- Backing and binding is not included in the supply list above. These material requirements will be given in Month 13 of the Block of the Month.
- The specific fabric colors used in the block shown on the cover can be found on page 5.
- Save all leftover fabric for Month 13.


## Notes Before You Begin

- Read through all of the instructions before beginning.
- All of the seam allowances are 1/4" unless otherwise noted.
- Press seam allowances open unless otherwise noted.
- Width of fabric (WOF) is equal to at least $42^{\prime \prime}$ wide.
- Right sides together has been abbreviated to RST.
- Remember to measure twice and cut once!


## From Fabric A, cut:

one 4-7/8" x WOF strip. Subcut:
two 4-7/8" squares, then subcut each square once on the diagonal.
From each of Fabrics B-E, cut:
one 4-7/8" x WOF strip. Subcut:
one 4-7/8" square of each fabric, then subcut each square once on the diagonal.
From each of Fabrics F-G, cut:
one 3-3/4" x WOF strip. Subcut:
one $3-3 / 4$ " square of each fabric, then subcut each square once on the diagonal.

## From Fabric H , cut:

one 4-7/8" x WOF strip. Subcut:
two 4-7/8" squares, then subcut each square once on the diagonal.
Trim the remainder of the strip to 3-3/4". Subcut:
two 3-3/4" squares, then subcut each square once on the diagonal.

## From Fabric I, cut:

one 9-1/4" x WOF strip. Subcut:
one 9-1/4" square, then subcut the square twice on the diagonal.
Trim the remainder of the strip to 4-7/8". Subcut:
two 4-7/8" squares, then subcut each square once on the diagonal.

Assemble the Half-Square Triangles (HSTs)
Step 1: Gather the 4-7/8" Fabric A and Fabric I triangles. Place one triangle of each fabric RST and sew along the long edge. Press towards the darker fabric. Repeat to make four HSTs. Trim each HST to 4-1/2"
 if needed.

## Assemble the Flying Geese

Step 2: Gather two Fabric B triangles, two Fabric C triangles, two Fabric D triangles, two Fabric E triangles, and four Fabric I triangles. Sew a Fabric B triangle to one short side of a Fabric I triangle, then press the seam towards the smaller triangle. Sew a Fabric C triangle to the remaining short side of the Fabric I triangle, then press towards the smaller triangle. Repeat to make four Flying Geese in the fabric combinations and quantities shown below. Trim each unit to $4-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 8-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$. Be sure to leave $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ past the intersection!


Make two.


## Assemble the Center Units

Step 3: Gather two 3-3/4" Fabric F triangles, two 3-3/4" Fabric G triangles, four 3-3/4" Fabric H triangles, and four 4-7/8" Fabric H triangles. Sew a 3-3/4" Fabric F triangle to one short side of a 3-3/4"
 Fabric H triangle, then press the seam towards the darker fabric.

Step 4: Sew 4-7/8" Fabric H triangle to the long side of the unit, then press towards the larger triangle. Repeat to make a total of four units in the quantities shown below. Trim each unit to 4-1/2" square.

Assemble the Block

Step 3: Arrange the units you have created in three rows of three as shown. Pay close attention to the placement and orientation of each unit.



Step 9: Sew the units together to form rows, then press the seams away from the Flying Geese.


Step 10: Nest the seams and sew the rows together. Press to complete the block.


Safely store this block until Month 13 of the Block of the Month to finish your quilt.
