## Cutting Instructions

Fabrics A through F, from each fabric:

Backing

- Cut (4) $4-1 / 2^{1 "} \times$ WOF strips. Sub-cut the strips into (7) $4-1 / 2^{11} \times 8-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strips and (14) 4-1/2" squares.
- Cut (2) 4-1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut the strips into (4) 4-1/2" x 8-1/2" strips and (8) 4-1/2" squares.
- Cut (3) 8-1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut the strips into (10) 8-1/2" squares.
- Cut (11) 4-1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut the strips into (92) 4-1/2" squares.
- Cut (6) 8-1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut the strips into (46) 4-1/2" x 8-1/2" strips.
- Cut (3) $4-1 / 2^{1 "} \times$ WOF strips. Piece the strips together to make (2) $4-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 56-1 / 2^{1 "}$ strips.
- Cut (7) $2-1 / 2^{1 "} \times$ WOF strips for the binding.
- Cut (2) 64 " $\times 42$ " strips. Piece the strips together to make one 64 " $\times 84$ " piece for the backing.


## Assembly Instructions:

1) Place (1) $4-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric $G$ square on the left side of (1) $4-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 8-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric H strip, right sides together (Fig. 1). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 1). Flip open the triangle formed and press (Fig. 2). Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle leaving a $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ seam allowance.
2) Place another $4-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric $G$ square on the right side of the $4-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 8-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric H strip, right sides together (Fig. 3). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper left corner to the lower right corner (Fig. 3). Flip open the triangle formed and press (Fig. 4). Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle leaving a $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ seam allowance to make one Flying Geese Unit. Repeat to make four flying geese with Fabric G corners and a Fabric H center as well as four units with Fabric H corners and a Fabric G center.
3) Repeat Steps 1 and 2 to make (7) flying geese units of each of the following combinations:

- Fabric A corners \& Fabric H center
- Fabric B corners \& Fabric H center
- Fabric C corners \& Fabric H center
- Fabric D corners \& Fabric H center
- Fabric E corners \& Fabric H center
- Fabric F corners \& Fabric H center
- Fabric H corners \& Fabric A center
- Fabric H corners \& Fabric B center
- Fabric H corners \& Fabric C center
- Fabric H corners \& Fabric D center
- Fabric H corners \& Fabric E center
- Fabric H corners \& Fabric F center

4) Refer to the quilt photo for block placement to arrange (7) flying geese blocks into one row. Repeat to make (17) flying geese rows.
5) Sew together the (17) flying geese rows and (2) 4-1/2" $\times 56-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric H strips to make the $56-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 76-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ quilt top.
6) Layer, quilt and bind as desired.
