Notes Before You Begin

- Read through all of the instructions before beginning.
- All of the seam allowances are 1/4" unless otherwise noted.
- Press seam allowances open unless otherwise noted.
- Width of fabric (WOF) is equal to at least 42" wide.
- Right sides together has been abbreviated to RST.
- Remember to measure twice and cut once!

Cutting Instructions

From the Roll Ups, group fabrics as follows for strip piecing:

one A, B and C strip (two sets like this)

one D, E and F strip (two sets like this)

one G, H and K strip (two sets like this)

one L, N and O strip (two sets like this)

one P, Q and R strip (one set like this)

one P, J and R strip (one set like this)

one S, T and U strip (two sets like this)

From Fabric W, cut:

twelve 3-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut:

one hundred forty-four 3-1/2" squares. Mark a diagonal line on the back of each square.

From the Binding Fabric, cut:

six 2-1/2" x WOF strips

Assemble the Strip Sets


Step 1: Sew three strips together, in this order and along the longest edge: Fabric C - Fabric B - Fabric A. Press. Repeat to make a second strip set like this.




Step 2: Cut each strip set into six 6-1/2" squares.



Step 3: Repeat Step 1 to make the following strip sets, and then subcut as in Step 2:





Assemble the Blocks

Step 4: Place a 3-1/2" Fabric W square in the upper left corner of a Fabric A/B/C square, right sides together. Note the orientation of the marked diagonal line and the direction of the pieced strips in the block. Sew on the marked line, then trim away the excess fabric, leaving a 1/4" seam allowance. Press. Repeat on the lower right corner with another 3-1/2" Fabric W square. Repeat to make twenty Blocks like this, from a variety of fabric combinations.



Step 5: Repeat Step 4, noting the placement of the square and the direction of the strips, to make:



twenty Blocks, from a variety of fabrics



sixteen Blocks, from a variety of fabrics



sixteen Blocks, from a variety of fabrics



Step 6: Arrange the blocks into nine rows of eight blocks. Note the block orientation in the Quilt Assembly Diagram. Your fabrics may not be in the exact same place, but the important part is the direction of the pieced strips and the placement of the triangles.

Step 7: Sew the blocks together to form rows. Press the rows to the left in the odd numbered rows and to the right in the even numbered rows.

Step 8: Sew the rows together to form the quilt center. Press the row seams open.

Your quilt top is complete! Baste, quilt, bind and enjoy!

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
