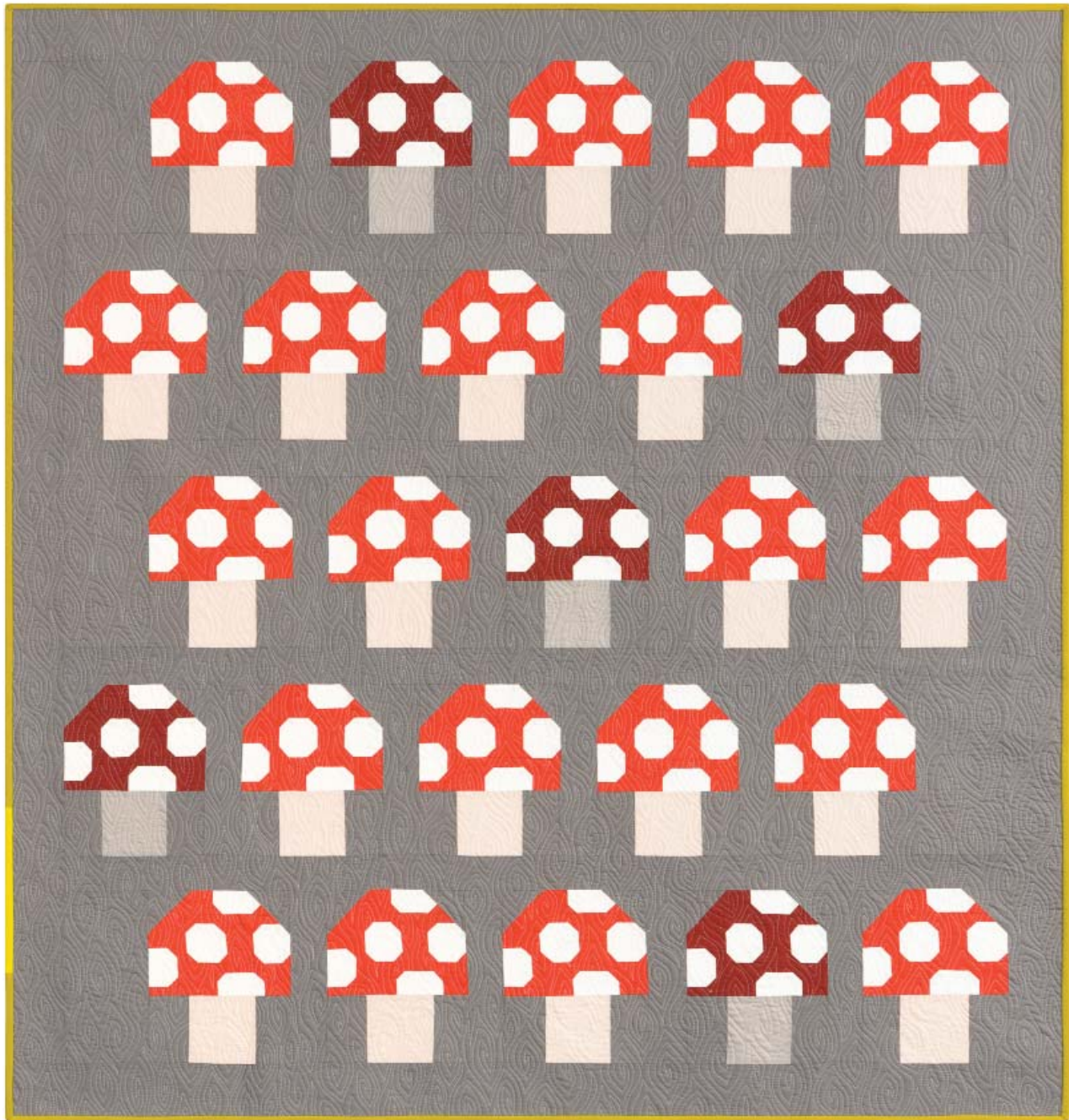

Fabric and Supplies Needed

Fabric amounts based on yardage that is 42" wide.

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Notes Before You Begin

- Please read all directions before starting your project.
- Yardages are based on fabrics at least 42" wide.
- You will also need the fabric marking tool of your choice
- WOF = width of fabric
- LOF = length of fabric (along the selvage edge)
- Unless otherwise noted, all seams are sewn with a 1/4" seam allowance and pressed open.
- If making this project with print fabrics, please note that, when sewing diagonal seams, pieces should be placed with right sides together. (This isn't important with Kona solids, since both sides are the same.)

