

Notes Before You Begin

- Read through all of the instructions before beginning.
- All of the seam allowances are 1/4" unless otherwise noted.
- Press seam allowances open unless otherwise noted.
- Width of fabric (WOF) is equal to at least 44" wide.
- Right sides together has been abbreviated to RST.
- Remember to measure twice and cut once!

Cutting Instructions

From each of Fabrics A-G, cut:

two 5" x WOF strips. Subcut:

sixteen 5" squares. Cut each square once on the diagonal.

From each of Fabrics H-U, cut:

one 5-1/4" x WOF strip. Subcut:

eight 5-1/4" squares. Cut each square twice on the diagonal.

From the binding fabric, cut:

seven 2-1/2" x WOF strips

Assemble the Block Units

Step 1: Pair the fabrics as follows:

Fabrics H & I

Fabrics J & K

Fabrics L & M


Fabrics N & O

Fabrics P & Q

Fabrics R & S

Fabrics T & U

Step 2: From each set of paired fabrics, sew two smaller triangles together, as illustrated, along a short side. Press the seam toward the darker fabric.



Step 3: Pair each set of triangles from Step 2 with the following larger triangles:

H/I unit & Fabric A large triangle

J/K unit & Fabric B large triangle

L/M unit & Fabric C large triangle


N/O unit & Fabric D large triangle

P/Q unit & Fabric E large triangle

R/S unit & Fabric F large triangle


T/U unit & Fabric G large triangle

Step 4: From each set, sew the Step 2 units to the larger triangles. Press the seam toward the larger triangle. Trim to each unit to 4-1/2" x 4-1/2" using the diagonal line on the ruler as a guide.




Assemble the Quilt

Step 6: Sew two matching units together for form a 4-1/2" x 8-1/2" block. Note the orientation of the units.



Step 7: Sew together into columns of sixteen matching blocks. Press the seams up in the even numbered columns and press the seams down in the odd numbered columns.



Step 8: Sew the columns together to complete the quilt top, pressing the seams to one side.

Your quilt top is now complete! Baste, quilt, bind and enjoy!

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
