Notes Before You Begin

- Read through all of the instructions before beginning.
- All of the seam allowances are 1/4" unless otherwise noted.
- Press seam allowances open unless otherwise noted.
- Width of fabric (WOF) is equal to at least 42" wide.
- Right sides together has been abbreviated to RST.
- Remember to measure twice and cut once!

Cutting Instructions

From the Roll Up Strips, cut:

eighty-four 2-1/2" x 14-1/2" rectangles in a variety of fabrics* eight 2-1/2" x 7-1/2" rectangles in a variety of fabrics*

*The fabric in our sample quilt is arranged in rainbow order. If you would like to mimic this look, you may choose to cut the pieces from the Roll as you sew them together instead of all at once.

From Fabric A, cut:

nineteen 2-1/2" x WOF strips.

Sew seven strips together end-to-end, then subcut: five 2-1/2" x 56-1/2" strips
From the remaining twelve strips, subcut: fifty-six 2-1/2" x 7-1/2" rectangles

From the Binding Fabric, cut:

seven 2-1/2" x WOF strips

Assemble the Units


Step 1: Select one 2-1/2" x 14 -1/2" Roll Up rectangle and one 2-1/2" x 7-1/2" Fabric A rectangle. Sew the two rectangles together along one short side, then press.




Step 2: Repeat to make fifty-six units.

Assemble the Vertical Strip Rows

Step 3: Select twenty-eight units from Steps 1-2 in a gradient or rainbow of colors. Arrange the units in a row in the order you wish to sew them. As you arrange your units, place the Fabric A end of each odd-numbered unit on the bottom edge of the row and the Fabric A end of each even-numbered unit on the top edge of the row.



Step 4: When you are happy with the order of your units, sew them together to form the row. Press the seams open or to one side.



Step 5: Repeat Steps 3-4 to create a second vertical strip row.



Assemble the Horizontal Strip Rows

Step 6: Select one 2-1/2" \times 56-1/2" Fabric A strip, seven 2-1/2" \times 14-1/2" Roll Up rectangles, and two 2-1/2" \times 7-1/2" Roll Up rectangles in a variety of fabrics.



Step 7: Arrange the two 2-1/2" x 7-1/2" Roll Up rectangles and three 2-1/2" x 14-1/2" Roll Up rectangles end-to-end. If you are mimicking the look of our sample quilt, arrange them in rainbow order. Sew the strips together, then press the seams open or to one side.



Step 8: Arrange the four remaining 2-1/2" x 14-1/2" Roll Up rectangles end-to-end. If you are mimicking the look of our sample quilt, arrange them in rainbow order. Sew the strips together, then press the seams open or to one side.



Step 9: Sew the Step 7 row to the top edge of the Step 8 row, then press the seam open or to one side. Sew the Fabric A strip to the bottom edge of the Step 8 row, then press the seam open or to one side.



Step 10: Repeat Steps 6-9 to make three additional horizontal strips rows.




Step 11: Select two of the horizontal strips and one 2-1/2" x 56-1/2" Fabric A strip. Sew each horizontal row to the two long edges of the Fabric A strip as shown, then press.



Assemble the Quilt

Step 12: Arrange the vertical and horizontal rows to form the quilt top as shown in the Quilt Assembly Diagram. Sew the rows together and press the seams open or to one side.

Your quilt top is complete! Baste, quilt, bind, and enjoy!



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