Cutting Instructions

From Fabric A, cut:

one 6" x WOF strip and subcut:
forty pieces G, 1" x 6" each
four 2-1/2" x WOF strips and subcut:
twenty pieces I, 2-1/2" x 3-1/2" each
twenty pieces F, 2" x 2-1/2" each
forty pieces H, 1" x 2-1/2" each
four 2" x WOF strips and subcut:
eighty pieces E, 1-3/4" x 2" each
seven 1" x WOF strips and subcut:
two hundred sixty pieces D, 1" x 1" each

From Fabric B, cut:

one 2-1/2" x WOF strip and subcut:
five pieces I, 2-1/2" x 3-1/2" each
five pieces F, 2" x 2-1/2" each
ten pieces H, 1" x 2-1/2" each
one 1-3/4" x WOF strip and subcut:
twenty pieces E, 1-3/4" x 2" each
four 1" x WOF strips and subcut:
ten pieces G, 1" x 6" each
sixty-five pieces D, 1" x 1" each

From Fabric C, cut:

three 3" x WOF strips and subcut:
fifty pieces B, 1-3/4" x 3" each
four 2-1/2" x WOF strips and subcut:
fifty pieces A, 2-1/2" x 2-1/2"
two 2" x WOF strips and subcut:
twenty-five pieces C, 2" x 2-1/2" each

From Fabric D, cut:

two 4" x WOF strips and subcut:
twenty pieces J, 4" x 4" each

From Fabric E, cut:

one 4" x WOF strip and subcut:
five pieces J, 4" x 4" each

From Fabric F, cut:

four 2-3/4" x WOF strips and subcut:
fifty pieces L, 2-3/4" x 2-3/4" each
five 2-1/2" x WOF strips and subcut:
fifty pieces K, 2-1/2" x 4" each

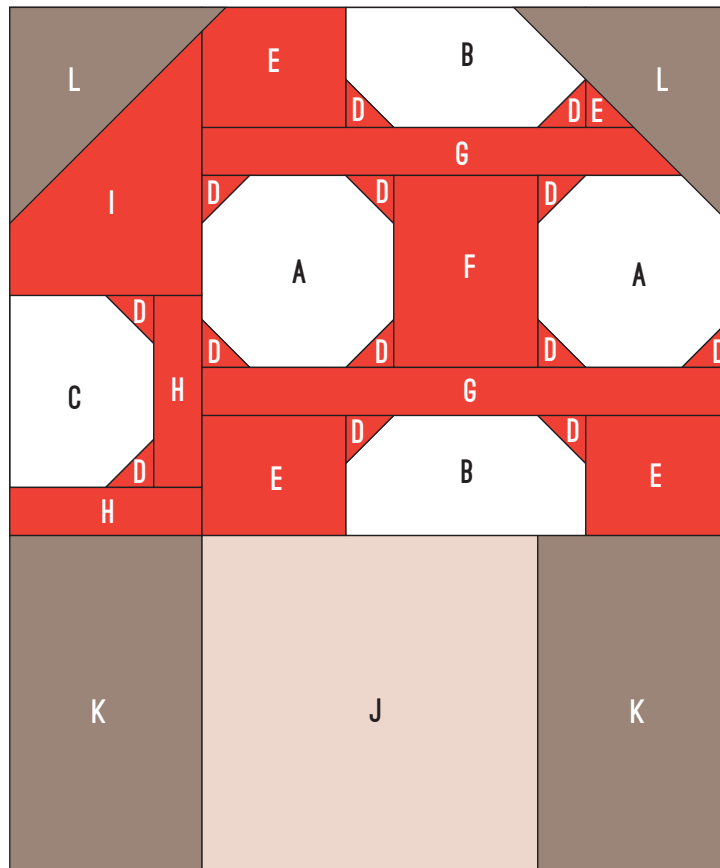
Note: All remaining strips will be cut along the length (selvage edge) of the fabric:

one 9-1/2" x LOF strip and subcut:
twenty Vertical Sashing pieces, 2-1/2" x 9-1/2" each
one 5" x LOF strip and subcut:
five Spacer pieces, 5" x 9-1/2" each

four 3-1/2" x LOF strips and subcut:
 two Horizontal Border pieces, 3-1/2" x 56-1/2" each
 two Vertical Border pieces, 3-1/2" x 53-1/2" each
 four 2-1/2" x LOF strips and subcut:
 four Horizontal Sashing pieces, 2-1/2" x 50-1/2" each

From the Binding Fabric, cut:
 six 2-1/2" x WOF strips

Block Diagram



Block Diagram

Each block measures 7-1/2" x 9" finished (8" x 9-1/2" with seam allowance). The chart below shows the size and number of pieces in each block.

