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## Notes Before You Begin

- Read through all of the instructions before beginning.
- All of the seam allowances are 1/4" unless otherwise noted.
- Press seam allowances open unless otherwise noted.
- Width of fabric (WOF) is equal to at least 42" wide.
- Right sides together has been abbreviated to RST.
- Remember to measure twice and cut once!

### **Cutting Instructions**

#### From Fabric A, cut:

two 12-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut:

• six 12-1/2" squares

#### From Fabric B, cut:

one 12-1/2" x WOF strip. Subcut:

• two 12-1/2" squares

#### From Fabric C, cut:

three 5-7/8" x WOF strips. Subcut:

• twenty 5-7/8" squares. Cut each square in half along the diagonal, creating forty medium triangles.

#### From Fabric D, cut:

two 3-3/8" x WOF strips. Subcut:

• twenty 3-3/8" squares. Cut each square in half along the diagonal, creating forty small triangles.

one 2-1/2" x WOF strip. Subcut:

• ten 2-1/2" squares

#### From Fabric E, cut:

three 2-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut:

• forty 2-1/2" squares

#### From Fabric F, cut:

four 4-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut:

- ten 4-1/2" x 8-1/2" rectangles
- fourteen 4-1/2" squares

five 3-3/8" x WOF strips. Subcut:

• sixty 3-3/8" squares. Cut each square in half along the diagonal, creating one hundred twenty small triangles.

four 2-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut:

• forty 2-1/2" x 3-1/2" rectangles

#### From Fabric G, cut:

five 4-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut:

• forty-two 4-1/2" squares

#### From Fabric H, cut:

two 19-1/4" x WOF strips. Subcut:

• four 19-1/4" squares. Cut each square in half along both diagonals, creating sixteen extra large Side Setting Triangles. Two will not be used.

one 9-1/2" x WOF strip. Subcut:

• two 9-1/2" squares. Cut each square in half along the diagonal, creating four large Corner Setting Triangles.

six 4-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut:

- four 4-1/2" x 12-1/2" rectangles
- ten 4-1/2" x 8-1/2" rectangles
- eighteen 4-1/2" squares

## Assemble the A Blocks





**Step 1:** Gather: one 4-1/2" x 12-1/2" Fabric H rectangle two 4-1/2" Fabric H squares three 4-1/2" Fabric G squares one 4-1/2" Fabric F square

Arrange the units as shown. Note the fabric placement and block orientation in the Block Assembly Diagram.

**Step 2:** Sew the units together to form the sections. Press the seams toward the Fabric G squares.

**Step 3:** Sew the units together, nesting the seams and pressing the seams to one side to form the block.



The resulting A Block should measure 12-1/2" square. Make four A Blocks.





Step 4: Gather:

one 4-1/2" x 8-1/2" Fabric H rectangle one 4-1/2" Fabric H square three 4-1/2" Fabric G squares one 4-1/2" Fabric F square one 4-1/2" x 8-1/2" Fabric F rectangle

Arrange the units into three columns. Note the fabric placement and block orientation in the Block Assembly Diagram.

**Step 5:** Sew the units together to form the columns. Press the seams toward the Fabric G squares.

**Step 6:** Sew the columns together, nesting the seams and pressing the seams to one side to form the block.

The resulting B Block should measure 12-1/2" square. Make ten B Blocks.



**Step 7:** Sew a 2-1/2" Fabric E square to a 2-1/2" x 3-1/2" Fabric F rectangle. Press. Make forty units like this.

**Step 8:** Sew a small Fabric F triangle to a small Fabric D triangle. Press. Trim to 2-1/2" square, if needed. Make forty units like this.

**Step 9:** Sew a small Fabric F triangle to both remaining edges of Fabric D in a Step 8 unit. Press. Make forty units like this.

**Step 10:** Center and sew a medium Fabric C triangle to the longest edge of a Step 9 unit. Press. Trim to 5-1/2" square, if needed. Make forty units like this.

**Step 11:** Gather: four completed Step 7 units four completed Step 10 units one 2-1/2" Fabric D square

Arrange the units into three rows of three. Note the fabric placement and block orientation in the Block Assembly Diagram.

**Step 12:** Sew the units together to form the rows. Press the seams toward the Step 7 units.

**Step 13:** Sew the rows together, nesting the seams and pressing the seams to one side to form the block.

The resulting C Block should measure 12-1/2" square. Make ten C Blocks.



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Assemble the Quilt



**Step 14:** Arrange the blocks and Fabric A and B squares on point into eight diagonal rows. Note the fabric placement and block orientation in the Quilt Assembly Diagram.

**Step 15:** Sew the blocks together to form rows. Press the rows to the left in the odd numbered rows and to the right in the even numbered rows.

Step 16: Sew the Side Setting Triangles to the ends of the row, as shown. Press.

**Step 17:** Sew the rows together to form the quilt center. Press the row seams open. Sew the Corner Setting Triangles to the corners. Press.

Your quilt top is complete! Baste, quilt, bind and enjoy!

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
