
# **ABC 123 BLOCKS**

# Fabric and Supplies Needed

Fabric amounts based on yardage that is 42" wide.


## Notes Before You Begin

- Read through all of the instructions before beginning.
- All of the seam allowances are 1/4" unless otherwise noted.
- Press seam allowances open unless otherwise noted.
- Width of fabric (WOF) is equal to at least 42" wide.
- Right sides together has been abbreviated to RST.
- Remember to measure twice and cut once!

### **Cutting Instructions**

#### From Fabric A and the Fusible webbing:

Trace each letter and number five times on the paper side of the fusible webbing. Cut out each letter and number, approximately 1/4" from the marked lines of the letter. Fuse to the wrong side of Fabric A, following the manufacturer's instructions. Then cut out each letter or number on the marked line.




#### From each of Fabrics B-G, cut:

one 4-1/2" x WOF strip. Subcut: five 4-1/2" squares

#### Assemble the Block Faces

**Step 1:** Peel the paper backing from one letter 'A' and center it on one square from Fabric B. Fuse following the manufacturer's instructions.

**Step 2:** Repeat Step 1, fusing each letter to one square. You may assign a specific letter/number to a certain print, or mix and match for variety. Edgestitch around each letter, if desired.




#### Assemble the Blocks

Step 3: Make five stacks, each with an A, B, C, 1, 2 and 3. Each stack will create one block.

**Step 4:** Working with squares from one stack only, sew four squares together to form one row. Use any squares and turn the letters/numbers in any direction. Press the seams open.




**Step 5:** Sew the two short ends together, right sides together, to form a loop. Press the seam open.




**Step 6:** Using the square marking template, mark the four points in the corners of the two remaining squares. Mark on the wrong side of the square. These marks will indicate the starting and stopping points for the stitches in the next steps.




**Step 7:** With the completed Step 5 unit wrong side out, pin one of the remaining squares to one unfinished edge. The marked points from Step 6 should hit at two seams of the Step 5 unit. Pin and sew one edge at a time.



**Step 8:** Sew, starting at stopping at each of the marked points. Continue sewing around all four sides until the square has been sewn to the Step 5 unit.



**Step 9:** Repeat Steps 7 and 8 with the remaining square and the open side of the block unit. Leave a small opening in the center of one edge of the square for turning and stuffing.



**Step 10:** Turn the block right side out, using a turning tool or chopstick to push out the corners. Stuff with stuffing, then hand stitch the opening closed.


Repeat to make the remaining blocks. Your block set is complete! Play and enjoy!