A	Kona Snow	2	2-1/2" x 2-1/2"
B	Kona Snow	2	1-3/4" x 3"
C	Kona Snow	1	2" x 2-1/2"
D	Kona Tiger Lily or Paprika	13	1" x 1"
E	Kona Tiger Lily or Paprika	4	1-3/4" x 2"

F	Kona Tiger Lily or Paprika	1	2" x 2-1/2"
G	Kona Tiger Lily or Paprika	2	1" x 6"

I	Kona Tiger Lily or Paprika	1	2-1/2" x 3-1/2"
J	Kona Lingerie or Doeskin	1	4" x 4"
K	Kona Zinc	2	2-1/2" x 4"

Making the Blocks

Follow Steps 1 - 10 to make twenty mushroom blocks with Kona Tigerlily caps and Lingerie stems, and five accent blocks with Kona Paprika caps and Kona Doeskin stems.

Step 1: Align one piece D in each of the four corners of one piece A. Mark a diagonal line from corner to corner of each piece D, as shown in **Fig. 1**. Sew along the marked lines to make diagonal seams, trim away excess fabric leaving 1/4" seam allowance and press the seams open to make a DDADD unit.

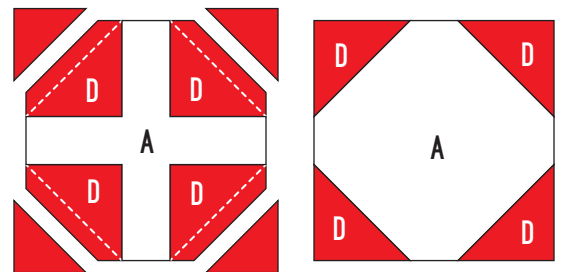

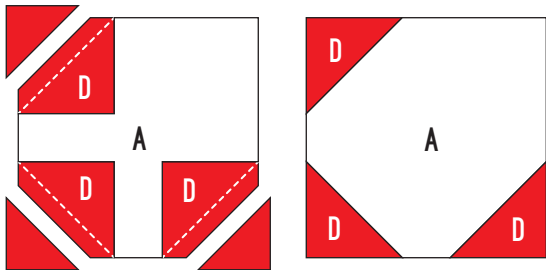

Step 2: Align one piece D in three of the four corners of another piece A. Mark a diagonal line from corner to corner of each piece D, as shown in **Fig. 2**. Sew along the marked lines to make diagonal seams, trim away excess fabric leaving 1/4" seam allowance and press the seams open to make a DDAD unit.

Note: Several remaining steps use diagonal seams. When sewing diagonal seams, use the same process described in Steps 1 and 2, referring to the diagrams to make sure pieces and angles are aligned correctly.

Step 3: Sew together the DDADD unit, one piece F, and the DDAD unit, as shown in **Fig. 3** to make the 2-1/2" x 6" DDADDFDDAD unit.

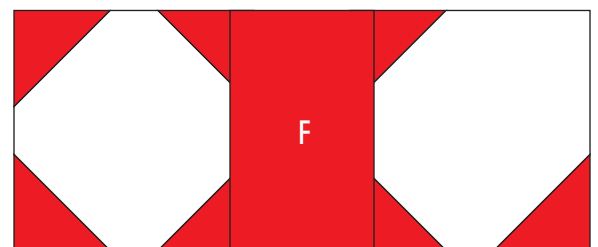

Step 4: Use diagonal seams to sew two pieces D to one piece B, as shown in Fig. 4. Sew one piece E to each side of the DBD unit. Repeat this process to make a total of two identical EDBDE units, 1-3/4" x 6" each.

