Finished quilt measures: 64 " $\times 78-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$

Fabric amounts based on yardage that is 42 " wide.

- Read through all of the instructions before beginning.
- All of the seam allowances are $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ unless otherwise noted.
- Press seam allowances open unless otherwise noted.
- Width of fabric (WOF) is equal to at least 42" wide.
- Right sides together has been abbreviated to RST.
- Remember to measure twice and cut once!


## Cutting Instructions

## From Fabric A, cut:

three 6-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut:
eighteen 5-1/2" x 6-1/2" rectangles for the small heart blocks
six 4-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut:
forty-eight 4-1/2" squares for the large hearts. Mark a diagonal on the wrong side of each square.
two 8-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut:
twenty-four 3-1/2" x 8-1/2" rectangles for the large heart blocks
three $3-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF strips. Subcut:
thirty-six 3-1/2" squares for the small hearts
seven $3^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF strips. Sew together, end-to-end, then trim:
two $3^{\prime \prime} \times 74^{\prime \prime}$ side outer borders
two 3" x 64-1/2" top/bottom outer borders
twenty-four 2 " x WOF strips. Sew eight strips together, end-to-end, then trim:
five 2 " $\times 59-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ row sashing strips
Subcut the remaining strips into:
thirty-six 2" x 11-1/2" block sashing strips
ninety-six 2 " squares for the large hearts. Mark a diagonal on the wrong
side of each square.
three 1-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut:
seventy-two 1-1/2" squares for the large hearts

## From each of Fabrics B-E, cut:

one 8-1/2" x WOF strip. Subcut:
three $4-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 8-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles for the large hearts
Trim the remainder of the strip to 6-1/2" wide, then subcut:
three $3-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 6-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles for the small hearts

## From each of Fabrics $\mathrm{F}-\mathrm{K}$ and N and O , cut:

one 8-1/2" x WOF strip. Subcut:
four $4-1 / 2$ " $\times 8-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles for the large hearts
Trim the remainder of the strip to 6-1/2" wide, then subcut:
two $3-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 6-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles for the small hearts

From each of Fabrics $L$ and $M$, cut:
one 8-1/2" x WOF strip. Subcut:
two $4-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 8-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles for the large hearts
Trim the remainder of the strip to 6-1/2" wide, then subcut:
four $3-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 6-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles for the small hearts
From the Binding Fabric, cut:
eight 2-1/2" x WOF strips

## Assemble the Large Heart Blocks

## Note:

Fabrics that are directional may not end up oriented right side up in the final quilt.
If you desire for these prints to be right side up in orientation, you will need to carefully place the stitch and flip corners.

Step 1: Gather:
one $4-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 8-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric B rectangle
one $4-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 8-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric $C$ rectangle
two 4-1/2" Fabric A squares
four 2" Fabric A squares
one $3-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 8-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric A rectangle

Step 2: Place a 4-1/2" Fabric A square at the bottom of the Fabric B rectangle, as shown, ensuring that the marked diagonal is positioned correctly. Sew on the marked diagonal. Trim away the excess fabric, leaving a $1 / 4$ " seam allowance. Press.


Step 3: Using the same stitch and flip method, sew 2" Fabric A squares at the top left and top right corners of the Fabric B rectangle, as shown, ensuring that the marked diagonals are positioned correctly. Press.

Step 4: Using the same stitch and flip method, repeat Steps 2 and 3 with the Fabric C rectangle, noting that in order to create a heart, this block will be a mirror image. The 4-1/2" Fabric A square will be sewn with the diagonal placed in the opposite direction, as shown here.


Step 5: Sew the completed Step 3 and Step 4 units together. Press. Sew the $3-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 8-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric A rectangle to the bottom edge. Press. The final Large Heart Block should measure $8-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 11-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$.


Step 6: Repeat Steps 1-5 to complete a total of twenty-four Large Heart Blocks, in fabric pairings of your choosing.

## Assemble the Small Heart Blocks



Step 7: Gather:
one $3-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 6-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric J rectangle one $3-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 6-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric K rectangle
two 3-1/2" Fabric A squares
four 1-1/2" Fabric A squares
one $5-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 6-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric A rectangle
Step 8: Repeat the process in Steps 1-5, this time sewing a $5-1 / 2$ " $\times 6-1 / 2$ " rectangle to the top of each heart, to complete a total of eighteen Small Heart Blocks, in fabric pairings of your choosing. Each will measure 6-1/2" $\times 11-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$.

## Assemble the Quilt



Step 9: Arrange the Large and Small Blocks together as indicated in the Quilt Assembly Diagram. Sew each row together, using 2 " $\times 11-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric A block sashing strips between each block. Press seams toward the sashing. Repeat to make six block rows.

Step 10: Sew the row sashing and block rows together. Press seams open or to the sashing.

Step 11: Sew the side outer borders to the sides of the quilt center. Press toward the borders. Sew the top and bottom outer borders to the quilt center. Press toward the borders.

Your quilt top is complete! Baste, quilt, bind and enjoy!
