

Fabric and Supplies Needed

Fabric amounts based on yardage that is 42" wide.

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Notes Before You Begin

- Read through all of the instructions before beginning.
- All of the seam allowances are 1/4" unless otherwise noted.
- Press seam allowances open unless otherwise noted.
- Width of fabric (WOF) is equal to at least 42" wide.
- Length of fabric has been abbreviated to LOF.
- Right sides together has been abbreviated to RST.
- Remember to measure twice and cut once!

Cutting Instructions

From Fabric A, cut:

three 9-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut: twelve 9-1/2" squares.

From Fabric B, cut:

three 3-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut one strip in half to yield: two 3-1/2" x 21" strips.

From Fabric C, cut:

two 3-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut: one strip in half to yield two 3-1/2" x 21" strips.

From Fabric D, cut:

two 9-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut:

six 9-1/2" squares.

Subcut five squares once on the diagonal to yield ten large setting triangles. Subcut one square twice on the diagonal to yield four small setting triangles.

From Fabric E, cut:


four 9" x LOF strips. Cut at the same point in the fabric's repeat for each strip.

From the Binding Fabric, cut:


seven 2-1/2" x WOF strips.

Assemble the Nine-Patches

Step 1: Sew a Fabric B strip to either long edge of a Fabric C strip. Press towards Fabric B. Subcut the strip set into a total of twelve 3-1/2" x 9-1/2" units.




Step 2: Sew a 21" Fabric C strip to either long edge of a Fabric B strip. Press towards Fabric B. Subcut the strip set into a total of six 3-1/2" x 9-1/2" units.




Step 3: Sew two Step 1 units to the long edges of one Step 2 unit. Press. Repeat to make six nine-patches.





Step 4: Arrange the Fabric A squares, nine-patches, and setting triangles in diagonal rows as indicated in the Quilt Assembly Diagram. Sew each row together. Press towards the Fabric A squares.



Step 5: Measure 50-1/2" from the top of your quilt and trim along the bottom edge.

Add the Border


Step 6: Center and pin one side border to the quilt top. Sew the border, starting and stopping 1/4" from each end of the quilt top.

Repeat with the remaining side border. Repeat with the top and bottom borders. Note: borders will extend beyond the quilts' edge.




Step 7: Fold the quilt diagonally, right sides together and align two of the borders directly on top of each other.

Use your ruler to draw a line from the corner of the quilt to the edge of the border.



Step 8: Sew along this marked line, beginning at the point where your border stitch had ended and sew to the edge of the border. Check to be sure the mitered border presses flat from the front, then trim 1/4" away form the marked line, removing the excess border length.

Your quilt top is complete! Baste, quilt, bind and enjoy!



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