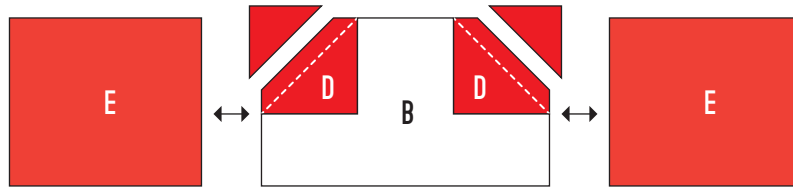

Step 5: Refer to Fig. 5 to sew together the DDADDFDDAD unit and the EDBDE units, sewing pieces G between the pieces units, as shown in Fig. 5 to make the 6" x 6" Right Mushroom Cap Unit.

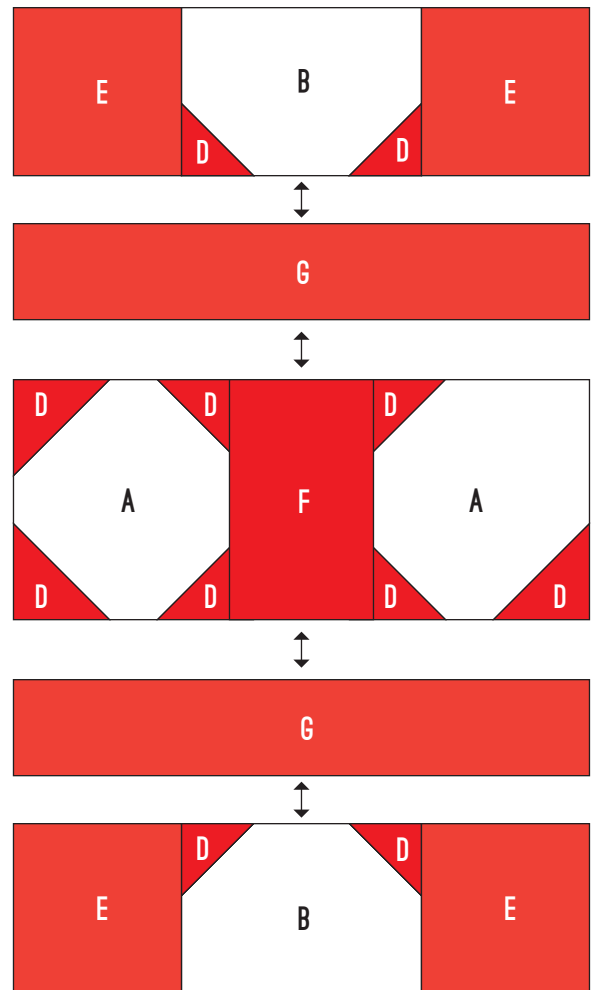

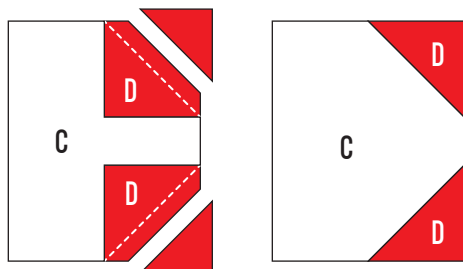

Step 6: Use diagonal seams to sew two pieces D to one piece C, as shown in Fig. 6.

Step 7: Sew piece I to the right side of the BCB unit, as shown in **Fig. 7**. Sew piece I to the top and another piece H to the bottom to make the 2-1/2" x 6" Left Mushroom Cap Unit.

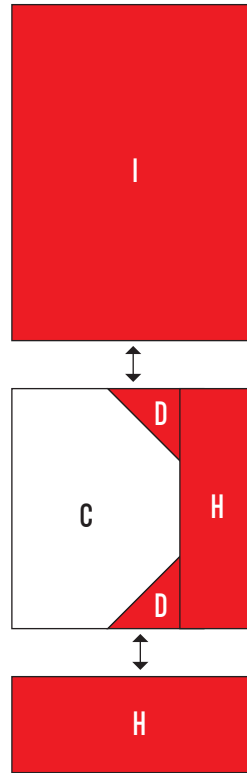

Step 8: Sew together the Left and Right Mushroom Cap Units to make the 6" x 8" Mushroom Cap, as shown in **Fig. 8**.

