## Notes Before You Begin

- Read through all of the instructions before beginning.
- All of the seam allowances are $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ unless otherwise noted.
- Press seam allowances open unless otherwise noted.
- Width of fabric (WOF) is equal to at least 42" wide.
- Right sides together has been abbreviated to RST.
- Remember to measure twice and cut once!


## Cutting Instructions

## From each Ten Square, cut:

two 3" x WOF strips. Subcut:
two 3 " $\times 5-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles
two 3" squares
one 2-1/2" x WOF strip. Subcut: two 2-1/2" squares

From Fabric A, cut:
eleven 1" x WOF strips. Subcut: eighty 1 " $\times 3$ " rectangles eighty 1 " $\times 2-1 / 2$ " rectangles

From the Binding Fabric, cut:
five 2-1/2" $\times$ WOF strips

## Assemble the Blocks

Step 1: Gather one $2-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ square, one $3^{\prime \prime}$ square, and one $3^{\prime \prime} \times 5-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangle all cut from the same Ten Square. Gather one 1 " $\times 2-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric A rectangle and one 1 " $\times 3$ " Fabric A rectangle as well.

Step 2: Sew the 1 " $\times 2-1 / 2$ " rectangle to the left edge of the $2-1 / 2$ " square, then press.

Step 3: Sew the 1 " $\times 3$ " rectangle to the top edge of the unit, then press.

Step 4: Sew the 3" square to the top edge of the unit, then press.

Step 5: Sew the $3^{\prime \prime} \times 5-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangle to the left edge of the unit, then press.

Step 6: Repeat Steps 1-5 to make eighty blocks. You will have leftover sets cut from the Ten Squares that can be discarded.



Step 7: Arrange the blocks into ten rows of eight blocks. Note the fabric placement and block orientation in the Quilt Assembly Diagram.

Step 8: Sew the blocks together to form rows. Press the seams to the left in the odd-numbered rows and to the right in the even-numbered rows.

Step 9: Sew the rows together to form the quilt center. Press the row seams open.
Your quilt top is complete! Baste, quilt, bind, and enjoy!

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
