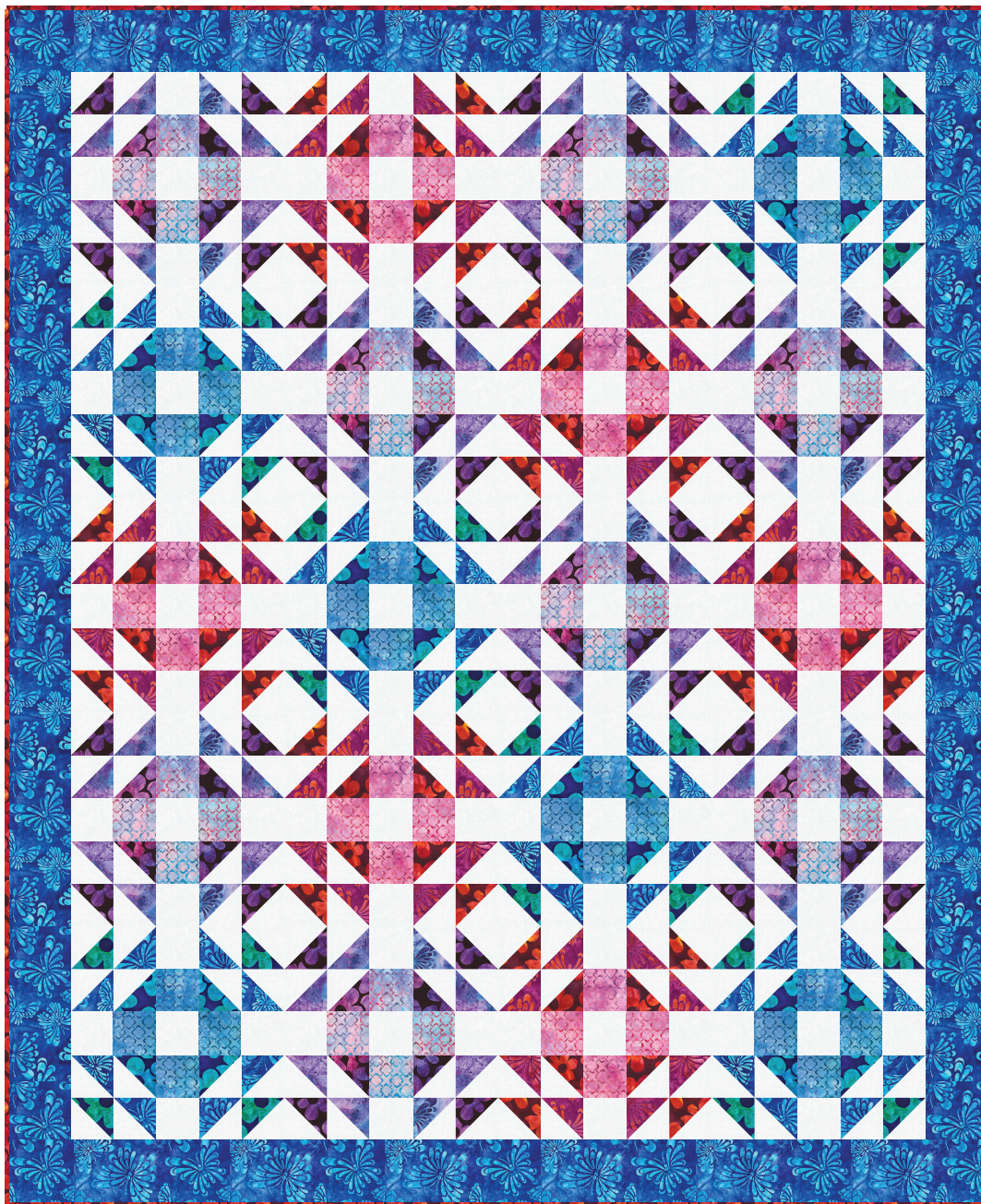

Fabric and Supplies Needed

Fabric amounts based on yardage that is 42" wide.

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Notes Before You Begin

- Read through all of the instructions before beginning.
- All of the seam allowances are 1/4" unless otherwise noted.
- Press seam allowances open unless otherwise noted.
- Width of fabric (WOF) is equal to at least 42" wide.
- Right sides together has been abbreviated to RST.
- Remember to measure twice and cut once!

