

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Notes Before You Begin

- Read through all of the instructions before beginning.
- All of the seam allowances are 1/4" unless otherwise noted.
- Press seam allowances open unless otherwise noted.
- Width of fabric (WOF) is equal to at least 42" wide.
- Right sides together has been abbreviated to RST.
- Remember to measure twice and cut once!

Cutting Instructions

From each of Fabrics A, B, E, F and K-N, cut:

two 2-3/4" x WOF strips. Subcut: twelve 2-3/4" x 4-3/4" rectangles

From each of Fabrics C and D, cut:

two 2-3/4" x WOF strips. Subcut: sixteen 2-3/4" x 4-3/4" rectangles

From each of Fabrics G-J, cut:

one 2-3/4" x WOF strip. Subcut: eight 2-3/4" x 4-3/4" rectangles

From the Binding Fabric, cut:

five 2-1/2" x WOF strips

Assemble the Blocks




Step 1: Gather four Fabric A rectangles and four Fabric B rectangles. Arrange in four rows of two rectangles, as shown in the Block Assembly Diagram. Sew the rectangles together to form rows, pressing the seam toward the darker fabric.


Step 2: Sew the rows together to form the block, pressing the row seams open or to one side.

Step 3: Repeat to make a total of three blocks using Fabrics A and B.


Step 4: Repeat Steps 1 and 2 to make the following block quantities for a total of twenty blocks:




Fabrics C and D, Make four



Fabrics E and F, Make three



Fabrics G and H, Make two




Fabrics I and J, Make two



Fabrics K and L, Make three



Fabrics M and N, Make three



Step 5: Arrange the blocks into five rows of four blocks. Note the fabric placement and block orientation in the Quilt Assembly Diagram.

Step 6: Sew the blocks together to form rows. Press the rows to the left in the odd numbered rows and to the right in the even numbered rows.

Step 7: Sew the rows together to form the quilt center. Press the row seams open.

Your quilt top is now complete! Baste, quilt, bind and enjoy!

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
