## Fabric and Supplies Needed

Fabric amounts based on yardage that is 42" wide.

## Notes Before You Begin

- Read through all of the instructions before beginning.
- All of the seam allowances are 1/4" unless otherwise noted.
- Press seam allowances open unless otherwise noted.
- Width of fabric (WOF) is equal to at least 42" wide.
- Right sides together has been abbreviated to RST.
- Remember to measure twice and cut once!

## **Cutting Instructions**

#### From each of Fabrics A-H, cut:

two 4" x WOF strips. Subcut:

twelve 4" squares.

Trim the remainder of the strip(s) to 3-1/2", then subcut:

six 3-1/2" squares.

one 3-1/2" x WOF strip. Subcut:

six 3-1/2" x 6-1/2" rectangles.

#### From Fabric I, cut:

ten 4" x WOF strips. Subcut:

ninety-six 4" squares.

eight 3-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut:

ninety-six 3-1/2" squares.

#### From the Binding Fabric, cut:

seven 2-1/2" x WOF strips.

## Assemble the Half-Square Triangles (HSTs)

**Step 1:** Pair a 4" Fabric A square with a 4" Fabric I square, RST. Mark a diagonal line on the wrong side of one square. Sew 1/4" away from both sides of the marked line. Cut on the marked line creating two half-square triangles (HSTs). Press toward the darker fabric. Trim to 3-1/2" square. Repeat to make twenty-four A/I HSTs



**Step 2:** Repeat Step 1 to make:



twenty-four B/I HSTs



twenty-four C/I HSTs



twenty-four D/I HSTs



twenty-four E/I HSTs




twenty-four F/I HSTs




twenty-four H/I HSTs

### Assemble the Blocks

**Step 3:** Gather one 3-1/2" Fabric A square, one 3-1/2" x 6-1/2" Fabric A rectangle, two 3-1/2" Fabric I squares, and four A/I HSTs. Arrange the units in three rows as shown.



**Step 4:** Sew the units together to form rows. Press the seams open.



**Step 5:** Sew the rows together to form the block. Press the seams open. Repeat to make six A Blocks.



**Step 6:** Repeat Steps 3-5 to make:





six C blocks



six D blocks




six E blocks



six F blocks



six G blocks



six H blocks



**Step 7:** Arrange the blocks into eight rows of six blocks. Note the fabric placement and block orientation in the Quilt Assembly Diagram.

**Step 8:** Sew the blocks together to form rows. Press the seams to the left in the odd-numbered rows and to the right in the even-numbered rows.

Step 9: Sew the rows together to form the quilt center. Press the row seams open.

Your quilt top is complete! Baste, quilt, bind, and enjoy!

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
