

Notes Before You Begin

- Read through all of the instructions before beginning.
- All of the seam allowances are 1/4" unless otherwise noted.
- Press seam allowances open unless otherwise noted.
- Width of fabric (WOF) is equal to at least 43" wide.
- Right sides together has been abbreviated to RST.
- Remember to measure twice and cut once!

Cutting Instructions

From each of Fabrics A and C, cut:

one 2-1/2" x WOF strip. Subcut: six 2-1/2" squares

From Fabric B, cut:

one 2-1/2" x WOF strip. Subcut: eight 2-1/2" squares

From each of Fabrics D and F, cut:

two 2-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut: six 2-1/2" squares six 2-1/2" x 4-1/2" rectangles

From Fabric E, cut:

two 2-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut: eight 2-1/2" squares eight 2-1/2" x 4-1/2" rectangles

From each of Fabrics G and I, cut:

two 2-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut: six 2-1/2" x 4-1/2" rectangles six 2-1/2" x 6-1/2" rectangles

From Fabric H, cut:

three 2-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut: eight 2-1/2" x 4-1/2" rectangles eight 2-1/2" x 6-1/2" rectangles

From each of Fabrics J and L, cut:

three 2-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut: six 2-1/2" x 6-1/2" rectangles six 2-1/2" x 8-1/2" rectangles

From Fabric K, cut:

three 2-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut: eight 2-1/2" x 6-1/2" rectangles eight 2-1/2" x 8-1/2" rectangles

From each of Fabrics M and O, cut:

three 2-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut: six 2-1/2" x 8-1/2" rectangles six 2-1/2" x 10-1/2" rectangles

From Fabric N, cut:

four 2-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut: eight 2-1/2" x 8-1/2" rectangles eight 2-1/2" x 10-1/2" rectangles

From each of Fabrics P and R, cut:

four 2-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut: six 2-1/2" x 10-1/2" rectangles six 2-1/2" x 12-1/2" rectangles

From Fabric Q, cut:

five 2-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut: eight 2-1/2" x 10-1/2" rectangles eight 2-1/2" x 12-1/2" rectangles

From each of Fabrics S and U, cut:

four 2-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut:

six 2-1/2" x 12-1/2" rectangles

six 2-1/2" x 14-1/2" rectangles

Note: to maximize WOF strips, cut two 14-1/2" and one 12-1/2" strip from each of the first three strips

From Fabric T, cut:

six 2-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut:

eight 2-1/2" x 12-1/2" rectangles

eight 2-1/2" x 14-1/2" rectangles

Note: to maximize WOF strips, cut two 14-1/2" and one 12-1/2" strip from each of the first four strips

From each of Fabrics V and X, cut:

six 2-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut:

six 2-1/2" x 14-1/2" rectangles

six 2-1/2" x 16-1/2" rectangles

From Fabric W, cut:

eight 2-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut:

eight 2-1/2" x 14-1/2" rectangles

eight 2-1/2" x 16-1/2" rectangles

From the binding fabric, cut:

eight 2-1/2" x WOF strips

Assemble the Blocks

Note: For all block types, press seams after sewing each piece. Press toward the darker fabric. Repeat Steps 1-7 for each block type (colorway).

The A Blocks (Yellow)



Step 1: Sew a 2-1/2" Fabric A square to a 2-1/2" Fabric D square. With the Fabric D square on top, sew a 4-1/2" Fabric D strip to the left edge of the unit.


Step 2: Sew a 4-1/2" Fabric G strip to the top edge of the unit. With the Fabric G strip on top, sew a 6-1/2" Fabric G strip to the left edge of the unit.


Step 3: Sew a 6-1/2" Fabric J strip to the top edge of the unit. With the Fabric J strip on top, sew a 8-1/2" Fabric J strip to the left edge of the unit.

Step 4: Sew a 8-1/2" Fabric M strip to the top edge of the unit. With the Fabric M strip on top, sew a 10-1/2" Fabric M strip to the left edge of the unit.

