

## Fabric and Supplies Needed

Fabric amounts based on yardage that is 42" wide.

Color	Fabric	Yardage
	A	Makes one scarf 1-1/4 yard

## Notes Before You Begin

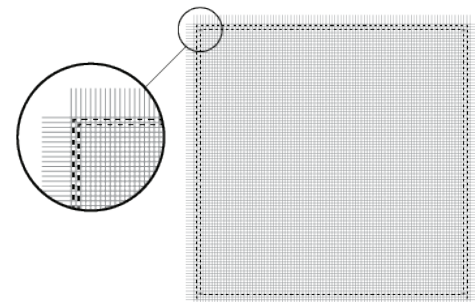
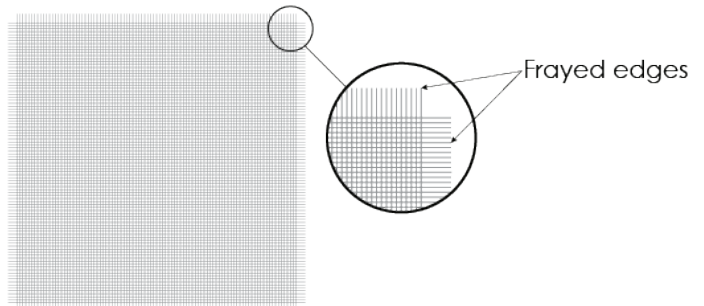
- Read through all of the instructions before beginning.
- All of the seam allowances are 1/4" unless otherwise noted.
- Press seam allowances open unless otherwise noted.
- Width of fabric (WOF) is equal to at least 42" wide.
- Right sides together has been abbreviated to RST.
- Remember to measure twice and cut once!

## Cutting Instructions

**From Fabric A, cut:**  
one 40" square

## Assemble the Scarf

**Step 1:** From each side, pull fabric threads to create frayed edges. Tip: Use a seam ripper (optional) to get the first few strands started. Then pull a few threads from each side, working your way around all edges.



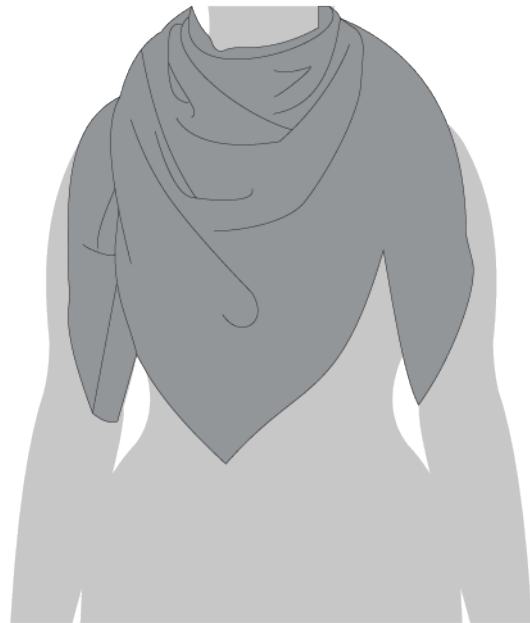
**Step 2:** Continue pulling threads until frayed strands measure 1" to 1-1/2" in length. Using 2.0mm stitch, sew around scarf edges just inside frayed edge at least twice. Note: Either match your thread or go for contrast. Your stitching can be decorative or neutral.

**Step 3:** Trim frayed edges to the same width if desired.

Your scarf is complete!
