## Notes Before You Begin

- Read through all of the instructions before beginning.
- All of the seam allowances are 1/4" unless otherwise noted.
- Press seam allowances open unless otherwise noted.
- Width of fabric (WOF) is equal to at least 42" wide.
- Right sides together has been abbreviated to RST.
- Half-square triangle has been abbreviated to HST.
- Quarter-square triangle has been abbreviated to QST.
- Remember to measure twice and cut once!

#### From Fabric A, cut:

eight 4-1/2" x WOF strips. From one of the strips, subcut: three 4-1/2" squares. Set aside the remainder for the outer borders. three 3" x WOF strips. Subcut: thirty-two 3" squares

### From Fabric B, cut:

seven 1-1/2" x WOF strips. Set aside for the inner borders. three 3" x WOF strips. Subcut: thirty-two 3" squares

### From Fabric C, cut:

one 4-1/2" x WOF strip. Subcut: four 4-1/2" squares two 3" x WOF strips. Subcut: twenty-four 3" squares

#### From each of Fabrics D-F, cut:

two 3" x WOF strips. Subcut: twenty-four 3" squares

### From Fabric G, cut:

one 4-1/2" x WOF strip. Subcut: three 4-1/2" squares three 5-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut: twenty 5-1/2" squares for the QST blocks

## From each of Fabrics H and I, cut:

five 2-1/2" x WOF strip. Subcut: sixty-six 2-1/2" squares

#### From Fabric J, cut:

three 5-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut: twenty 5-1/2" squares for the QST blocks nine 3" x WOF strips. Subcut: one hundred twenty 3" squares eighteen 2-1/2" x WOF strip. Subcut: thirty-one 2-1/2" x 12-1/2" strips for sashing one hundred twenty 2-1/2" squares

## From the Binding Fabric, cut:

eight 2-1/2" x WOF strips

## Assemble the Half-Square Triangles (HSTs)

**Step 1:** Pair a 3" Fabric J square with a 3" Fabric A square, RST. Mark a diagonal line on the wrong side of one square. Sew 1/4" away from both sides of the marked line. Cut on the marked line, creating two half-square triangles (HSTs). Press toward the darker fabric. Trim to 2-1/2" square. Repeat to make:



forty-eight A/J HSTs



forty-eight B/J HSTs



sixteen A/B HSTs



twelve E/F HSTs



thirty-six E/J HSTs



thirty-six F/J HSTs

twelve D/C HSTs



thirty-six D/J HSTs



thirty-six C/J HSTs

## Assemble the A, B and C Blocks

Note: These steps are specific to the A Blocks, but the process is the same for Blocks B and C. Use the Block Assembly Diagrams for fabric placement.

## Step 2: Gather:

four 2-1/2" Fabric J squares twelve A/J HSTs twelve B/J HSTs four A/B HSTs one 4-1/2" Fabric C square





Arrange following the Block Assembly Diagram. Sew the units together to form eight four-patches, pressing the seams open or to one side. Sew the four-patches together, along with the center square, in three rows of three. Press. Repeat to make a total of four 12-1/2" A Blocks. **Step 3:** Repeat the process in Step 2 to make three B Blocks and three C Blocks.

## Assemble the Quarter-Square Triangles (QSTs)

**Step 4:** Pair a 5-1/2" Fabric J square with a 5-1/2" Fabric G square, RST. Mark a diagonal line on the wrong side of one square. Sew 1/4" away from both sides of the marked line. Cut on the marked line, creating two half-square triangles (HSTs). Press toward the darker fabric. Do not trim yet.



**Step 5:** Pair two Step 4 HSTs, RST, matching opposite fabrics together. Mark a diagonal line perpendicular to the seam line on the wrong side of one square. Sew 1/4" away from both sides of the marked line. Cut on the marked line, creating two quarter-square triangles (QSTs). Press toward the seam open or to one side. Trim to 4-1/2" square. Repeat to make a total of forty J/G QSTs.



**Step 6:** Gather two 2-1/2" Fabric J squares and two 2-1/2" Fabric I squares. Arrange in a four-patch, sewing the square together to make rows. Press toward the darker fabric. Sew the rows together to form the four-patch unit, pressing the seam open or to one side. Repeat to make twenty I/J fourpatch units.

**Step 7:** Repeat the process in Step 6 to make twenty J/H four-patch units and ten I/H four-patch units.

## Assemble the D Blocks

### Step 8: Gather:

four J/G QSTs two I/J four-patches two H/J four-patches one H/I four-patch

**Step 9:** Arrange the block together in three rows of three, noting the orientation of the QSTs and four patches in the Block Assembly Diagram. Sew the units together to form rows. Press the seams to the left in the odd numbered rows and to the right in the even numbered rows. Sew the rows together to form the block. Press the row seams open.



Repeat to make a total of ten D Blocks.

## Assemble the Quilt



**Step 10:** Arrange the blocks together as indicated in the Quilt Assembly Diagram. Sew each row together, using sashing strips between each block. Press seams toward the sashing. Repeat to make five block rows.

**Step 11:** Gather three cornerstone squares and four sashing strips. Sew each row together, using cornerstones between each sashing strip. Press seams toward the sashing. Repeat to make two sashing rows of each style.



**Step 12:** Sew the sashing and block rows together, pinning and nesting the seams. Press seams open or to the sashing.

## Add the Borders

**Step 13:** Sew the Fabric B inner border strips together, end-to-end. Measure the length of the quilt through the center. Cut two side inner border strips to this length. Sew the borders to the sides of the quilt center. Press toward the border. Measure the width of the quilt through the center. Cut two top/bottom inner border strips to this length. Sew the borders to the top/ bottom of the quilt center. Press toward the border.

**Step 14:** Sew the Fabric A outer border strips together, end-to-end. Measure the length of the quilt through the center. Cut two side outer border strips to this length. Sew the borders to the sides of the quilt center. Press toward the border. Measure the width of the quilt through the center. Cut two top/bottom outer border strips to this length. Sew the borders to the top/ bottom of the quilt center. Press toward the border.

Your quilt top is complete. Baste, quilt, bind and enjoy!
