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## Notes Before You Begin

- Read through all of the instructions before beginning.
- All of the seam allowances are $1 / 4$ " unless otherwise noted.
- Press seam allowances open unless otherwise noted.
- Width of fabric (WOF) is equal to at least 42" wide.
- Right sides together has been abbreviated to RST.
- Remember to measure twice and cut once!


## Cutting Instructions

## From Fabric A, cut:

two 3-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut:
one 3-1/2" x 36-1/2" strip (Piece 22)
one $3-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 39-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strip (Piece 23)
one 6-1/2" square (Piece 1)

## From Fabric B, cut:

one 3-1/2" x WOF strip. Subcut: one 3-1/2" x 6-1/2" strip (Piece 2) one $3-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 9-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strip (Piece 3)

From Fabric C, cut:
two 22" x WOF strips. Subcut:
four 22 " squares for the HSTS
two 21-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut: four 21-1/2" corner squares
one 3-1/2" x WOF strip. Subcut: one 3-1/2" x 9-1/2" strip (Piece 4) one 3-1/2" x 12-1/2" strip (Piece 5)

From Fabric D, cut:
one 3-1/2" x WOF strip. Subcut:
one 3-1/2" $\times 12-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strip (Piece 6) one $3-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 15-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strip (Piece 7)

## From Fabric E , cut:

one 3-1/2" x WOF strip. Subcut: one 3-1/2" x 15-1/2" strip (Piece 8) one 3-1/2" x 18-1/2" strip (Piece 9)

## From Fabric F, cut:

one 3-1/2" x WOF strip. Subcut:
one $3-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 18-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strip (Piece 10) one $3-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 21-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strip (Piece 11)

From Fabric G, cut:
two 3-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut:
one $3-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 21-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strip (Piece 12)
one $3-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 24-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strip (Piece 13)
From Fabric H , cut:
two 3-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut:
one $3-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 24-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strip (Piece 14) one $3-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 27-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strip (Piece 15)

From Fabric I, cut:
two 3-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut:
one $3-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 27-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strip (Piece 16) one $3-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 30-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strip (Piece 17)

From Fabric J, cut:
one $22^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF strip. Subcut:
two 22" squares for the HSTS
two 3-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut:
one $3-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 30-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strip (Piece 18)
one $3-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 33-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strip (Piece 19)
From Fabric K, cut:
one 22" x WOF strip. Subcut: two 22 " squares for the HSTS
two 3-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut:
one $3-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 33-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strip (Piece 20)
one $3-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 36-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strip (Piece 21)
From Fabric L, cut:
two 3-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut:
one 3-1/2" x 39-1/2" strip (Piece 24)
one $3-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 42-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strip (Piece 25)
From the Binding Fabric, cut:
nine 2-1/2" x WOF strips

## Assemble the Half-Square Triangles (HSTs)

Step 1: Pair a $22^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric C square with a 22 " Fabric J square, RST. Mark a diagonal line on the wrong side of one square. Sew $1 / 4$ " away from both sides of the marked line. Cut on the marked line, creating two half-square triangles (HSTs). Press toward the darker fabric. Trim to 211/2" square. Repeat to make four C/J HSTs.


Step 2: Repeat Step 1 to make four C/K HSTs.

Step 3: Sew each HST to an identical HST, with Fabric C edges sewn together. Repeat for all HSTs.


Assemble the Log Cabin Center

Step 4: Sew Piece 2 to the top edge of Piece 1. Press away from the center square.

Step 5: Sew Piece 3 to the right edge of the unit. Press away from the center square.

Step 6: Continue in this manner, sewing pieces in numerical order, and always working clockwise around the center square. Press away from the center square with each addition.

The center unit will measure 42-1/2" square, unfinished.


## Templates



Step 7: Arrange the HST pairs, Fabric C squares and Log Cabin Center into three rows of three. Note the fabric placement and block orientation in the Quilt Assembly Diagram.

Step 8: Sew the units together to form rows. Press the rows to the left in the odd numbered rows and to the right in the even numbered rows.

Step 9: Sew the rows together to form the quilt center. Press the row seams open.

Your quilt top is complete. Baste, quilt, bind and enjoy!

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
