## Notes Before You Begin

- Read through all of the instructions before beginning.
- All of the seam allowances are $1 / 4$ " unless otherwise noted.
- Press seam allowances open unless otherwise noted.
- Width of fabric (WOF) is equal to at least 40" wide.
- Right sides together has been abbreviated to RST.
- Remember to measure twice and cut once!
- Print copies of Templates A-C once at 100\%.


## Cutting Instructions

From each of Fabric A-D, cut:
Twenty triangles using Template A, for a total of eighty Template A pieces. Note: Cut following the grainline mark on the template to avoid having bias edges along the base of the triangle. Note the orientation of the print on Fabric C. Refer to the block assembly diagrams and cut directional fabrics accordingly. This will use more fabric than usual, but will result in a quilt with fabrics oriented in one direction.

From Fabric E, cut:
Eighty triangles using Template B
Note: Cut following the grainline mark on the template to avoid having bias edges along the base of the triangle.

From Fabric F, cut:
Eighty triangles using Template C
Note: Cut following the grainline mark on the template to avoid having bias edges along the base of the triangle.

From each of Fabric G and H, cut:
Two 5-7/8" x WOF strips. Subcut ten 5-7/8" squares from each fabric.

From binding fabric, cut:
eight 2-1/2" x WOF strips
Asemble the A Blocks


Orient the Fabric A-D triangles so that the base is at the bottom and the point is up. Sew a Fabric E triangle to the left side of the piece and a Fabric F triangle to the right side. Press seams away from the center triangle.

Repeat for all A-D pieces, including those for the B Blocks.


Gather Fabric $A$ and $B$ units and Fabric $G$ squares. Mark 1/4" in from each corner on the wrong side of the squares.

Place a Fabric A unit RST with the square. Sew from mark to mark, stopping exactly on your $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ mark. Repeat on the opposite side of the square. Press seams away from the square.


Place a Fabric B unit RST with a remaining side of the square. Sew from mark to mark, stopping exactly on your $1 / 4$ " mark. Repeat on the opposite side of the square.

Bring Fabric E and F triangle edges together and sew together, stopping at the seam intersection nearest the center square. Press seams open.

Asemble the B Blocks


Repeat the A Block process, using the fabrics shown in the B Block diagram.

## Assembling the Quilt

Arrange the blocks in a layout of five rows of four blocks each, alternating the Block As and Bs, noting the orientation of the center squares of the blocks on the Quilt Assembly Diagram.

Press block seams to the left in odd numbered rows and to the right in even numbered rows. Press row seams open.

Your quilt is complete. Baste, bind, quilt and enjoy!
