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## Notes Before You Begin

- Read through all of the instructions before beginning.
- All of the seam allowances are $1 / 4$ unless otherwise noted.
- Press seam allowa nces open unless otherwise noted.
- Width of fabric (WOF) is equal to at least 42" wide.
- Right sidestogether has been abbreviated to RST.
- Ha lf-square triangle has been abbreviated to HST.
- Rememberto measure twice and cut once!


## Cutting Instructions

## From Fabric A, cut

five 5" x WOF strips. Subc ut:
forty 5" squa res for the HSTs
eight 4-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut:
twenty $4-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ squares for the block centers
eighty $2-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 4-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles for the blocks
ten 1-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut:
fifteen 1-1/2" $\times 12-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ block sa shing strips
Sew the rema ining five WOF strips together, end-to-end, then trim to yield:
four 1-1/2" $\times 51-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ row sa shing strips
From each of Fabrics $B$ and $C$, $c$ ut
one 5" x WOF strip. Subc ut:
eight 5" squares for the HSTs
one 4-1/2" x WO F strip. Subc ut:
sixteen $2-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 4-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles for the blocks
From each of Fabrics $D$ and $E$, cut
one 5" x WOF strip. Subcut:
six 5" squa res for the HSTs
one 4-1/2" x WOF strip. Subcut:
twelve 2-1/2" x 4-1/2" rectangles for the blocks

## From each of Fabrics F-H, cut

one 5" x WOF strip. Subc ut:
four 5" squares for the HSTs
Trim the remainder of the strip to $4-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ wide, then c ut:
eight $2-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 4-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles for the blocks

## From the Binding Fabric, cut

seven 2-1/2" x WOF strips.
Assemble the Half-Square Triangles
Step 1: Pair a Fabric A 5" square with a Fabric B 5" square, RST. Mark a diagonal line on the wrong side of one square. Sew $1 / 4$ " a way from both sides of the marked line. Cut on the marked line, creating two half-square tria ngles (HSTs). Press toward the darker fabric. Trim to $4-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ square. Repeat with all remaining 5" squares, pairing a Fabric A square with a Fabric $B-H$ square.


## Assemble the Blocks

## Step 2: Gather.

four Fabric A/B HSTs
four Fabric B $2-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 4-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles
four Fabric A $2-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 4-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles
one Fabric A 4-1/2" square
Sew each Fabric A rectangle to a Fabric Brectangle along the longest edge, creating four $4-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ square units. Press toward the darkerfabric.


Step 3: Arrange the nine units in three rows of three, following the Block Assembly Diagram. Note the placement and block orientation of the print fabric.


Sew the units together to form rows, pressing the rows toward the units completed in Step 2. Sew the rows together, nesting the seams. Press the row seams open or to one side. The resulting block should measure $12-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ square.

Repeat with remaining Fabric B pieces, creating four Fabric B Blocks.
Step 4: Repeat Steps 1-3 to create:
four Fabric C blocks three Fabric D blocks three Fabric Eblocks two Fabric Fblocks two Fabric G blocks two Fabric H blocks

## Assemble the Quilt



Step 5: Arrange the blockstogetheras indicated in the Quilt Assembly Diagram, noting the fabric placement. Sew each row together, using Fabric A block sashing strips between each block. Press seamstoward the sashing. Repeat to make five block rows.

Step 6: Sew the rowstogether, using Fabric A row sashing strips between each row. Press seams toward the sashing.

Your quilt top is complete. Baste, quilt, bind and enjoy!
