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Fabric amounts based on yardage that is 42" wide.

### Notes Before You Begin

- Read through all of the instructions before beginning.
- All of the seam allowances are 1/4" unless otherwise noted.
- Press seam allowances open unless otherwise noted.
- Width of fabric (WOF) is equal to at least 42" wide.
- Right sides together has been abbreviated to RST.
- Remember to measure twice and cut once!

#### From Fabric A, fussy cut:

one 34-1/2" x 40-1/2" center panel

#### From Fabric B, cut:

two 1-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut: two 1-1/2" x 40-1/2" strips eight 2-1/2" x WOF strips. Sew together, end-to-end, then trim: four 2-1/2" x 48-1/2" top/bottom middle border strips two 2-1/2" x 56-1/2" side middle border strips

#### From Fabric C, cut:

six 2-7/8" x WOF strips. Subcut: eighty-four 2-7/8" squares for the flying geese

#### From Fabric D, cut:

one 5-1/4" x WOF strip. Subcut: two 5-1/4" squares for the flying geese

#### From each of Fabrics E and F, cut:

one 5-1/4" x WOF strip. Subcut: four 5-1/4" squares for the flying geese

#### From Fabric G, cut:

one 5-1/4" x WOF strip. Subcut: six 5-1/4" squares for the flying geese

#### From Fabric H, cut:

one 5-1/4" x WOF strip. Subcut: five 5-1/4" squares for the flying geese

#### From Fabric I, cut:

three 4-1/2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together, end to end, then cut: two 4-1/2" x 48-1/2" strips four 4-1/2" squares
From the remainder of the fabric, cut: four 2-1/2" squares

#### From Fabric J, cut:

six 4-1/2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together, end to end, then cut: two 4-1/2" x 52-1/2" top/bottom outer borders two 4-1/2" x 60-1/2" side outer borders


#### From the Binding Fabric, cut:

seven 2-1/2" x WOF strips

## Assemble the Flying Geese Units

**Step 1:** Pin two 2-7/8" Fabric C squares in opposing corners of a 5-1/4" Fabric D square, RST. The squares will overlap slightly in the center of the large square. Using a ruler, draw a diagonal line through the squares.

**Step 2:** Sew scant 1/4" seam on each side of the diagonal line. Set the seam by pressing it flat. Cut along the diagonal line, creating two identical units.





**Step 3:** Press the fabric toward smaller triangles. Repeat with the second unit.

**Step 4:** Place one 2-7/8" Fabric C square at the corner of sewn block unit. Draw diagonal line in pencil. Sew a scant 1/4" seam on each side of diagonal line. Set seam (press). Cut along diagonal line.





**Step 5:** Press the seam toward smaller triangle. Trim off small dog ears left by the seam allowance. Trim to 2-1/2" x 4-1/2" if necessary. Repeat to make four flying geese blocks from Fabric D.

Step 6: Repeat with all remaining 2-7/8" Fabric C squares and 5-1/2" squares to make a total of:



sixteen Fabric E flying geese



sixteen Fabric F flying geese



twenty-four Fabric G flying geese



twenty Fabric H flying geese

**Step 7:** Arrange flying geese units from Fabrics D-H, as shown, to make the side pieced border. Note the fabric placement and orientation of the flying geese. Sew together along the long edges of the units and press the seams to one side. Repeat to make the second side pieced border.



**Step 8:** Arrange flying geese units from Fabrics D-H, as shown, to make the top pieced border. Note the fabric placement and orientation of the flying geese. Sew together along the long edges of the units and press the seams to one side. Repeat to make the bottom pieced border.



## Assemble the Quilt

**Step 9:** Sew the 1-1/2" x 40-1/2" Fabric B strips to the top and bottom of the Fabric A panel. Press.

**Step 10:** Sew the side pieced borders from Step 7 to the side edges of the quilt center. Press. Sew the top/bottom pieced borders from Step 8 to the top and bottom edges of the quilt center. Press.

**Step 11:** Sew the 2-1/2" x 48-1/2" Fabric B strips to the top and bottom of the quilt center. Press.

**Step 12:** Sew the 4-1/2" x 48-1/2" Fabric I strips to the top and bottom of the quilt center. Press.

**Step 13:** Sew the 2-1/2" x 48-1/2" Fabric B strips to the top and bottom of the quilt center. Press.

**Step 14:** Sew a 2-1/2" Fabric I square to each end of the 2-1/2" x 56-1/2" Fabric B strips. Press. Sew to the left and right edges of the quilt center. Press.



**Step 15:** Sew the 5-1/2" x 52-1/2" Fabric J strips to the top and bottom of the quilt center. Press.

**Step 16:** Sew a 4-1/2" Fabric I square to each end of the 4-1/2" x 60-1/2" Fabric J strips. Press. Sew to the left and right edges of the quilt center. Press.

Your quilt top is complete. Baste, quilt, bind and enjoy!

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