Cutting Instructions

From Fabric A, cut:

fifteen 3-3/4" x WOF strips. Subcut:
one hundred sixty 3-3/4" squares for the HST units
nine 3-1/4" x WOF strips. Subcut:
one hundred 3-1/4" squares

From each of Fabrics B and H, cut:

two 3-1/4" x WOF strips. Subcut:
twenty-four 3-1/4" squares

From each of Fabrics C, D, I and J, cut:

three 3-3/4" x WOF strips. Subcut:
twenty-four 3-3/4" squares

From Fabric C, cut:

eight 2-1/2" x WOF strips for the binding

From Fabric E, cut:

three 3-1/4" x WOF strips. Subcut:
thirty-two 3-1/4" squares

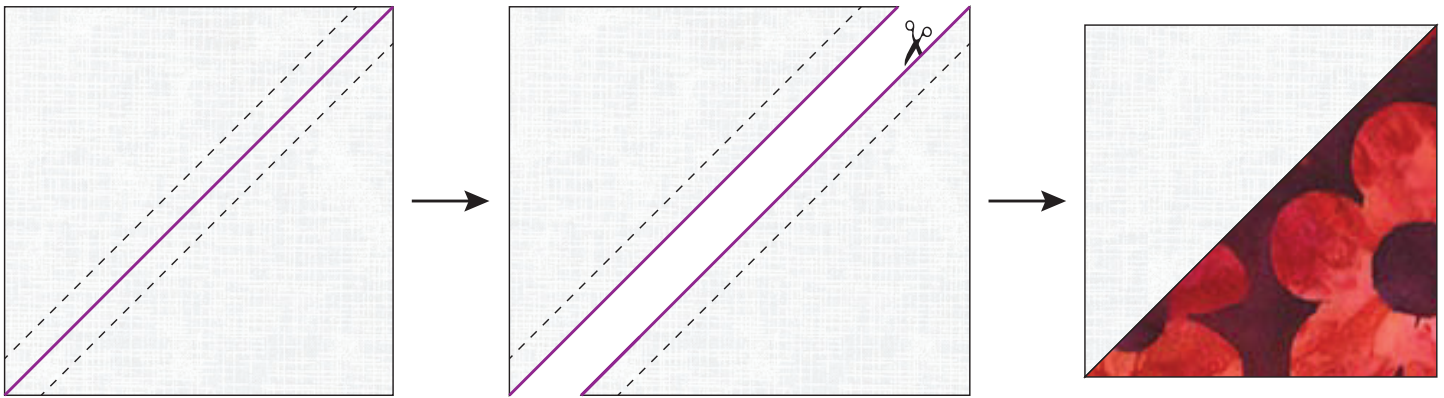
From each of Fabrics F and G, cut:

three 3-3/4" x WOF strips. Subcut:
thirty-two 3-3/4" squares

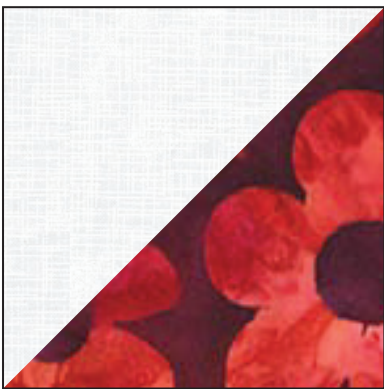
From Fabric J, cut:

seven 4-1/2" x WOF strips. Sew together, end-to-end, then trim to yield:
two 4-1/2" x 69-1/4" side borders
two 4-1/2" x 63-1/2" top and bottom borders

Assemble the Half Square Triangles (HSTs)



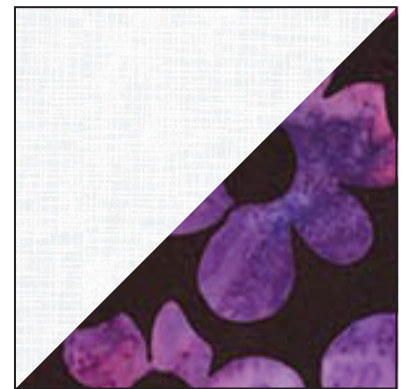
Step 1: Pair a 3-3/4" Fabric A square with a 3-3/4" Fabric C square, RST. Mark a diagonal line on the wrong side of one square. Sew 1/4" away from both sides of the marked line. Cut on the marked line, creating two half-square triangles (HSTs). Press toward the darker fabric. Trim to 3-1/4" square. Repeat with all remaining 3-3/4" squares, pairing Fabric A with Fabrics C, D, F, G, I and J. Make 64 each of A/F and A/G and 48 each of A/C, A/D, A/I and A/J.



