## Notes Before You Begin

- Read through all of the instructions before beginning.
- All of the seam allowances are $1 / 4$ " unless otherwise noted.
- Press seam allowances open unless otherwise noted.
- Width of fabric (WOF) is equal to at least 42" wide.
- Right sides together has been abbreviated to RST.
- Remember to measure twice and cut once!


## Cutting Instructions

## From Fabric A , fussy cut:

eight 9-1/2" x 11-1/2" rectangles

## From Fabric B , cut:

eleven 1-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut:
thirty-two 1-1/2" x 11-1/2" block border strips
six 1-1/2" x WOF strips. Sew together, end-to-end, then trim:
two 1-1/2" $\times 62-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ side Border 2 strips
two 1-1/2" $\times 49-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ top/bottom Border 2 strips

## From Fabric C, cut:

five 4-1/2" x WOF strips. Sew together, end-to-end, then cut: two 4-1/2" $\times 56-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ column sashing strips
five 3-1/2" x WOF strips. Sew together, end-to-end, then trim:
two 3-1/2" $\times 56-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ side Border 1 strips
two 3-1/2" x 47-1/2" top/bottom Border 1 strips
two 3-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut:
six 3-1/2" $\times 11-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles
three 2-3/4" x WOF strips. Subcut: eight $2-3 / 4$ " $\times 11-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles
five $2-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF strips. Subcut: seventy $2-1 / 2$ " squares for the flying geese
two 1 " x WOF strips. Subcut: fourteen 1" x 4-1/2" rectangles

From each of Fabrics D-H, cut:
one 2-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut:
seven $2-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 4-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles for the flying geese
From Fabric I, cut:
three 5" x length of fabric strips. Sew together, end-to-end, then trim: two 5 " $\times 64-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ side Border 3 strips
From the remaining width of fabric, cut:
five 5 " $\times$ WOF strips. Sew together, end-to-end, then trim:
two 5" x 58-1/2" top/bottom Border 3 strips
From the Binding Fabric, cut:
seven 2-1/2" x WOF strips

## Assemble the Flying Geese Units

Step 1: Place a $2-1 / 2$ " Fabric C square RST at one end of a Fabric D rectangle. Mark a diagonal line on the wrong side of the square, as shown. Sew on the marked line and trim away the excess fabric, leaving a $1 / 4$ " seam allowance. Press toward the triangle.


Step 2: Repeat Step 1 at the remaining end of the rectangle. The resulting flying geese block should measure 2-1/2" x 4-1/2".


Step 3: Repeat with all remaining Fabric D-F rectangles.

Assemble the Blocks
Step 4: Gather:
one flying geese unit from each of Fabrics D-H
two 1 " $\times 4-1 / 2$ " Fabric B rectangles
two 2-3/4" $\times 11-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric B rectangles
Arrange the units into three rows. Note the fabric placement and block orientation in the Block Assembly Diagram.


Step 6: Sew the rows together, pressing the seams to one side to form the block.

The block should measure 9" $\times$ 11-1/2". Repeat to make a total of four blocks like this.

Step 7: Gather:
one flying geese unit from each of Fabrics D-H two 1" $\times 4-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric B rectangles two $3-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 11-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric B rectangles

Arrange the units into three rows. Note the fabric placement and block orientation in the Block Assembly Diagram.

Step 8: Sew the units together to form the center row.
 Press the seams in one direction.


Step 9: Sew the rows together, pressing the seams to one side to form the block.

The block should measure $10-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 11-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$. Repeat to make a total of three blocks like this.

Step 10: Gather: one Fabric A panel unit
four $1-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 11-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric B block border strips


Sew a border strip to the left and right edges of the Fabric A block center. Press. Sew a border strip to the top and bottom edges of the Fabric A block center. Press.

The block should measure 11-1/2" x 12-1/2". Repeat to make a total of seven blocks like this.


Step 11: Arrange the blocks into three columns. Note the specific block placement and orientation in the Quilt Assembly Diagram.

Step 12: Sew the blocks together to form columns. Press the seams in one direction.
Step 13: Sew the columns together to form the quilt center, placing a 4-1/2" Fabric C column sashing strip between each column. Press.

Step 14: Sew the side Border 1 pieces to the sides of the quilt center. Press toward the borders. Sew the top and bottom Border 1 pieces to the quilt center. Press toward the borders.

Step 15: Sew the side Border 2 pieces to the sides of the quilt center. Press toward the borders. Sew the top and bottom Border 2 pieces to the quilt center. Press toward the borders.

Step 16: Sew the side Border 3 pieces to the sides of the quilt center. Press toward the borders. Sew the top and bottom Border 3 pieces to the quilt center. Press toward the borders.

Your quilt top is complete! Baste, quilt, bind and enjoy!
