## Notes Before You Begin

- Please read through all of the instructions before beginning.
- All of the seam allowances are $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ unless otherwise noted.
- Width of fabric (WOF) is equal to at least 42" wide.
- Press all seam allowances open after each seam is sewn, unless otherwise noted.
- Remember to measure twice and cut once!


## Cutting Instructions

## Fabric A, B, G and H

- Cut two rectangles $10-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 12-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$.


## Fabric C, D, E and F

- Cut two rectangles $10-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 12-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$.


## Fabric I

- Cut six strips 6-1/2" x WOF.


## Fabric J

- Cut six strips 1" x 5".
- Cut six strips 1" $\times 4$ ".
- Cut four strips 2" x 12-1/2".
- Cut four strips 1-1/2" x 12-1/2".


## Fabric K and L

- Cut four strips 1" x 5".
- Cut four strips 1" $\times 4$ ".
- Cut two strips 2" $\times 12-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$.
- Cut two strips 1-1/2" $\times 12-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$.


## Fabric M

- Cut four strips 1" x 5".
- Cut four strips 1" $\times 4$ ".
- Cut four strips 2" x 12-1/2".
- Cut four strips 1-1/2" x 12-1/2".


## Fabric N

- Cut two strips 1" x 5".
- Cut two strips 1 " $\times 4$ ".
- Cut four strips 2" x 12-1/2".
- Cut four strips 1-1/2" x 12-1/2".


## Fabric O and P

- Cut two strips 3-1/2" x WOF, then subcut into twenty squares 3-1/2" $\times 3-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$.
- Cut two strips 1 " $\times 5$ ".
- Cut two strips 1" $\times 4$ ".
- Cut four strips 2" $\times 12-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$.
- Cut four strips $1-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 12-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$.


## Step 1: Assemble the Blocks

- Sew a Fabric L 1-1/2" x 12-1/2" strip to either side of a Fabric H rectangle.
- Sew a Fabric L 2" x 12-1/2" strip to the top and bottom of the Fabric H rectangle.
- Repeat to make twelve blocks, using the Fabric A-F rectangles and the Fabric J-P 12-1/2" strips.
 You may follow the quilt image on page 1 as a guide for color placement, or match the fabrics up as you like.


## Step 2: Attach Appliqué "Tape"

- Place two fabric J-P 1 " $\times 4$ " and two 1 " $\times 5$ 5" strips on a Step 1 block, as pictured. You may follow the quilt image for color placement, or match up the fabrics as you like. Be sure to leave a $1 / 4$ " seam allowance at the edge of the block.
- Lightly affix the strips to the block using a glue stick and then topstitch or zig-zag the strips to the block.
- Repeat for all twelve blocks.


As an alternative, you can add the "Tape" after quilting the quilt top. This will make them pop out more from the rest of the quilt.

## Step 3: Make the Inner Borders

- Sew ten Fabric O and ten fabric P 3-1/2" squares together, beginning with Fabric P and alternating colors.
- Repeat to make a second identical border.

## Step 4: Assemble the Quilt Top

- Sew the blocks from Step 1 into four rows of three blocks each and then sew the rows together, matching seams.
- Sew the Inner Borders from Step 2 to the left and right sides of the Center Unit, as pictured.
- Sew a Fabric $16-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF strip to the top and bottom of the Center Unit. Trim excess fabric from the ends of the strips.
- Sew two Fabric l 6-1/2" x WOF strips short ends together and sew to the left side of the Center Unit. Repeat for the right side with the two remaining Fabric I strips. Trim excess fabric from the ends of the strips.


Your quilt top is complete.
