Notes Before You Begin

- Read through all of the instructions before beginning.
- All of the seam allowances are 1/4" unless otherwise noted.
- Press seam allowances open unless otherwise noted.
- Width of fabric (WOF) is equal to at least 42" wide.
- Right sides together has been abbreviated to RST.
- Remember to measure twice and cut once!

Cutting Instructions

From each of Fabrics A-D, cut:

one 7-1/4" x WOF strip. Subcut:

three 7-1/4" squares for the flying geese

Trim the remainder of the strip to 5-3/4" wide, then subcut:

three 5-3/4" squares for the HSTs

From Fabric E, cut:

one 7-1/4" x WOF strip. Subcut:

three 7-1/4" squares for the flying geese

Trim the remainder of the strip to 5-3/4" wide, then subcut:

three 5-3/4" squares for the HSTs

one 5-3/4" x WOF strip. Subcut:

one 5-3/4" square for the HSTs

Trim the remainder of the strip to 3-7/8" wide, then subcut:

four 3-7/8" squares for the flying geese

Trim the reminder of the strip to 3-1/2" wide, then subcut:

four 3-1/2" squares

one 2" x WOF strip. Subcut: one 2" x 12-1/2" strip

Trim the remainder of the strip to 1-1/2" wide, then subcut:

two 1-1/2" x 14" strips

one 1-1/2" x WOF strip. Subcut:

two 1-1/2" x 14-1/2" strip

From each of Fabrics F-J and L-R, cut:

one 5-3/4" x WOF strip. Subcut:

one 5-3/4" square for the HSTs

Trim the remainder of the strip to 3-7/8" wide, then subcut:

four 3-7/8" squares for the flying geese

Trim the reminder of the strip to 3-1/2" wide, then subcut:

four 3-1/2" squares

one 2" x WOF strip. Subcut:

one 2" x 12-1/2" strip

Trim the remainder of the strip to 1-1/2" wide, then subcut:

two 1-1/2" x 14" strips

one 1-1/2" x WOF strip. Subcut:

two 1-1/2" x 14-1/2" strips

From each of Fabrics K and S, cut:

one 5-3/4" x WOF strip. Subcut:

two 5-3/4" squares for the HSTs

one 3-7/8" x WOF strip. Subcut:

eight 3-7/8" squares for the flying geese

one 3-1/2" x WOF strip. Subcut:

eight 3-1/2" squares

one 2" x WOF strip. Subcut:

two 2" x 12-1/2" strips

four 1-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut:

four 1-1/2" x 14" strips

four 1-1/2" x 14-1/2" strips

From Fabric T, cut:

one 7-1/4" x WOF strip. Subcut:

one 7-1/4" square for the flying geese

Trim the remainder of the strip to 5-3/4" wide, then subcut:

one 5-3/4" square for the HSTs

one 5-3/4" x WOF strip. Subcut:

one 5-3/4" square for the HSTs

Trim the remainder of the strip to 3-7/8" wide, then subcut:

four 3-7/8" squares for the flying geese

one 2" x WOF strip. Subcut:

one 2" x 12-1/2" strip

Trim the remainder of the strip to 1-1/2" wide, then subcut:

two 1-1/2" x 14" strips


one 1-1/2" x WOF strip. Subcut:

two 1-1/2" x 14-1/2" strip

Assemble the Half Square Triangles (HSTs)

Step 1: Place one Fabric E square right sides together with one Fabric F. Sew around all four edges of the square, using a 1/4" seam allowance.






Step 2: Cut along both diagonals, creating four half-square triangles (HSTs). Press toward the darker fabric. Trim to 3-1/2" square.




Note: The raw edges of these HSTs will be bias edges, so take care not to stretch them.


Repeat Steps 1 and 2 with the fabric pairings shown in the Quilt Assembly Diagram to make sixteen sets of four HSTs.



Assemble the Flying Geese


Step 3: Pin two 3-7/8" Fabric F squares in opposing corners of a 7-1/4" Fabric E square, RST. The squares will overlap slightly in the center of the large square. Using a ruler, draw a diagonal line through the squares.






Step 4: Sew scant 1/4" seam on each side of the diagonal line. Set the seam by pressing it flat. Cut along the diagonal line, creating two identical units.

Step 5: Press the fabric toward smaller triangles. Repeat with the second unit.





Step 6: Place one 3-7/8" Fabric F square at the corner of sewn block unit. Draw diagonal line in pencil. Sew a scant 1/4" seam on each side of diagonal line. Set seam (press). Cut along diagonal line, creating two identical units.


Step 7: Press the seam toward smaller triangle. Trim off small dog ears left by the seam allowance. Trim to 3-1/2" x 6-1/2" if necessary. Repeat to make four flying geese blocks.



Repeat Steps 3-7 with the fabric pairings shown in the Quilt Assembly Diagram to make sixteen sets of four flying geese.



Assemble the Blocks



Step 8: Gather: four Fabric F squares four Fabric F/E HSTs four E/F flying geese units

Arrange as shown. Note the fabric placement and block orientation in the Block Assembly Diagram.

Step 9: Sew the squares to the HSTs in pairs, using the placement and orientation shown. Press the seams toward the squares.

Step 10: Sew the completed Step 9 units to a flying geese unit, as shown. Press toward the flying geese unit.


Step 11: Sew two completed Step 10 units together, as shown, creating two 6-1/2" x 12-1/2" units.





Step 12: Gather: two completed Step 11 units one 2" x 12-1/2" Fabric F strip two 1-1/2" x 14" Fabric F strips two 1-1/2" x 14-1/2" Fabric F strips

Arrange as shown, following the Block Assembly Diagram. Sew the 2" x 12" Fabric F strip to the pieced units, pressing the seams toward the Fabric F strip.




Sew the 1-1/2" x 14" Fabric F strip to the left and right sides of the block, pressing the seams toward the Fabric F strips. Sew the 1-1/2" x 14-1/2" Fabric F strip to the top and bottom of the block, pressing the seams toward the Fabric F strips.

The resulting block should measure 14-1/2" x 16-1/2".

Repeat Steps 8-12 with the fabric pairings shown in the Quilt Assembly Diagram to make the remaining fifteen Blocks.

Assemble the Quilt



Step 13: Arrange the blocks into four rows of four blocks. Note the fabric placement and block orientation in the Quilt Assembly Diagram.

Step 14: Sew the blocks together to form rows. Press the rows to the left in the odd numbered rows and to the right in the even numbered rows.

Step 15: Sew the rows together to form the quilt center. Press the row seams open.

Your quilt top is complete! Baste, quilt, bind and enjoy!

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
