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## Notes Before You Begin

- Read through all of the instructions before beginning.
- All of the seam allowances are 1/4 unless otherwise noted.
- Press seam allowances open unless otherwise noted.
- Width of fabric (WOF) is equal to at least 40 " wide.
- Right sides together has been abbreviated to RST.
- Remember to measure twice and cut once!


## Cutting Instructions

From Fabric A, cut:
two 5-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut:
forty 1-1/2" x 5-1/2" rectangles
three 3-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut:
forty $3-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 2-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles
two 2-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut:
forty 2-1/2" x 1-1/2" rectangles
four 3-1/2" x WOF for the top and bottom border strips
sew the strips together in pairs, end-to-end, then trim each to form two 3-1/2" x 68-1/2" borders
four $4-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF for the side border strips
sew the strips together in pairs, end-to-end, then trim each to form two 4-1/2" x 88-1/2" borders

From Fabric B, cut:
fifty-one 2-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut:
twenty-four 2-1/2" x 12-1/2" block sashing strips
sixty $2-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 6-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles
one hundred twenty $2-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 4-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles
sixty $2-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 3-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles
sixty $2-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 1-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles
sew the remaining ten 2-1/2" strips into pairs, end-to-end, then trim to form five $2-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 68-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ row sashing strips

From each of Fabrics C-F, cut:
four 2-1/2" $\times 2-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ squares
two 2-1/2" $\times 6-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangle
three $2-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 1-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles
three $2-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 3-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles
three $5-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 1-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles
From each of Fabrics G-BB, cut:
two 2-1/2" $\times 2-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ squares
one $2-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 6-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangle
three $2-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 1-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles
three $2-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 3-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles
three $5-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 1-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles
From each of Fabrics $\mathbf{G}$ and $\mathbf{H}$, cut:
one additional 2-1/2" $\times 1-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangle one additional $2-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 3-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangle one additional 5-1/2" $\times 1-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangle

From the binding fabric, cut:
nine 2-1/2" x WOF strips

## Assemble the Blocks

Make all blocks of one block type, then move on to the next type. All blocks are assembled in the same way. Take special care to note the fabric placement in each of the four block types:


Arrange the pieces on a work surface and confirm the fabric placement with the pattern for the block type you are constructing. Use any combination of Fabrics C-BB when constructing each block, but note that pieces are always sewn next to pieces cut from the same fabric. Example: In the sample block, Fabric $O$ is sewn to Fabric $O$ when rows are sewn together and Fabric $A$ is sewn to Fabric A when rows are sewn together.

Sew pieces into rows. Press seams away from the Fabric B units. Sew seven rows together to form the block. Press seams open. Blocks should measure 12-1/2" square.


Arrange the four block types as shown in the Quilt Assembly Diagram. Sew block sashing strips between each block. Press seams to the sashing.

Sew rows together, using a row sashing strip between each row. Press seams to the sashing.
Sew the $3-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 68-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ borders to the top and bottom of the quilt. Press toward the border.
Sew the $4-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 88-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ borders to the sides of the quilt. Press toward the border.
Your quilt is complete! Baste, quilt, bind and enjoy!
