

Fabric and Supplies Needed

Fabric amounts based on yardage that is 42" wide.

Notes Before You Begin

- Read through all of the instructions before beginning.
- All of the seam allowances are 1/4" unless otherwise noted.
- Press seam allowances open unless otherwise noted.
- Width of fabric (WOF) is equal to at least 42" wide.
- Right sides together has been abbreviated to RST.
- Remember to measure twice and cut once!

Cutting Instructions

From Fabric A, cut:

seven 5-1/2" x WOF strips. Sew together, end-to-end, then trim to yield: two 5-1/2" x 74-1/2" side borders two 5-1/2" x 69-1/2" top and bottom borders fourteen 1-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut: fifteen 1-1/2" x 14-1/2" sashing strips Sew the remaining six strips together, end-to-end, then trim to yield: four 1-1/2" x 59-1/2" row sashing strips twenty of Template 1

From each of Fabrics B, C, E and I, cut:

eighty of Template 2

From each of Fabrics F, H and J, cut: twenty of Template 1

From each of Fabrics D, G, J and K cut: forty of Template 3

From the binding fabric (Fabric I), cut:

eight 2-1/2" x WOF strips

Assemble the A Blocks



Block Assembly Diagram

Step 1: Gather

eight Fabric B triangles (from Template 2) four Fabric G triangles (from Template 3) two Fabric F diamonds (from Template 1)


in a separate area, place: eight Fabric C triangles (from Template 2) four Fabric D triangles (from Template 3) two Fabric J diamonds (from Template 1)


Lay out the pieces, following the Block Assembly Diagram.

Step 2: Sew one long edge of a Fabric B triangle to opposite sides of the Fabric F diamond, offsetting the points as illustrated. Press toward Fabric B. Repeat to make a second unit.




Step 3: Sew one long edge of a Fabric B triangle to one short edge of a Fabric G triangle, offsetting the points as illustrated. Press toward Fabric B. Repeat.






Step 4: Sew one Step 3 unit to opposite sides of a completed Step 2 unit, offsetting the points as illustrated. Press the seam away from the center diamond. Repeat to make a second unit like this.





Step 5: Repeat Steps 2-4 using the Fabric C triangles, D triangles and J diamonds.




Step 6: Arrange the four units together, following the Block Assembly Diagram, noting the fabric placement and unit orientation. Sew the units together in two rows of two, pressing the seams in opposite directions. Sew the rows together, pressing the seam open.

Repeat Steps 1-6 to make ten 14-1/2" A Blocks.



Assemble the B Blocks



Step 7: Gather

eight Fabric I triangles (from Template 2) four Fabric J triangles (from Template 3) two Fabric A diamonds (from Template 1)


in a separate area, place: eight Fabric E triangles (from Template 2) four Fabric K triangles (from Template 3) two Fabric H diamonds (from Template 1)

Lay out the pieces, following the Block Assembly Diagram.


Block Assembly Diagram

Step 8: Sew one long edge of a Fabric I triangle to opposite sides of the Fabric A diamond, offsetting the points as illustrated. Press toward Fabric I. Repeat to make a second unit.






Step 9: Sew one long edge of a Fabric I triangle to one short edge of a Fabric J triangle, offsetting the points as illustrated. Press toward Fabric I. Repeat.





Step 10: Sew one Step 3 unit to opposite sides of a completed Step 2 unit, offsetting the points as illustrated. Press the seam away from the center diamond. Repeat to make a second unit like this.






Step 11: Repeat Steps 2-5 using the Fabric E triangles, K triangles and H diamonds.








Step 12: Arrange the four units together, following the Block Assembly Diagram, noting the fabric placement and unit orientation. Sew the units together in two rows of two, pressing the seams in opposite directions. Sew the rows together, pressing the seam open.

Repeat Steps 7-12 to make ten 14-1/2" B Blocks.



Assemble the Quilt



Step 13: Arrange the A and B Blocks together as indicated in the Quilt Assembly Diagram. Sew each row together, using sashing strips between each block. Press seams toward the sashing. Repeat to make five block rows.

Step 14: Sew each row together, using a sashing strip between each row. Press seams toward the sashing.

Step 15: Sew the 74-1/2" side outer borders to the sides of the quilt center. Press toward the borders. Sew the 69-1/2" top and bottom outer borders to the quilt center. Press toward the borders.

Your quilt top is now complete! Baste, quilt, bind and enjoy!
