Fabric and Supplies Needed

Notes Before You Begin

- Read through all of the instructions before beginning.
- All of the seam allowances are 1/4" unless otherwise noted.
- Press seam allowances open unless otherwise noted.
- Width of fabric (WOF) is equal to at least 42" wide.
- Right sides together has been abbreviated to RST.
- Remember to measure twice and cut once!

Cutting Instructions

From Fabric A, Cut:

twelve 2-7/8" x WOF strips. Subcut: one hundred sixty-eight 2-7/8" x 2-7/8" squares

From Fabric B, Cut:

four 5-1/4" x WOF strips. Subcut: twenty-eight 5-1/4" x 5-1/4" squares eight 3" x WOF strips. Subcut: one hundred twelve 3" x 3" squares seven 2-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut: one hundred twelve 2-1/2" x 2-1/2" squares

From Fabric C, cut:

eight 3" x WOF strips. Subcut: one hundred twelve 3" x 3" squares seven 2-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut: one hundred twelve 2-1/2" x 2-1/2" squares

From Fabric D. Cut:

two 5-1/4" x WOF strips. Subcut: fourteen 5-1/4" x 5-1/4" squares

From Fabric E, cut:


four 5-1/4" x WOF strips. Subcut: twenty-eight 5-1/4" x 5-1/4" squares eight 2-7/8" x WOF strips. Subcut: one hundred twelve 2-7/8" x 2-7/8" squares


From the Binding Fabric, Cut:

six 2-1/2" x WOF strips.

Assemble the Half Square Triangle (HST) Units

- **Step 1**: Pair a 3" Fabric B square with a 3" Fabric C square, RST. Mark a diagonal line on the wrong side of one square. Sew 1/4" away from both sides of the marked line. Cut on the marked line creating two half-square triangles (HSTs). Trim to 2-1/2" square. Repeat to make two hundred twenty-four B/C HSTs.
- **Step 2**: Pair one HST with a 2-1/2" Fabric B square, RST. Make sure that the Fabric B portion of the HST matches the Fabric B square. See diagram to the right. Sew to make one hundred twelve sets.
- **Step 3**: Pair one HST with a 2-1/2" Fabric C square, RST. Make sure that the Fabric C portion of the HST matches the Fabric C square. See diagram. Sew to make one hundred twelve sets.
- **Step 4**: Match 2 sets, so the HSTs are opposite, RST. Sew to make a Four Patch unit. Make one hundred twelve sets. Check orientation!






Make the Flying Geese

Step 5: Pin two 2-7/8" Fabric E squares in opposite corners of a 5-1/4" Fabric B Squares, RST. The squares will overlap slightly in the center of the larger square. Using a ruler, draw a diagonal line through the squares.






Step 6: Sew a scant 1/4" seam on each side of the diagonal line. Set the seam by pressing it flat. Cut along the diagonal line, creating two identical units.

Step 8: Place one 2-7/8" Fabric E square at the corner of sewn block. Unit. Draw diagonal line in pencil. Sew a scant 1/4" seam on each side of the diagonal line. Set seam by pressing. Cut along the diagonal line, creating two identical units.

Step 7: Press the fabric toward the smaller triangles. Repeat



Step 9: Press the seam toward smaller triangle. Trim off small dog ears left by the seam allowance. Trim to 2-1/2" x 4-1/2" if necessary. Repeat to make eight B/E flying geese blocks.



Step 10: Repeat with all remaining 2-7/8" Fabric E squares and 5-1/4" Fabric B squares to make a total of one hundred twelve E/B flying geese units.



Step 11: Repeat steps 5-9 with 2-7/8" Fabric A squares and 5-1/4" Fabric E squares to make one hundred twelve A/E flying geese units.



Step 12: Repeat steps 5-9 with 5-1/4" Fabric D squares and 2-7/8" Fabric A squares to make fifty-six D/A flying geese units.






Step 14: Sew two D/A flying geese units together with points facing outward. Press seams open. Make twenty-eight units.



Assemble the Block

Step 15: Gather: four E/B and A/E Flying geese units, one D/A and D/A flying geese units four HST four patch units
Arrange the units into three rows of three. See the Block Assembly Diagram for layout. Press seams open. Make



Assemble the Quilt

Step 16: Arrange the Blocks on Point Lay out all blocks in a diagonal, on-point setting according to the quilt layout diagram. The quilt center is composed of 7 diagonal rows. Rows will vary in the number of blocks as follows:

Row 1: one block
Row 2: three blocks
Row 3: five blocks
Row 7: two blocks


Row 4: seven blocks


twenty-eight blocks.

Step 17: Join rows 1-4 together, aligning the center block of each row vertically. Press seams open.


Step 18: Join rows 5-7 together, aligning the center seam between the two middle blocks. Press seams open.

Step 19: Join the two sections together, matching seam intersections carefully to ensure proper alignment.





- **Step 19:** Trim the quilt. Shift the quilt forty-five degrees to the left.
- **Step 20:** Find the center point of the blocks on the top row. (Marked by the red line.) Cut 1/4" outside the center of the top blocks. (You don't want to lose those points!)
- **Step 21:** Repeat Step 20 for the sides and the bottom of the quilt making sure that you are trimming on the outside of the marked lines.



Step 22: Your quilt top is finished! Baste, quilt and bind as desired!
