

Fabric amounts based on yardage that is 42" wide.

- Read through all of the instructions before beginning.
- All of the seam allowances are 1/4" unless otherwise noted.
- Press seam allowances open unless otherwise noted.
- Width of fabric (WOF) is equal to at least 42" wide.
- Right sides together has been abbreviated to RST.
- Remember to measure twice and cut once!

# **Cutting Instructions**

#### From Fabric A, cut:

one 12-1/2" x WOF strip. Subcut: four 7-1/2" x 12-1/2" rectangles seven 5" x WOF strips. Subcut: fifty-six 5" squares for the HSTs eight 4-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut: one hundred twelve of Template 1 twenty-four 2-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut: twenty-three 2-1/2" x 12-1/2" block sashing strips Sew the remaining strips together in pairs, then trim to make: six 2-1/2" x 82-1/2" columns sashing strips two 2-1/2" x 72-1/2" top/bottom outer borders

#### From Fabric B, cut:

four 4-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut: twenty-eight 4-1/2" squares

#### From each of Fabrics C-P, cut:

one 5" x WOF strip. Subcut: four 5" squares for the HSTs one 4-1/2" x WOF strip. Subcut: eight of Template 2 eight of Template 2-Reversed From the remainder of one strip, cut: eight 1-1/2" squares for the snowball corners. Mark a diagonal on the wrong side of each square.

#### From the Binding Fabric, cut:

nine 2-1/2" x WOF strips

## Assemble the Half-Square Triangles

**Step 1:** Pair a 5" Fabric A square with a 5" Fabric C square, RST. Mark a diagonal line on the wrong side of one square. Sew 1/4" away from both sides of the marked line. Cut on the marked line, creating two half-square triangles (HSTs). Press toward the darker fabric. Trim to 4-1/2" square. Repeat to make eight A/C HSTs.

**Step 2:** Repeat Step 1 to make eight HSTs from each of Fabrics C-P, each time pairing the fabric with a Fabric A square.

#### Assemble the Triangle Units

**Step 3:** Sew a Fabric C/Template 2 triangle along one long edge of a Fabric A/Template 1 triangle and sew, RST. Press toward Template 2. Sew a Fabric C/Template 2-Reversed triangle along the remaining long edge of Fabric A/Template 1 triangle and sew, RST. Press toward Template 2-Reversed. Trim to 4-1/2" square, if needed. Repeat to make eight A/C triangle units.

Step 4: Repeat Step 3 to make eight Triangle Units from each of Fabrics C-P.

#### Assemble the Snowball Units

**Step 5:** Place a 1-1/2" Fabric C square RST with a 4-1/2" Fabric B square, aligned at the top and left edges, placing the marked diagonal as shown. Sew on the marked line. Trim the seam allowance to 1/4" and press toward the triangle.

**Step 6:** Repeat Step 5 at the remaining three corners to make a snowball unit. Trim to 4-1/2" square, if needed. Repeat to make two Fabric C Snowball Units.


**Step 7:** Repeat Steps 5 and 6 to make two Snowball Units from each of Fabrics C-P.

## Assemble the Blocks

**Step 8:** Gather: four A/C HSTs four A/C triangle units one Fabric C snowball unit

Arrange the units into three rows of three. Note the fabric placement and block orientation in the Block Assembly Diagram.

**Step 9:** Sew the squares together to form the rows. Press the seams away from the triangle units.












**Step 10:** Sew the rows together, nesting the seams and pressing the seams to one side to form the block.

The completed block should measure 12-1/2" square.

**Step 11:** Repeat Steps 8-10 to make two Blocks each from Fabrics C-P.



#### Assemble the Quilt

**Step 12:** Arrange the Blocks, block sashing strips and 7-1/2" x 12-1/2" Fabric A rectangles together as indicated in the Quilt Assembly Diagram to form columns. Sew each row together, using sashing strips between each block. Press seams toward the sashing. Repeat to make five columns, using the Fabric A rectangles where indicated in Columns 2 and 3.


**Step 13:** Sew the column sashing and block columns together. Press seams open or to the sashing.

Step 14: Sew the top and bottom outer borders to the quilt center. Press toward the borders.

Your quilt top is complete! Baste, quilt, bind and enjoy!

Print at 100%. Check size printed correctly using 1" box for scale prior to cutting fabric.





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