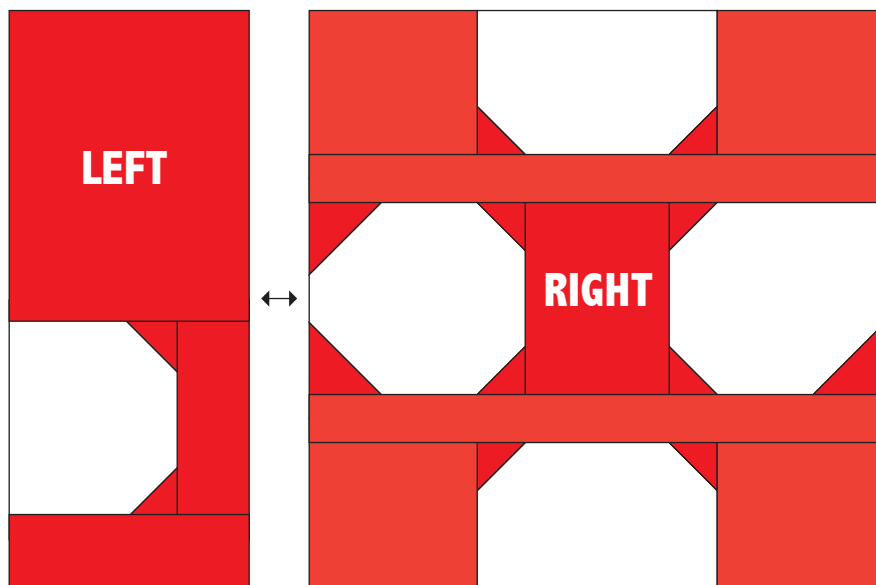

Step 9: Sew two pieces K to one piece J, as shown in **Fig. 9** to make the 4" x 8" Mushroom Stem.

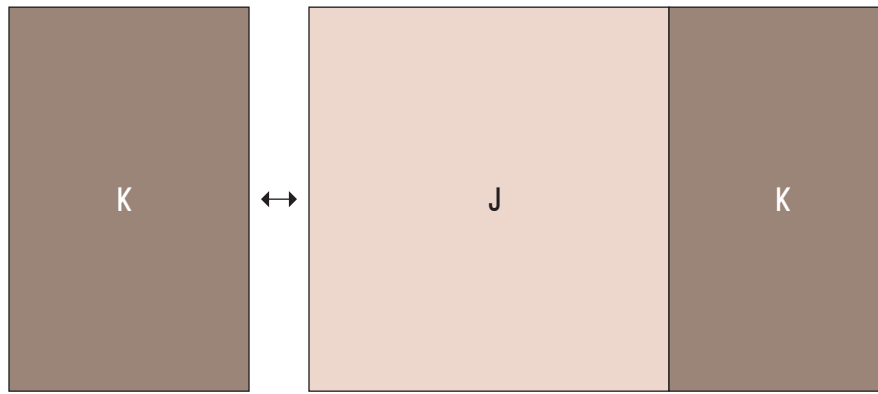

Step 10: Refer to **Fig. 10** to sew together the Cap and Stem units. Use diagonal seams to sew two pieces L to the top to finish the 8" wide x 9-1/2" tall block.

