

Fabric and Supplies Needed

Fabric amounts based on yardage that is 40" wide.

Pattern Notes

- Read through all of the instructions before beginning.
- All of the seam allowances are 1/4" unless otherwise noted.
- Press seam allowances open unless otherwise noted.
- Width of fabric (WOF) is equal to at least 40" wide.
- Right sides together has been abbreviated to RST.
- Remember to measure twice and cut once!

Cutting Instructions

From Fabric A. cut:

two 4" x WOF strips. Subcut: sixteen 4" squares

three 3-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut:

thirty-two 2" x 3-1/2" rectangles

eight 3-1/2" squares

ten 2" x WOF strips. Subcut:

twelve 2" x 9-1/2" vertical sashing strips

five 2" x 41" horizontal sashing strips

two 2" x 44" vertical borders (The WOF is slightly less than 42". You'll need to add a few inches to each vertical border with some scraps from other 2" strips)

From Fabric B, cut:

two 4" x WOF strips. Subcut:
sixteen 4" squares
three 3-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut:
thirty-two 2" x 3-1/2" rectangles
eight 3-1/2" squares
five 2-1/2" x WOF strips for the binding

From Fabric C, cut:

four 4" x WOF strips. Subcut:

thirty-two 4" squares

From the remainder of the final strip, cut: sixteen 2" x 3-1/2" rectangles.


three 3-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut:

forty-eight 2" x 3-1/2" rectangles (for a total of sixty-four)

Assemble the Block Units


Step 1: To make the Churn Dash Blocks, pair a 4" Fabric A or B square with a 4" Fabric C square. Mark a diagonal line on the wrong side of the Fabric C squares. Sew 1/4" from both sides of the marked line. Cut along the marked line, creating two half-square triangles (HSTs) from each pair. Repeat to make thirty-two of each type of HST (thirty-two A/C, and thirty-two B/C), trim to 3-1/2" square. Press toward Fabric C.





Step 2: Pair a 2" x 3-1/2" Fabric A or B rectangle with a 2" x 3-1/2" Fabric C rectangle. Sew together along the longest side, creating a 3-1/2" square. Press toward Fabric C. Repeat to make thirty-two A/C sets and thirty-two B/C sets.





Assemble the A Blocks




Step 3: Arrange nine block units as illustrated to make the churn dash block. Sew together in three rows of three units each. Press seams to the left in the top and bottom rows and to the right in the center rows. Press row seams open. Repeat to make eight 9-1/2" x 9-1/2" A Blocks.

Assemble the B Blocks



Step 4: Arrange nine block units as illustrated to make the churn dash block. Sew together in three rows of three units each. Press seams to the left in the top and bottom rows and to the right in the center rows. Press row seams open. Repeat to make eight 9-1/2" x 9-1/2" B Blocks.

Assemble the Quilt



- **Step 5:** Sew the blocks of the quilt together to form rows, alternating the A or B blocks to match the illustration and sewing 2" x 9-1/2" vertical sashing strips between the blocks. Press seams toward the sashing.
- **Step 6:** Sew the rows together adding 2" x 41" horizontal sashing between each row and on the top and bottom of the quilt. Press toward the sashing.
- **Step 7:** Sew the vertical border pieces to either side of the quilt top. Press the seam toward the vertical sashing.

Your quilt top is now complete! Baste, quilt, bind and enjoy!
