

Fabric and Supplies Needed

Fabric amounts based on yardage that is 42" wide.

Notes Before You Begin

- Read through all of the instructions before beginning.
- All of the seam allowances are 1/4" unless otherwise noted.
- Press seam allowances open unless otherwise noted.
- Width of fabric (WOF) is equal to at least 42" wide.
- Right sides together has been abbreviated to RST.
- Half-square triangle has been abbreviated to HST.
- Remember to measure twice and cut once!

Cutting Instructions

From Fabric A, fussy cut:

twenty-eight 5-1/2" squares

From Fabric B, cut:

thirteen 1-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut:

forty-nine 10-1/2" x 1-1/2" strips for the sashing

eight 1-1/2" x WOF strips. Sew together, end-to-end, then set aside for the inner border.

one 3" x WOF strip. Subcut:

four 3" squares

From Fabric C, cut:

ten 4-1/2" x WOF strips. Sew eight of the strips together, end-to-end, then set aside for the outer border.

From the remaining two strips, subcut:

twelve 4-1/2" squares. Cut each square once on the diagonal.

one 3-1/2" x WOF strip. Subcut:

twelve 3-1/2" squares

eleven 3" x WOF strips. Subcut:

forty-eight 3" squares

forty-eight 3-1/2" x 5-1/2" strips

one 1-1/2" x WOF strip. Subcut:

twenty 1-1/2" squares for the cornerstones

From Fabric D, cut:

two 3-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut:

twenty-four 3-1/2" squares

From Fabric E, cut:

two 6" x WOF strips. Subcut:

twelve 6" squares. Cut each square once on the diagonal.

four 3" x WOF strips. Subcut:

fifty 3" squares

four 1-3/4" x WOF strips. Subcut:

twenty-four 1-3/4" x 5-1/2" strips

From Fabric F, cut:

three 3-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut:

thirty-six 3-1/2" squares

two 3" x WOF strips. Subcut:

twenty-six 3" squares

four 1-3/4" x WOF strips. Subcut:

twenty-four 1-3/4" x 5-1/2" strips

From Binding Fabric, cut:

eight 2-1/2" x WOF strips

Assembling the Blocks

A, G, I, P, W and X Blocks

Note: The sample block shown is the A Block, but the same process is used for each of the letters in this block style.

Step 1: Gather:

four 3" Fabric F squares one Fabric A square, of letter A four 3-1/2" Fabric F squares two 3-1/2" Fabric C squares two 3-1/2" Fabric D squares

Step 2: Pair a 3-1/2" Fabric F square with a Fabric C square, RST. Mark a diagonal line on the wrong side of one square. Sew 1/4" away from both sides of the marked line. Cut on the marked line, creating two half-square triangles (HSTs). Press toward the darker fabric. Trim to 3" square. Repeat to make a total of four C/F HSTs and four D/F HSTs.





Step 3: Place one of each color of HST together, as shown in the finished blocks. Sew together. Repeat to make a total of four matching pairs.





Step 4: Arrange the 3" Fabric F squares, the Fabric A center square and the HST pairs to make three rows of three, following the Block Assembly Diagram and paying careful attention to the orientation of the HST pairs. Sew together to form rows, pressing the seams away from the HST pairs. Sew the rows together, pressing the seams open or to one side. The resulting block should measure 10-1/2" square.

Repeat Steps 1-4 for the G, I, P, W and X Blocks.


B, H, J, Q, S and Y Blocks

Note: The sample block shown is the B Block, but the same process is used for each of the letters in this block style.

Step 5: Gather:


four 3" Fabric C squares one Fabric A square, of letter B four 1-3/4" x 5-1/2" Fabric F strips four 1-3/4" x 5-1/2" Fabric E strips

Step 6: Place one of each color of rectangle together, as shown in the finished blocks. Sew together along the 5-1/2" edge. Press. Repeat to make a total of four matching pairs.



Step 7: Arrange the 3" Fabric C squares, the Fabric A center square and the Step 6 pairs to make three rows of three, following the Block Assembly Diagram and paying careful attention to the orientation of the Step 6 pairs. Sew together to form rows, pressing the seams away from the Step 6 pairs. Sew the rows together, pressing the seams open or to one side. The resulting block should measure 10-1/2" square.





C, D, K, R, T and Z Blocks

Note: The sample block shown is the B Block, but the same process is used for each of the letters in this block style.