- **Step 5:** Sew a 10-1/2" Fabric P strip to the top edge of the unit. With the Fabric P strip on top, sew a 12-1/2" Fabric P strip to the left edge of the unit.
- **Step 6:** Sew a 12-1/2" Fabric S strip to the top edge of the unit. With the Fabric S strip on top, sew a 14-1/2" Fabric S strip to the left edge of the unit.
- **Step 7:** Sew a 14-1/2" Fabric V strip to the top edge of the unit. With the Fabric V strip on top, sew a 16-1/2" Fabric V strip to the left edge of the unit.

Repeat to make six 16-1/2" square A Blocks.





- **Step 1:** Sew a 2-1/2" Fabric B square to a 2-1/2" Fabric E square. With the Fabric E square on top, sew a 4-1/2" Fabric E strip to the left edge of the unit.
- **Step 2:** Sew a 4-1/2" Fabric H strip to the top edge of the unit. With the Fabric H strip on top, sew a 6-1/2" Fabric H strip to the left edge of the unit.
- **Step 3:** Sew a 6-1/2" Fabric K strip to the top edge of the unit. With the Fabric K strip on top, sew a 8-1/2" Fabric K strip to the left edge of the unit.
- **Step 4:** Sew a 8-1/2" Fabric N strip to the top edge of the unit. With the Fabric N strip on top, sew a 10-1/2" Fabric N strip to the left edge of the unit.
- **Step 5:** Sew a 10-1/2" Fabric Q strip to the top edge of the unit. With the Fabric Q strip on top, sew a 12-1/2" Fabric Q strip to the left edge of the unit.
- **Step 6:** Sew a 12-1/2" Fabric T strip to the top edge of the unit. With the Fabric T strip on top, sew a 14-1/2" Fabric T strip to the left edge of the unit.
- **Step 7:** Sew a 14-1/2" Fabric W strip to the top edge of the unit. With the Fabric W strip on top, sew a 16-1/2" Fabric W strip to the left edge of the unit.

Repeat to make eight 16-1/2" square B Blocks.

The C Blocks (Blue)



Step 1: Sew a 2-1/2" Fabric C square to a 2-1/2" Fabric F square. With the Fabric F square on top, sew a 4-1/2" Fabric F strip to the left edge of the unit.

Step 2: Sew a 4-1/2" Fabric I strip to the top edge of the unit. With the Fabric I strip on top, sew a 6-1/2" Fabric I strip to the left edge of the unit.

Step 3: Sew a 6-1/2" Fabric L strip to the top edge of the unit. With the Fabric L strip on top, sew a 8-1/2" Fabric L strip to the left edge of the unit.

Step 4: Sew a 8-1/2" Fabric O strip to the top edge of the unit. With the Fabric O strip on top, sew a 10-1/2" Fabric O strip to the left edge of the unit.

Step 5: Sew a 10-1/2" Fabric R strip to the top edge of the unit. With the Fabric R strip on top, sew a 12-1/2" Fabric R strip to the left edge of the unit.

Step 6: Sew a 12-1/2" Fabric U strip to the top edge of the unit. With the Fabric U strip on top, sew a 14-1/2" Fabric U strip to the left edge of the unit.

Step 7: Sew a 14-1/2" Fabric X strip to the top edge of the unit. With the Fabric X strip on top, sew a 16-1/2" Fabric X strip to the left edge of the unit.

Repeat to make six 16-1/2" square C Blocks.

Assemble the Quilt



Step 8: Arrange the blocks into five rows of four blocks each. Note the fabric placement and block orientation in the Quilt Assembly Diagram.

Step 9: Sew the blocks together to form rows. Press the rows to the left in the odd numbered rows and to the right in the even numbered rows.

Step 10: Sew the rows together to form the quilt. Press the row seams open.

Your quilt top is now complete! Baste, quilt, bind and enjoy!
