Notes Before You Begin

- Read through all of the instructions before beginning.
- All of the seam allowances are 1/4" unless otherwise noted.
- Press seam allowances open unless otherwise noted.
- Width of fabric (WOF) is equal to at least 42" wide.
- Right sides together has been abbreviated to RST.
- Remember to measure twice and cut once!

From Fabric A, cut:

ten 2-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut: one hundred fifty 2-1/2" squares

From Fabric B, cut:

six 2-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut: twenty-one 2-1/2" x 8-1/2" rectangles

From Fabric C, cut:

nine 2-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut: thirty-six 2-1/2" x 6-1/2" rectangles thirty-six 2-1/2" squares

From Fabric D, cut:

eight 2-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut: seventy-two 2-1/2" x 4-1/2" rectangles

From Fabric E, cut:

nine 2-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut: thirty-six 2-1/2" x 6-1/2" rectangles thirty-six 2-1/2" squares

From Fabric F, cut:

six 2-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut: twenty-one 2-1/2" x 8-1/2" rectangles

From the Binding Fabric, cut:

six 2-1/2" x WOF strips



Step 1: Gather: five Fabric A squares four Fabric D rectangles two Fabric C squares two Fabric C rectangles one Fabric B rectangle

Arrange the units into five columns, as shown. Note the fabric placement in the Block Assembly Diagram.

Step 2: Sew the units together to form the columns. Press the seams away from the Fabric A squares.

Step 3: Sew the columns together, nesting the seams. Do not press the final seams on the block. This will be done in the first step of the Quilt Assembly process.

Make fifteen A Blocks.

Assemble the B Blocks



Step 4: Gather: three Fabric A squares two Fabric E squares two Fabric E rectangles one Fabric F rectangle

Arrange the units into three columns, as shown. Note the fabric placement in the Block Assembly Diagram.

Step 5: Sew the units together to form the columns. Press the seams away from the Fabric A squares.

Step 6: Sew the columns together, nesting the seams. Do not press the final seams on the block. This will be done in the first step of the Quilt Assembly process.

Make fifteen B Blocks.







Step 7: Gather: three Fabric A squares one Fabric B rectangle one Fabric C square one Fabric C rectangle two Fabric D rectangles

Arrange the units into three columns, as shown. Note the fabric placement in the Block Assembly Diagram.

Step 8: Sew the units together to form the columns. Press the seams away from the Fabric A squares.

Step 9: Sew the columns together, nesting the seams. Do not press the final seams on the block. This will be done in the first step of the Quilt Assembly process.

Make three C Blocks.

Assemble the D Blocks



Step 10: Gather: three Fabric A squares one Fabric B rectangle one Fabric C square one Fabric C rectangle two Fabric D rectangles

Arrange the units into three columns, as shown. Note the fabric placement in the Block Assembly Diagram.

Step 11: Sew the units together to form the columns. Press the seams away from the Fabric A squares.

Step 12: Sew the columns together, nesting the seams. Do not press the final seams on the block. This will be done in the first step of the Quilt Assembly process.

Make three D Blocks.







Step 13: Gather: two Fabric A squares one Fabric F rectangle one Fabric E square one Fabric E rectangle

Arrange the units into two columns, as shown. Note the fabric placement in the Block Assembly Diagram.

Step 14: Sew the units together to form the columns. Press the seams away from the Fabric A squares.

Step 15: Sew the columns together, nesting the seams. Do not press the final seams on the block. This will be done in the first step of the Quilt Assembly process.

Make three E Blocks.



Assemble the F Blocks



Step 16: Gather: two Fabric A squares one Fabric F rectangle one Fabric E square one Fabric E rectangle

Arrange the units into two columns, as shown. Note the fabric placement in the Block Assembly Diagram.


Step 17: Sew the units together to form the columns. Press the seams away from the Fabric A squares.

Step 18: Sew the columns together, nesting the seams. Do not press the final seams on the block. This will be done in the first step of the Quilt Assembly process.

Make three F Blocks.



Assemble the Quilt



Step 19: Arrange the blocks into six rows. Note the fabric placement and block orientation in the Quilt Assembly Diagram.

Step 20: Sew the blocks together to form rows. Press the rows to the left in the odd numbered rows and to the right in the even numbered rows.

Step 21: Sew the rows together to form the quilt center. Press the row seams open.

Your quilt top is complete! Baste, quilt, bind and enjoy!

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
