Finished quilt measures: $46-12^{\prime \prime} \times 58-1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$

Fabric amounts based on yardage that is 42" wide.


## Notes Before You Begin

- Read through all of the instructions before beginning.
- All of the seam allowances are $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ unless otherwise noted.
- Press seam allowances open unless otherwise noted.
- Width of fabric (WOF) is equal to at least $42^{\prime \prime}$ wide.
- Right sides together has been abbreviated to RST.
- Remember to measure twice and cut once!


## Cutting Instructions

## From the Ten Square Pack:

Set one print aside for the cornerstones. From this print, cut: seven 1-1/4" x 10" strips. Subcut:
forty-nine 1-1/4" squares for the cornerstones
Select thirty-two remaining 10" squares. Each square will make one Leaf Block. Three prints will be used twice.


## From each of the squares, cut:

two 3-1/2" squares
three 3 " squares

## From Fabric A, cut:

two 12" x WOF strips. Subcut:
four 12 " squares. Cut each square along both diagonals, creating sixteen side setting triangles. Note: two triangles will not be used.
Trim the remainder of the strip to $6-5 / 8^{\prime \prime}$ wide. Subcut:
two $6-5 / 8$ " squares. Cut each square in half along one diagonal, creating four corner setting triangles.

## From Fabric B, cut:

six 3-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut: sixty-four 3-1/2" squares for the HSTs
three 3" x WOF strips. Subcut: thirty-two 3" squares
four 2-5/8" x WOF strips. Subcut:
sixty-four 2-5/8" squares for the stem units. Mark a diagonal line on the back of each square.

## From Fabric C, cut:

sixteen 1-1/4" x WOF strips. Subcut:
eighty $1-1 / 4^{\prime \prime} \times 8$ " sashing strips

## From Fabric D, cut:

three 3" x WOF strips. Subcut: thirty-two 3 " squares for the stem units

From the Binding Fabric, cut:
six 2-1/2" x WOF strips

Assemble the Half-Square Triangles (HSTs)
Step 1: Pair a 3-1/2" Fabric B square with a 3-1/2" print square, RST. Mark a diagonal line on the wrong side of one square. Sew 1/4" away from both sides of the marked line. Cut on the marked line, creating two half-square triangles (HSTs). Press toward the darker fabric. Trim to 3" square. Repeat to make four HSTs in this fabric pairing.


Step 2: Repeat Step 1 to make thirty-two sets of four HSTs.

Step 3: Place a $2-5 / 8^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric B square in one corner of a $3^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric D square, right sides together. Sew along the diagonal, as shown. Trim the excess fabric, leaving a $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ seam allowance. Press toward the corner. Repeat on the opposite corner, with a second 2-5/8" Fabric B square. Make thirty-two Stem Units.


## Assemble the Blocks



Step 4: Gather:
one 3" Fabric B square three $3^{\prime \prime}$ matching print squares four matching print HSTs one Fabric D Stem Unit

Arrange the units into three rows of three. Note the fabric placement and orientation in the Block Assembly Diagram.

Step 5: Sew the pieces together to form the rows. Press the seams in opposite directions every other row.

Step 6: Sew the rows together, nesting the seams and pressing the seams to one side to form the block. The resulting Block will measure 8 " square.

Step 7: Repeat Steps 4-6 to make a total of thirty-two Blocks.


Step 8: Arrange the Blocks together in diagonal rows, as indicated in the Quilt Assembly Diagram. Sew each row together, using Fabric C sashing strips between each block and at the beginning and end of each row. Press seams toward the blocks. Make six block rows, with two single blocks remaining. Sew sashing strips to the opposite sides of these blocks, as shown.

Step 9: Sew the side setting triangles to the ends of the rows, aligning the right angles together, as shown. The angled end will extend beyond the block. Press.


Step 10: Gather cornerstone squares and sashing strips. Following the Quilt Assembly Diagram, sew each row together, using cornerstones between each sashing strip and at the beginning and end of each row. Press seams toward the sashing. Repeat to make nine sashing rows.

Step 11: Sew the sashing and block rows together, pinning and nesting the seams. Press seams open or to the sashing.

Step 12: Sew the corner setting triangles to each of the four corners. Press.
Step 13: Trim all four sides evenly, allowing a $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ seam allowance from the diagonal of each cornerstone, as shown.

Your quilt top is finished! Baste, quilt, bind and enjoy!

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
