#### Notes Before You Begin

- Read through all of the instructions before beginning.
- All of the seam allowances are 1/4" unless otherwise noted.
- Press seam allowances open unless otherwise noted.
- Width of fabric (WOF) is equal to at least 42" wide.
- Right sides together has been abbreviated to RST.
- Remember to measure twice and cut once!

#### **Cutting Instructions**

#### From Fabric A, cut:

four 3-1/4" x WOF strips. Subcut:

forty 3-1/4" squares. Cut each square in half along both diagonals for the Half-QSTs. fifteen 3" x WOF strips. Subcut:

two hundred 3" squares for the HSTs

five 2-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut:

eighty 2-1/2" squares

ten 1-1/2" x WOF strips. Sew together, end-to-end, then cut: fifteen 1-1/2" x 12-1/2" block sashing strips four 1-1/2" x 51-1/2" row sashing strips

## From each of Fabrics B, C and E, cut:

one 4-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut: five 4-1/2" squares

#### From Fabric D, cut:

one 4-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut: five 4-1/2" squares seven 4" x WOF strips. Sew together, end-to-end, then cut: two 4" x 61-1/2" top/bottom outer borders two 4" x 67-1/2" top/bottom outer borders

#### From each of Fabrics F, G, H and I, cut:

two 2-7/8" x WOF strips. Subcut: twenty 2-7/8" squares. Cut each square in half along one diagonal for the Half-QSTs.

#### From each of Fabrics J, K and M, cut:

one 3-1/4" x WOF strip. Subcut: ten 3-1/4" squares. Cut each square in half along both diagonals for the Half-QSTs.

#### From Fabric L, cut:

one 3-1/4" x WOF strip. Subcut:

ten 3-1/4" squares. Cut each square in half along both diagonals for the Half-QSTs. six 2" x WOF strips. Sew together, end-to-end, then cut:

two 2" x 54-1/2" top/bottom inner borders two 2" x 64-1/2" top/bottom inner borders

#### From each of Fabrics N, O, P and Q, cut:

two 3" x WOF strips. Subcut: twenty 3" squares for the HSTs

#### From Fabric R, cut:

nine 3" x WOF strips. Subcut: one hundred twenty 3" squares for the HSTs

#### From the Binding Fabric, cut:

seven 2-1/2" x WOF strips

Assemble the Half-Square Triangles (HSTs)

**Step 1:** Pair a 3" Fabric A square with a 3" Fabric N square, RST. Mark a diagonal line on the wrong side of one square. Sew 1/4" away from both sides of the marked line. Cut on the marked line, creating two half-square triangles (HSTs). Press toward the darker fabric. Trim to 2-1/2" square. Repeat to make forty A/N HSTs.



Step 2: Repeat Step 1 to make:



forty A/O HSTs



forty A/P HSTs

Assemble the Half Quarter-Square Triangles (Half-QSTs)

**Step 3:** Arrange one Fabric A small triangle and one Fabric J small triangle to form a pair, taking care to orient the fabric as shown in the example here. Sew together and press toward the darker fabric.

**Step 4:** Sew one Fabric F large triangle the long edge of the pair from the previous step. Press toward the large triangle. Trim to 2-1/2" square. Repeat to make twenty units in this orientation.

**Step 5:** Repeat Steps 3 and 4 to make twenty additional Fabric A/J/F units, noting the difference in the orientation and fabric placement.

Step 6: Repeat Steps 3 and 4 to make:

twenty Fabric A/H/L units

twenty Fabric A/K/G units

twenty Fabric A/H/L units, noting the difference in the orientation

twenty Fabric A/K/G units,

noting the difference in

### Assemble the Blocks



**Step 7:** Gather: twelve A/R HSTs eight A/N HSTs eight A/J/F Half-QSTs, four of each orientation four Fabric A squares one large Fabric B square

Arrange the units as shown. Note the fabric placement and block orientation in the Block Assembly Diagram.

**Step 8:** Sew the units to the left and right of the center square together to form a two by two unit. Press. Sew to opposite sides of the center square. Press the seams to the left.



**Step 9:** Sew the remaining units to together to form the rows. Press the seams to the left in the first and last row. Press the seams in the remaining two rows to the right.

**Step 10:** Sew the rows together, nesting the seams and pressing the seams to one side to form the block.



The Block should measure 12-1/2" square. Repeat to make five Blocks with a Fabric B center.

**Step 11:** Repeat Steps 7-10 using the fabrics shown here to make:



five Blocks with a Fabric C center



five Blocks with a Fabric D center

Assemble the Quilt



five Blocks with a Fabric E center

**Step 12:** Arrange the Blocks together in five rows of four, as indicated in the Quilt Assembly Diagram. Sew each row together, using sashing strips between each block. Press seams toward the sashing.

**Step 13:** Sew the sashing and block rows together. Press seams open or to the sashing.

**Step 14:** Sew the side inner borders to the sides of the quilt center. Press toward the borders. Sew the top and bottom inner borders to the quilt center. Press toward the borders.

**Step 15:** Sew the side outer borders to the sides of the quilt center. Press toward the borders. Sew the top and bottom outer borders to the quilt center. Press toward the borders.

Your quilt top is complete! Baste, quilt, bind and enjoy!

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