Step 8: Gather:

four 3" Fabric C squares one Fabric A square, of letter C eight 3" Fabric E squares four 3" x 5-1/2" Fabric C rectangles

Step 9: Place a 3" Fabric E square RST at one end of a Fabric C rectangle. Mark a diagonal line on the wrong side of the square, as shown. Sew on the marked line and trim away the excess fabric, leaving a 1/4" seam allowance. Press toward the triangle.



Step 10: Repeat Step 9 at the remaining end of the rectangle. The resulting flying geese block should measure 3" x 5-1/2".



Step 11: Repeat with all remaining Fabric C rectangles.

Step 12: Arrange the 3" Fabric C squares, the Fabric A center square and the flying geese units to make three rows of three, following the Block Assembly Diagram and paying careful attention to the orientation of the flying geese. Sew together to form rows, pressing the seams away from the flying geese. Sew the rows together, pressing the seams open or to one side. The resulting block should measure 10-1/2" square.

Repeat Steps 8-12 for the C, D, K, R, and T Blocks.

E, L, N, U and Lower and Upper Right Corner Blocks

Note: The sample block shown is the E Block, but the same process is used for each of the letters in this block style.

Step 13: Gather:

four 3" x 5-1/2" Fabric C rectangles one Fabric A square, of letter E two 3-1/2" Fabric D squares two 3-1/2" Fabric F squares


Step 14: Pair a 3-1/2" Fabric D square with a Fabric F square, RST. Mark a diagonal line on the wrong side of one square. Sew 1/4" away from both sides of the marked line. Cut on the marked line, creating two half-square triangles (HSTs). Press toward the darker fabric. Trim to 3" square. Repeat to make a total of four D/F HSTs.



Step 15: Arrange the HSTs, the Fabric A center square and the Fabric C rectangles to make three rows of three, following the Block Assembly Diagram and paying careful attention to the orientation of the HSTs. Sew together to form rows, pressing the seams toward from the rectangles. Sew the rows together, pressing the seams open or to one side. The resulting block should measure 10-1/2" square.

Repeat Steps 13-15 for the E, L, N, U and Lower Right Blocks.

For the Upper Right Corner Block, first, use two 3" B squares and two 3" E squares, to create a four-patch unit and used in the place of the Fabric A square



F, M, O, V and Lower and Upper Left Corner Blocks

Note: The sample block shown is the F Block, but the same process is used for each of the letters in this block style.

Step 16: Gather:

four 4-1/2" Fabric C triangles one Fabric A square, of letter F four 6" Fabric E triangles

Step 17: Sew a 4-1/2" Fabric C triangle to opposite sides of the Fabric A square. Press seam allowances toward the triangles. Repeat on remaining sides of the Fabric A square.




Step 18: Sew a 6" Fabric E triangle to opposite sides of the block. Press seam allowances toward the triangles. Repeat on remaining sides of the block. The resulting block should measure 10-1/2" square.



Repeat Steps 16-18 for the M, O, V and Upper Left Blocks.

For the Lower Left Corner Block, first, use two 3" B squares and two 3" F squares, to create a four-patch unit and used in the place of the Fabric A square.



Step 19: Arrange the Blocks together as indicated in the Quilt Assembly Diagram. Sew each row together, using Fabric B sashing strips between each block. Press seams toward the sashing. Repeat to make six block rows.

Step 20: Gather four cornerstone squares and five sashing strips. Sew each row together, using cornerstones between each sashing strip. Press seams toward the sashing. Repeat to make five sashing rows.


Step 21: Sew the sashing and block rows together, pinning and nesting the seams. Press seams open or to the sashing.

Step 22: Measure the length of the quilt through the center. Cut two Fabric B inner border strips to this length. Sew the borders to the left and right sides of the quilt center. Press toward the border. Measure the width of the quilt through the center. Cut two Fabric B inner border strips to this width. Sew the borders to the top and bottom of the quilt center. Press toward the border.

Step 23: Measure the length of the quilt through the center. Cut two Fabric C outer border strips to this length. Sew the borders to the left and right sides of the quilt center. Press toward the border. Measure the width of the quilt through the center. Cut two Fabric C outer border strips to this width. Sew the borders to the top and bottom of the quilt center. Press toward the border.

Your quilt top is now complete! Baste, quilt, bind and enjoy!