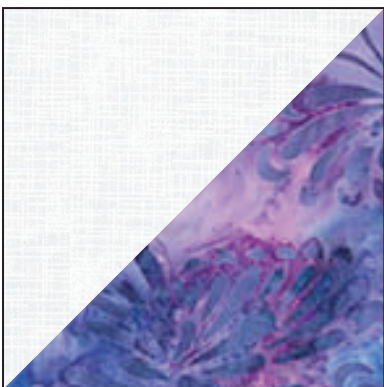

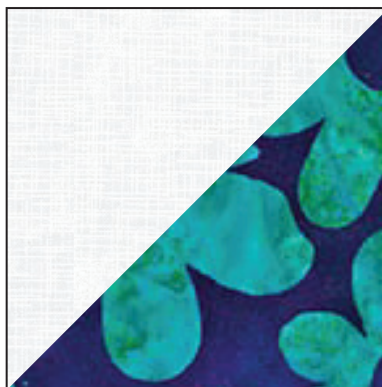

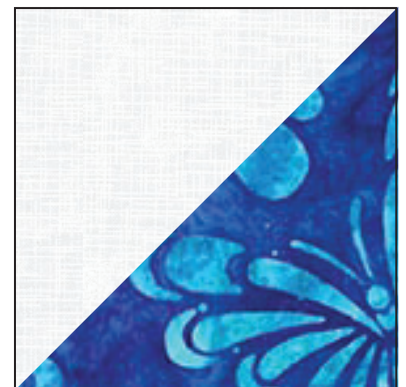

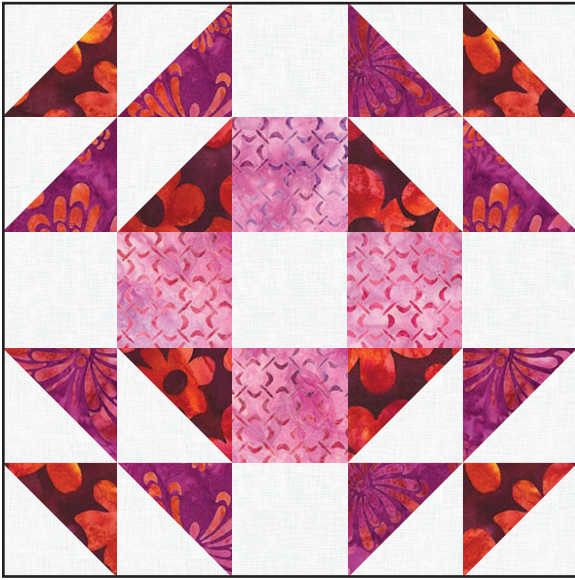

Assemble the Blocks



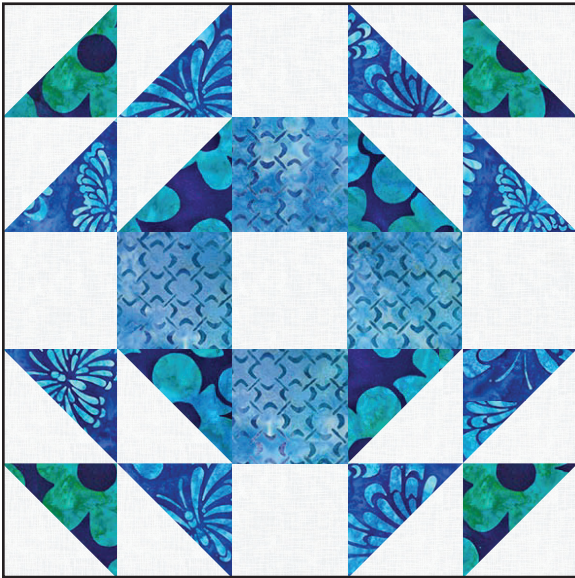
Step 2: Gather:
five Fabric A squares
four Fabric B squares
eight A/C HSTs
eight A/D HSTs

Arrange the blocks into five rows of five. Note the fabric placement and block orientation in the Block Assembly Diagram.

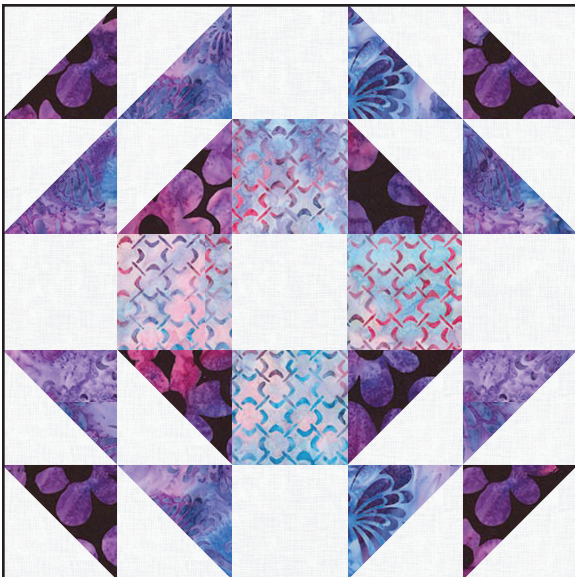
Step 3: Sew the squares together to form rows. Press the rows to the left in the odd numbered rows and to the right in the even numbered rows.

Step 4: Sew the rows together to form the block. Press the row seams open.

Repeat to make six A Blocks.

