
CHAIN OF STAMPS

Fabric and Supplies Needed

Fabric amounts based on yardage that is 42" wide.

Notes Before You Begin

- Read through all of the instructions before beginning.
- All of the seam allowances are 1/4" unless otherwise noted.
- Press seam allowances open unless otherwise noted.
- Width of fabric (WOF) is equal to at least 42" wide.
- Right sides together has been abbreviated to RST.
- Remember to measure twice and cut once!

Cutting Instructions

Note: Fabrics B, C and D will be fussy cut for the blocks. When fussy cutting, you will be able to use every other row, and every other block in the row.

From Fabric A, cut:

eight 5" x WOF strips. Subcut: sixty 5" x 4-5/8" rectangles twelve 2" x WOF strips. Subcut: two hundred forty 2" x 1-7/8" rectangles five 1-1/2" x WOF strips. Sew together, end-to-end, then trim: two 1-1/2" x 47-1/2" top/bottom inner borders two 1-1/2" x 50" side inner borders

From each of Fabrics B and C, fussy cut:

one hundred 2" x 1-7/8" rectangles

From Fabric D, cut:

two 4-1/2" x <u>length</u> of fabric strips. Trim: two 4-1/2" x 52" side outer borders From the remaining width of fabric, cut: four 4-1/2" x WOF strips. Sew together, end-to-end, then trim: two 4-1/2" x 55-1/2" top/bottom outer borders Additionally, fussy cut: one hundred 2" x 1-7/8" rectangles

From the Binding Fabric, cut:

six 2-1/2" x WOF strips

Assemble the Pieced Blocks

Step 1: Gather: five 2" x 1-7/8" Fabric B rectangles four 2" x 1-7/8" Fabric A rectangles

Arrange the units into three rows of three. Note the fabric placement and block orientation in the Block Assembly Diagram.

Step 2: Sew the units together to form the rows. Press the seams away from Fabric A.

Step 3: Sew the rows together, nesting the seams and pressing the seams to one side to form the block. The block should measure 5" x 4-5/8".



Make a total of twenty Fabric B Blocks

Step 4: Repeat Steps 1-3 to make a total of:




twenty Fabric D Blocks



twenty Fabric E Blocks

Step 5: Arrange the Fabric A rectangles and the Fabric B, C and D Blocks into twelve rows of ten blocks. Note the fabric placement and block orientation in the Quilt Assembly Diagram.

Step 6: Sew the blocks together to form rows. Press the seams toward the Fabric A rectangles.

Step 7: Sew the rows together to form the quilt center. Press the row seams open.

Step 8: Sew the side inner borders to the sides of the quilt center. Press toward the borders. Sew the top and bottom inner borders to the quilt center. Press toward the borders.

Step 9: Sew the side outer borders to the sides of the quilt center. Press toward the borders. Sew the top and bottom outer borders to the quilt center. Press toward the borders. Note: Pay careful attention to the direction of the print in the fabric.

Your quilt top is complete! Baste, quilt, bind and enjoy!

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
