

Notes Before You Begin

- Read through all of the instructions before beginning.
- All of the seam allowances are 1/4" unless otherwise noted.
- Press seam allowances open unless otherwise noted.
- Width of fabric (WOF) is equal to at least 43" wide.
- Right sides together has been abbreviated to RST.
- Remember to measure twice and cut once!

Cutting Instructions

From Fabric A, cut:

sixteen 1-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut:

twenty-four 1-1/2" x 8-1/2" block sashing strips Sew the remaining eleven strips together, end-to-end, then trim to yield: seven 1-1/2" x 44-1/2" row sashing strips two 1-1/2" x 55-1/2" side sashing strips

From each of Fabrics B, C, F, H, I, L-O and Q, gather:

two 2-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut: six 2-1/2" x 8-1/2" rectangles for the blocks

From each of Fabrics D, E, G, J & K, gather:

three 2-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut: twelve 2-1/2" x 8-1/2" rectangles for the blocks

From the yardage of Fabric P, cut:

six 2" x WOF strips. Trim the selvages sparingly. Sew the strips together, end-to-end, then trim to yield:

two 2" x 68-1/2" side outer borders two 2" x 56-1/2" top/bottom outer borders

From Fabric Q, cut:

seven 5-1/2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together, end-to-end, then trim to yield: two 5-1/2" x 69" side mitered borders two 5-1/2" x 60" top/bottom mitered borders

From Binding Fabric, cut:

seven 2-1/2" x WOF strips for the binding

Assemble the A Blocks



Step 1: Sew one strip of each fabric together along the longest edge, in the following order: Fabric K + Fabric E + Fabric J + Fabric D. Press the seams to one side.

Repeat to make twelve A Blocks.

Assemble the B Blocks



Step 2: Sew one strip of each fabric together along the longest edge, in the following order: Fabric F + Fabric G + Fabric H + Fabric I. Press the seams to one side.

Repeat to make six B Blocks.

Assemble the C Blocks



Step 3: Sew one strip of each fabric together along the longest edge, in the following order: Fabric C + Fabric B + Fabric L + Fabric M. Press the seams to one side.

Repeat to make six C Blocks.


Assemble the D Blocks



Step 4: Sew one strip of each fabric together along the longest edge, in the following order: Fabric N + Fabric O + Fabric Q + Fabric G. Press the seams to one side.

Repeat to make six D Blocks.

Assemble the Quilt



Step 5: Arrange the A -D Blocks together as indicated in the Quilt Assembly Diagram. Sew each row together, using Fabric A row sashing strips between each block. Press seams toward the sashing. Repeat to make six block rows.


Step 6: Sew each row together, using a Fabric A row sashing strip between each row and at the top and bottom of the quilt. Press seams toward the sashing.

Step 7: Sew the Fabric A side sashing strips to the sides of the quilt center. Press toward the strips.

Add the Final Borders

Step 8: Center and pin one side mitered border to the quilt top. Sew the border, starting and stopping 1/4" from each end of the quilt top. Repeat with the remaining side outer border. Repeat with the top and bottom mitered borders. Note: borders will extend beyond the

quilt's edge.



Step 9: Fold the quilt diagonally, right sides together and align two of the borders directly on top of each other.

Use your ruler to draw a line from the corner of the quilt to the edge of the border.



Step 10: Trim off excess border along line and sew 1/4" in from the edge. Begin at the point where your border stitching had ended and sew to the edge of the border.

Step 11: Press the seam. Square up the corners of the quilt. The quilt should measure 56-1/2" x 65-1/2".

Step 12: Sew the Fabric P top and bottom outer borders to the quilt center. Press toward the borders. Sew the Fabric P side outer borders to the sides of the quilt center. Press toward the borders.

Your quilt top is complete! Baste, quilt, bind and enjoy!