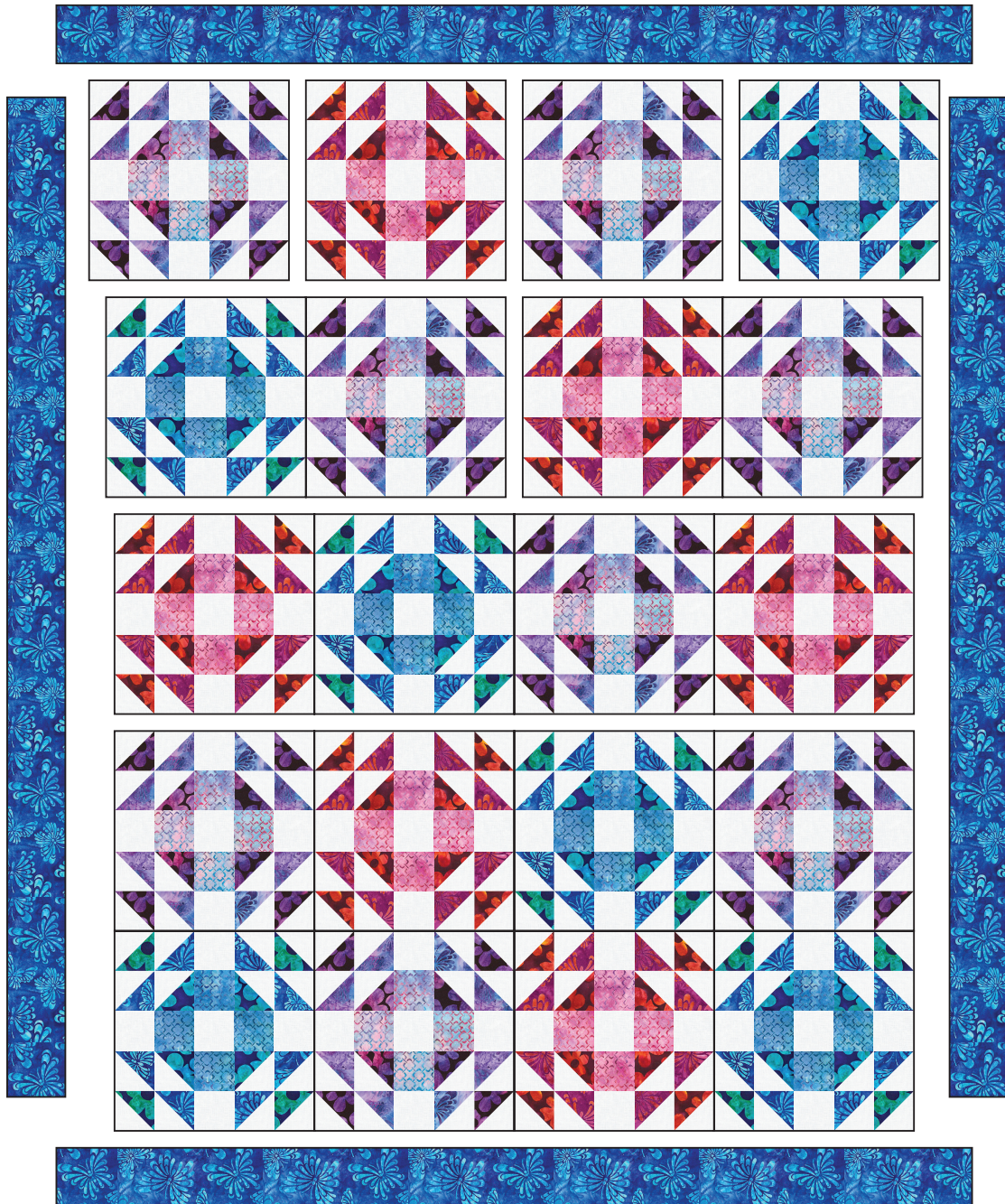


Step 5: Repeat Steps 2-4 to make six B (Blue) Blocks. For each block, gather:
five Fabric A squares
four Fabric H squares
eight A/I HSTs
eight A/J HSTs



Step 6: Repeat Steps 2-4 to make eight C (Purple) Blocks. For each block, gather:
five Fabric A squares
four Fabric E squares
eight A/F HSTs
eight A/G HSTs

Assemble the Quilt



Step 7: Arrange the blocks into five rows of four blocks. Note the fabric placement and block orientation in the Quilt Assembly Diagram.

Step 8: Sew the blocks together to form rows. Press the rows to the left in the odd numbered rows and to the right in the even numbered rows.

Step 9: Sew the rows together to form the quilt center. Press the row seams open.

Step 10: Sew the 69-1/4" borders to the sides of the quilt center. Press toward the borders. Sew the 63-1/2" top and bottom inner borders to the quilt center. Press toward the borders.

Your quilt top is now complete. Baste, quilt, bind and enjoy!
