Fabric and Supplies Needed

Fabric amounts based on yardage that is 44" wide.

Notes Before You Begin

- Read through all of the instructions before beginning.
- All of the seam allowances are 1/4" unless otherwise noted.
- Press seam allowances open unless otherwise noted.
- Width of fabric (WOF) is equal to at least 44" wide.
- Right sides together has been abbreviated to RST.
- Remember to measure twice and cut once!

Cutting Instructions

From Fabric A, cut:

seventeen 8" x WOF strips. Subcut: eighty-four 8" squares

From each of Fabrics B-I, cut: three 8" x WOF strips. Subcut: eleven 8" squares


From the binding fabric, cut:


eight 2-1/2" x WOF strips

Note: This quilt uses a time saving construction method for making half square triangle blocks. You will make the units eight at a time, so do not be alarmed if the cut sizes seem too large for the final block.

Assemble the Half Square Triangle Units


Step 1: On the wrong side of each Fabric A square, mark both diagonals with a pencil.






Step 2: Place one 8" Fabric A square RST with a 8" Fabric B square. Sew 1/4" away from both sides of the two marked lines.

Step 3: Cut the square in half vertically and horizontally.




Step 4: Cut along the marked lines, creating eight half-square triangles (HSTs). Press toward the darker fabric. Trim to 3-1/2" square, if necessary.





Repeat with all remaining 7" squares, pairing each Fabric A square with Fabrics B-I.




You will have a total of eighty-eight HSTs of each color combination. Eighty-four will be used.


Assemble the Blocks

Step 5: Create an A Block by sewing:


four A/B HSTs four A/C HSTs four A/D HSTs four A/E HSTs

into four rows of four units each. Press the seams to the left in the odd numbered rows and to the right in the even numbered rows. Press the row seams open. The resulting A Block should measure 12-1/2" square. Repeat to make twenty-one A Blocks.





Step 6: Repeat Step 5 with the remaining units to make twenty-one B Blocks.




Step 7: Arrange the A and B Blocks in an alternating pattern of seven rows of six blocks each. Note the orientation and color placement in the Quilt Assembly Diagram.

Step 8: Sew the blocks together to form rows, pressing the block seams to the left in the odd numbered rows and to the right in the even numbered rows. Sew the rows together, pressing the row seams open or to one side.

Your quilt top is now complete! Baste, quilt, bind and enjoy!
