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## Notes Before You Begin

- Read through all of the instructions before beginning.
- All of the seam allowances are $1 / 4$ " unless otherwise noted.
- Press seam allowances open unless otherwise noted.
- Width of fabric (WOF) is equal to at least 42" wide.
- Right sides together has been abbreviated to RST.
- Remember to measure twice and cut once!


## Cutting Instructions

## From Fabric A, cut:

two 3-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut:
sixteen 3-1/2" squares for Piece 1
six 1-1/2" x WOF strips. Sew together, end-to-end, then trim:
two 1-1/2" x 62-1/2" top/bottom inner borders
two 1-1/2" x 60-1/2" side inner borders

## From Fabric B, cut:

four 1-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut:
sixteen $1-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 3-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strips for Piece 2
sixteen 1-1/2" x 4-1/2" strips for Piece 3
From Fabric C, cut:
five 1-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut:
sixteen 1-1/2" x 4-1/2" strips for Piece 4 sixteen $1-1 / 2 " \times 5-1 / 2 "$ strips for Piece 5

From Fabric D, cut:
six 1-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut:
sixteen $1-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 5-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strips for Piece 6
sixteen $1-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 6-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strips for Piece 7

## From Fabric E , cut:

seven 1-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut:
sixteen 1-1/2" x 6-1/2" strips for Piece 8 sixteen $1-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 7-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strips for Piece 9

From Fabric F , cut:
eight 1-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut: sixteen 1-1/2" $\times 7-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strips for Piece 10 sixteen 1-1/2" x 8-1/2" strips for Piece 11

## From Fabric G, cut:

eight 1-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut: sixteen 1-1/2" x 8-1/2" strips for Piece 12 sixteen $1-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 9-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strips for Piece 13

## From Fabric H , cut:

one 2-1/2" x WOF strip. Subcut:
four 2-1/2" squares for the center. Mark a diagonal on the wrong side of each square.
eight 1-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut:
sixteen 1-1/2" $\times 9-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strips for Piece 14
sixteen 1-1/2" x 10-1/2" strips for Piece 15

## From Fabric I, cut:

ten 1-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut:
sixteen 1-1/2" x 10-1/2" strips for Piece 16
sixteen 1-1/2" $\times 11-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strips for Piece 17

## From Fabric J, cut:

twelve 1-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut:
sixteen 1-1/2" x 11-1/2" strips for Piece 18
sixteen $1-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 12-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strips for Piece 19

From Fabric K, cut:
twelve 1-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut:
sixteen $1-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 12-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strips for Piece 20
sixteen 1-1/2" x 13-1/2" strips for Piece 21
From Fabric L, cut:
fourteen 1-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut:
sixteen $1-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 13-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strips for Piece 22
sixteen $1-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 14-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strips for Piece 23

From Fabric M, cut:
sixteen 1-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut:
sixteen $1-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 14-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strips for Piece 24
sixteen $1-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 15-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strips for Piece 25

## From Fabric N , cut:

eight 5-1/2" x WOF strips. Sew together in pairs, end-to-end, then trim:
four $5-1 / 2 " \times 75$ " outer borders

From the Binding Fabric, cut:
eight 2-1/2" x WOF strips


Step 1: Gather:
one each of Pieces 1-25
Arrange the units together to form a log cabin block. Note the fabric placement in the Block Assembly Diagram.

Step 2: Sew Piece 1 to the right edge of Piece 2, as shown. Press away from Piece 1 . Sew Piece 3 to the top edge of the unit and press away from Piece 1. Continue sewing Pieces 4-25 in the order and position shown in the diagram, always pressing to the outer edge.

The final block should measure 15-1/2" square.

Repeat Steps 1 and 2 to make a total of sixteen Blocks.

Step 3: Gather four of the Blocks. In the Fabric K corner of each, place a 2-1/2" Fabric H square RST, aligning the raw edges of the two side edges, as shown.


Step 4: Sew along the marked line. Trim the excess, leaving a $1 / 4$ " seam allowance, then press.

Step 5: Arrange the blocks into four rows of four blocks. Note the fabric placement and block orientation in the Quilt Assembly Diagram.

Step 6: Sew the blocks together to form rows. Press the rows to the left in the odd numbered rows and to the right in the even numbered rows.

Step 7: Sew the rows together to form the quilt center. Press the row seams open.
Step 8: Sew the top and bottom inner borders to the quilt center. Press toward the borders. Sew the side inner borders to the sides of the quilt center. Press toward the borders.

Step 9: Center and pin one side outer border to the quilt top. Sew the border, starting and stopping $1 / 4$ " from each end of the quilt top. Repeat with the remaining side outer border. Repeat with the top and bottom borders. Note: borders will extend beyond the quilt's edge.


Step 10: Fold the quilt diagonally, right sides together and align two of the borders directly on top of each other.

Use your ruler to draw a line from the corner of the quilt to the edge of the border.


Step 11: Sew along this marked line, beginning at the point where your border stitching had ended and sew to the edge of the border. Check to be sure the mitered border presses flat from the front, then trim 1/4" away from the marked line, removing the excess border length.


Your quilt top is complete! Baste, quilt, bind and enjoy!

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
