It's a Boy's Life Beanbag Lounger

Please read all instructions before starting. Assemble the chair using 1" seam allowances.

You will Need:

6 Yards of ABT 9138-13 for the Bean Bag Chair

NOTE: If you choose to use non-directional fabrics, you will only need 4 yards of fabric.

20" nylon Zipper

Bean Bag Filling

Optional: For added strength, make a muslin inner bag. You would need four yards of muslin and a second 20" zipper. Follow the steps below to make the lining bag along with the outside bag. Insert the completed lining bag inside the completed outside bag. Fill the inner bag with the bean bag pellets and close then zip the outer bag close.

Cutting:

Cut four 21" x 42" side panels, one 24-1/2" circle and one 11-1/2" circle.

Assembly Directions:

- 1) Take one side panel and measure over 10-1/2" along the 21" side to mark the center point (fig. 1). From the center point measure and mark 5-3/4" on each side of the center point (fig. 2). Draw a line from each 5-3/4" mark down to the bottom corners (fig. 3). Cut on the drawn lines to make one side panel. Repeat to make four side panels.
- 2) Enlarge the circle templates 400% to make one 24-1/2" circle and one 11-1/2" circle. Cut out one of each circle from the fabric. The 24-1/2" circle is the bottom panel and the 11-1/2" circle is the top panel.
- 3) Following the manufacturer's instructions, sew the zipper down the center of the 24-1/2" bottom circle. Unzip the zipper about 4" for turning the bag after assembly.
- 4) Align one side panel on top of a second side panel, right side together (Fig. 3). Using a 1" seam allowance, sew the two side panels together. Repeat to sew all four side panels together and create a fabric tube. Double stitch each seam for extra strength.
- 5) Position and pin the bottom panel in place on the wide end of the fabric tube. If you have extra fabric from the side panels. Carefully and evenly create pleats and pin them. Using a 1" seam allowance, sew the bottom panel in place using a double row of stitching for extra strength.
- 6) Position and pin the top panel in place on the narrow end of the fabric tube. If you have extra fabric from the side panels. Carefully and evenly create pleats and pin them. Using a 1" seam allowance, sew the bottom panel in place using a double row of stitching for extra strength.
- 7) Turn the completed bag right side out through the zipper opening.
- 8) Fill with bean bag pellets until it looks comfortable and zip close.

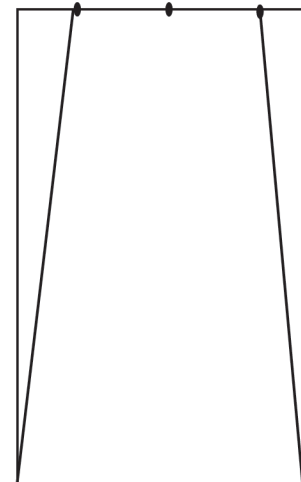