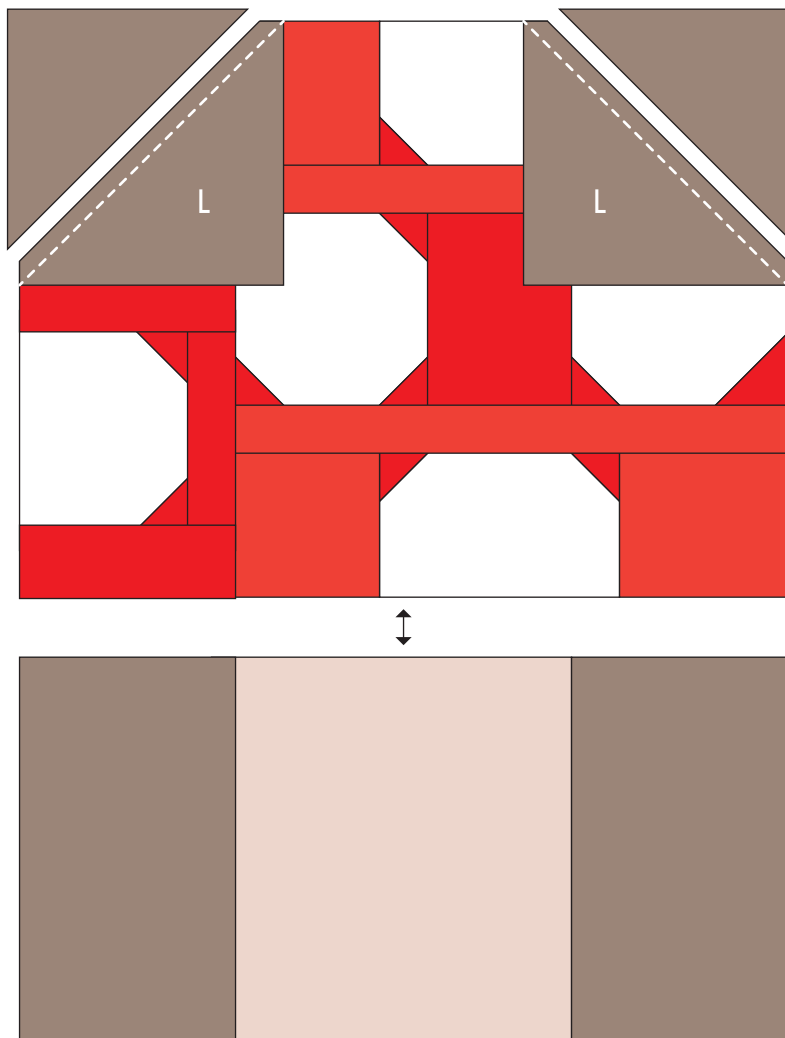
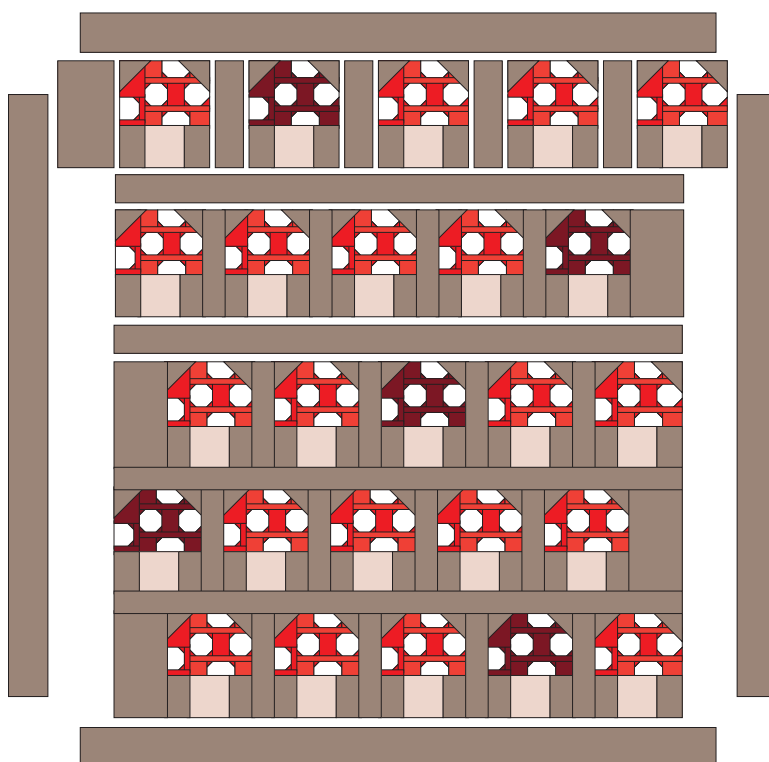

Make the Quilt Top



Quilt Top Assembly

Step 11: Refer to the Quilt Top Assembly Diagram to arrange the twenty blocks and five accent blocks in five rows of five.

Step 12: Sew together the blocks in each row, sewing a Vertical Sashing piece between each block, beginning and ending with a block. Sew a Spacer piece to the left side of Rows 1, 3, and 5. Sew a Spacer piece to the right side of Rows 2 and 4.

Step 13: Sew together the five rows, sewing a Horizontal Sashing strip between each row, beginning and ending with a row.

Step 14: Sew the Vertical Border strips to the left and right sides. Sew the Horizontal Border strips to the top and bottom to finish the 53-1/2" x 56-1/2" quilt top.

Finish the Quilt

From the backing fabric, cut two pieces 64" x WOF. Trim away selvages and sew the pieces together along the long sides. Trim the quilt back to 64" x 78"

Sandwich, quilt as desired and bind.

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
