Fabric A	AJHM 11162-163	AJHM 11162-191	1/2 yard
Fabric B	EKJM 11158-199	EKJM 11158-133	2/3 yard
Fabric C	ETJ 11163-16	ETJ 11163-179	2 yards
Fabric D	ETJM 11157-49	ETJM 11157-163	5/8 yard
Fabric E*	ETJM 11159-199	ETJM 11159-191	1 yard
Fabric F	ETJM 11160-199	ETJM 11160-191	2-1/4 yards
Fabric G	ETJM 11161-199	ETJM 11161-191	1-1/4 yards
Fabric H	AMD-9438-138	AMD-9438-138	1/4 yard
Backing	ETJM 1161-199	ETMM 11161-191	5 yards

Cut the backing in half and sew together selvedge to selvedge to make the backing.

Cutting Instructions

Fabric A

Cut (1) 12-1/2" square and (4) 4-3/4" squares

Fabric B

Cut (1) 4-7/8" x wof strip, recut into (2) 4-7/8" squares, then cut each square in half on the diagonal once to make (4) half square triangles; trim remainder of the strip to 2-7/8"; and cut (6) 2-7/8" squares, cut each square in half on the diagonal once to make (12) half square triangles

Cut (5) 3-1/2" x wof strips, sew together end-to-end and recut into (4) 3-1/2" x 50-1/2" strips for border #5

Fabric C

Cut (2) 2-7/8" x wof strips, recut into (20) 2-7/8" squares, then cut each square in half on the diagonal once to make (40) half square triangles

Cut (1) 4-7/8" x wof strip, recut into (10) 4-78" squares, then cut each square in half on the diagonal once to make (20) half square triangles

Cut (4) 3-1/2" x wof strips, recut into (48) 3-1/2" squares

Cut (3) 3-1/2" x wof strips, recut into (16) 3-1/2" x 6-1/2" rectangles

Cut (4) 1" x wof strips, recut into (2) 1" x 33-1/2" top/bottom borders and (2) 1" x 32-1/2" side borders for border #1

Cut (6) 1-1/2" x wof strips, recut into (2) 1-1/2" x 56-1/2" strips for side border strips and (2) 1-1/2" x 52-1/2" top/bottom strips for border #6

Fabric D

Cut (1) 6-1/2" x wof strip, recut into (4) 6-1/2" squares

Cut (4) 2" x wof strips, recut into (2) 2" x 36-1/2" top/bottom strips and (2) 2" x 33-1/2" side border strips for border #2

Cut (5) 1-1/2" x wof strips, sew together end-to-end and recut into (2) 1-1/2" x 48-1/2" side borders and (2) 1-1/2" x 44-1/2" top/bottom strips for border #4

Fabric E

Cut (1) 8-7/8" x wof strip, recut into (4) 8-7/8" squares, then cut each square in half on the diagonal once to make (8) half square triangles

Cut (8) 2-1/4" x wof strips, sew together end-to-end for binding

Fabric F

Cut (8) 8-1/2" x wof strips, sew together in sets of two, matching stripe fabric pattern for border #7

Fabric G

Cut (1) 8-7/8" x wof strip, recut into (2) 8-7/8" squares, then cut each square in half on the diagonal once to make (4) half square triangles

Cut (2) 6-1/2" x wof strips, recut into (12) 6-1/2" squares

Cut (3) 3-1/2" x wof strips, recut into (32) 3-1/2" squares

Fabric H


Cut (2) 2-7/8" x wof strips, recut into (18) 2-7/8" squares, then cut each square in half on the diagonal once to make (36) half square triangles

Making the Quilt Center

Note: The quilt center is sewn together in units. Refer to the quilt center diagram to sew the units and then assemble them in the following order:

- 1. Position a 8-1/2" square in one corner of a 12-1/2" fabric A square. Sew in a diagonal line, trim excess fabric and fold out resulting triangle. Press seam. Repeat in each corner of the fabric A square.
- 2. Sew a 4-78" fabric C triangle to (2) adjacent sides of a 4-3/4" fabric A square. Press seams. Make 4.
- 3. Sew (8) 2-7/8" fabric H triangles to (8) 2-7/8" fabric C triangles. Referring to the diagram, sew a fabric B triangle to a fabric C triangle as shown. Make 4 and 4 in reverse.
- 4. Sew a unit to opposite sides of two of the C/A units, watching orientation of triangles. Sew these units to opposite sides of the center A/D unit made in step 1. Press seams.
- 5. Sew a fabric B triangle to the opposite side of the fabric C triangles on the remaining 4 units, then sew these larger triangle units to the remaining C/A units. Sew these units to opposite sides of the center unit made in step 4.
- 6. Sew (7) 2-7/8" fabric H triangles and (6) 2-7/8" fabric C triangles into a strip. Press seams. Make 4. Sew these strips to each side of the quilt center. Sew (8) remaining fabric C 2-7/8" triangles togeher in sets of two to make (4) larger triangles. Sew these to each corner.
- 7. Using (3) 4-7/8" fabric C triangles, sew one to each side of (1) 4-7/8" fabric B triangle to make a large triangle unit. Make 4 units. Sew a 8-7/8" fabric G triangle to the long side of these units to make a square. Press seams. Sew a 8-7/8" fabric E triangle to each side of the unit to complete the large triangular corner units. Press seams.
- 8. Sew the units made in step 7 to each side of the quilt center. Press seams.
- 9. Adding the Borders: Sew fabric C border #1 strips to the sides of the quilt center then to the top and bottom of the quilt center.
- 10. Add border #2 in the same manner as border #1.
- 11. Place a 3-1/2" fabric C square in one corner of a 6-1/2" fabric G square. Sew in a diagonal line from corner to corner. Trim away excess fabric, fold out resulting triangle and press seam. Repeat in each corner of the square to make a square-in-a-square block. Make 12.
- 12. Sew six blocks together in a strip to make a border #3 row. Make 2 rows. Sew these rows to the top and bottom of the quilt.
- 13. Sew a 3-1/2" fabric G square in one corner of a 3-1/2" x 6-1/2" fabric C rectangle. Sew in a diagonal line from corner to corner. Trim excess fabric, fold out resulting triangle and press. Repeat in the opposite corner to make a flying geese unit. Make 16 units.
- 14. Sew (8) flying geese units together in a row. Make (2) rows. Sew these rows to opposite sides of the quilt top to complete the addition of border #3.
- 15. Sew Borders #4, #5 and #6 to the guilt top in the same manner as borders #1 and #2.
- 16. Center and sew borders #7 to each side of the quilt top, stopping 1/4" from the end of border #6. There will be excess fabric extending over the end of each side of the quilt. Miter the corners and trim away excess fabric. Press seams.
- 17. Layer the quilt top, batting and backing. Quilt the layers together. Bind the edges to complete the quilt.
