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Out Like a Log Pillowcase

Designed by Gayle Camargo for Robert Kaufman Fabrics, finished size: 26" x 20"

Fabric Requirements:

Color Option A

ABT-7825-9 Navy

ABT-7850-200 Vintage

ABT-7830-3 Red

Color Option B

ABT-7830-14 Natural

ABT-7825-49 Olive

*not included

Yardage

3/8 yard (contrasting band)

3/4 yard (pillowcase body)

1/8 yard (optional flange)

Glossary:

RST: Right sides together

WST: Wrong sides together

WOF: Width of fabric (40 1/2")

All seams are sewn with 1/2" seam allowance or serged with two needles, four threads.

Cut body of pillow case to measure 26 1/2" x 40 1/2".

Fold in half RST and stitch across one short end and down long side. (Fig. 1)

Cut band fabric 10 1/2" x 40 1/2".

Fold in half RST and stitch 10 1/2" edges together forming tube. (Fig. 2)

Press seam to one side. Fold in half lengthwise, WST and press. (Fig. 3)

Put band inside pillowcase RST matching all three raw edges and side seams. Pin in place. Stitch 1/2" (or serge) from raw edges, removing pins as you stitch. (Fig. 6)

Turn pillow case right side out. Press seam towards pillowcase and topstitch 1/4" from seamed edge.

Optional color strip or flange: cut fabric to 3" x 40 1/2".

Fold in half WOF, sew 3" edges to form tube. (Fig. 4)

Fold in half lengthwise matching raw edges and press (1 1/2" when pressed). (Fig. 5)

Match raw edges of strip to right side of pillowcase body and baste 1/8" from raw edges. (Fig. 6)

Layer raw edges of band fabric on top and stitch 1/2" from edge through all five layers.

Turn pillow case right side out.

Press seam toward pillowcase and topstitch on pillowcase body 1/4" from seam.

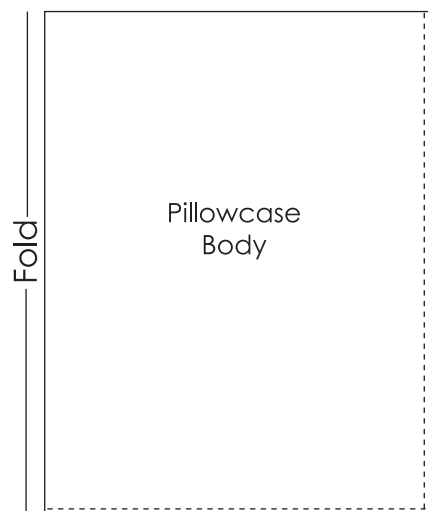

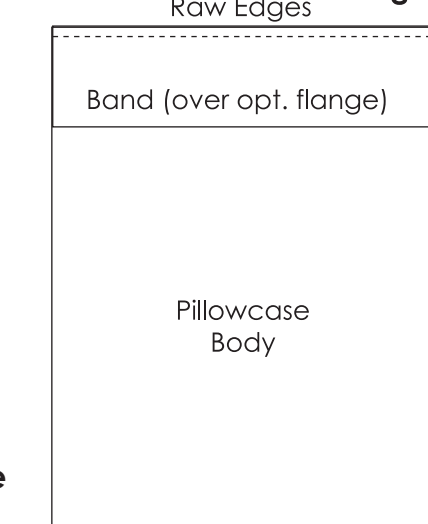
