of two to form a pinwheel. Sew the HSTs together to form rows, then press the seams open. Sew the rows together, then press the seam open.


Step 10: Repeat with sets of four matching HSTs to make a total of:

three A/E
Pinwheels

three A/J Pinwheels

two A/K
Pinwheels

five A/G
Pinwheels

five A/H
Pinwheels

one A/L
Pinwheel

## Assemble the Blocks

Step 11: Gather four A/B HSTs, one A/C Pinwheel, and four A/C Flying Geese. Arrange them in three rows of three as shown. Sew the HSTs together to form rows, then press the seams open. Sew the rows together, then press the seam open.


Step 12: Repeat with to make:

Step 13: Arrange the blocks into six rows of five blocks. Note the fabric placement and block orientation in the Quilt Assembly Diagram.

Step 14: Sew the blocks together to form rows. Press the seams to the left in the odd-numbered rows and to the right in the even-numbered rows.

Step 15: Sew the rows together to form the quilt center. Press the row seams open.

Your quilt top is complete! Baste, quilt, bind, and enjoy!


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
