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Notes Before You Begin

- Read through all of the instructions before beginning.
- All of the seam allowances are 1/4" unless otherwise noted.
- Press seam allowances open unless otherwise noted.
- Width of fabric (WOF) is equal to at least 42" wide.
- Right sides together has been abbreviated to RST.
- Remember to measure twice and cut once!

Cutting Instructions

From Fabric A, fussy cut:

one 23" x 41-1/2" center panel

From Fabric B, cut:

four 2" x WOF strips. Sew together, end-to-end, then trim: two 2" x 23" top/bottom Border 1 pieces two 2" x 44-1/2" side Border 1 pieces one 3" x WOF strip. Subcut: eight 3" squares for the HSTs

From Fabric C, cut:

nine 3" x WOF strips. Sew together, end-to-end, then trim: two 3" x 26" top/bottom Border 2 pieces two 3" x 49-1/2" side Border 2 pieces two 3" x 43" top/bottom Border 4 pieces two 3" x 66-1/2" side Border 4 pieces

From Fabric D, cut:

one 6-1/2" x WOF strip. Subcut:
four 6-1/2" x 6" rectangles
four 6-1/2" x 2-3/4" rectangles
three 3" x WOF strips. Subcut:
forty 3" squares for the HSTs
ten 2-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut:
one hundred 2-1/2" squares
sixteen 2-1/2" x 6-1/2" rectangles

From each of Fabrics E-H, cut:


one 3" x WOF strip. Subcut: eight 3" squares for the HSTs

From the Binding Fabric, cut:

six 2-1/2" x WOF strips

Assemble the Half-Square Triangles (HSTs)

Step 1: Pair a 3" Fabric D square with a 3" Fabric B square, RST. Mark a diagonal line on the wrong side of one square. Sew 1/4" away from both sides of the marked line. Cut on the marked line, creating two half-square triangles (HSTs). Press toward the darker fabric. Trim to 2-1/2" square. Repeat to make sixteen D/B HSTs.



Step 2: Repeat Step 1 to make:







sixteen D/F HSTs




sixteen D/G HSTs

Assemble the Blocks




Step 3: Gather: five 2-1/2" Fabric D squares four D/B HSTs

Arrange the units into three rows of three. Note the fabric placement and block orientation in the Block Assembly Diagram.


Step 4: Sew the squares together to form the rows. Press the seams toward the Fabric D squares.

Step 5: Sew the rows together, nesting the seams and pressing the seams to one side to form the block.


The resulting Block should measure 6-1/2" square. Repeat to make four Blocks each from Fabric E-Fabric H.








Assemble the Pieced Border 3



Step 6: Gather:

one Fabric B Block, from Step 5 one Fabric E Block, from Step 5 one Fabric F Block, from Step 5 one Fabric G Block, from Step 5 one Fabric H Block, from Step 5 four 2-1/2" x 6-1/2" Fabric D rectangles two 6" x 6-1/2" Fabric D rectangles

Arrange the units to from a side pieced Border 3, as shown. Note the fabric placement and block orientation in the Assembly Diagram. Sew the units together to form the border. Press the seams toward the Fabric D rectangles. Repeat to make a second side pieced Border 3.



Step 7: Gather:

one Fabric B Block, from Step 5

one Fabric E Block, from Step 5

one Fabric F Block, from Step 5

one Fabric G Block, from Step 5

one Fabric H Block, from Step 5

four 2-1/2" x 6-1/2" Fabric D rectangles

two 2-3/4" x 6-1/2" Fabric D rectangles

Arrange the units to from a top pieced Border 3, as shown. Note the fabric placement and block orientation in the Assembly Diagram. Sew the units together to form the border. Press the seams toward the Fabric D rectangles. Repeat to make the bottom pieced Border 3.



Step 8: Sew the top and bottom Border 1 pieces to the Fabric A quilt center. Press toward the borders. Sew the side Border 1 pieces to the sides of the quilt center. Press toward the borders.

Step 9: Sew the top and bottom Border 2 pieces to the quilt center. Press toward the borders. Sew the side Border 2 pieces to the sides of the quilt center. Press toward the borders.

Step 10: Sew the side Border 3 pieces to the sides of the quilt center. Press toward the borders, noting the fabric placement. Sew the top and bottom Border 3 pieces to the quilt center, again noting the fabric placement. Press toward the borders.

Step 11: Sew the top and bottom Border 4 pieces to the quilt center. Press toward the borders. Sew the side Border 4 pieces to the sides of the quilt center. Press toward the borders.

Your quilt top is complete. Baste, quilt, bind and enjoy!

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
