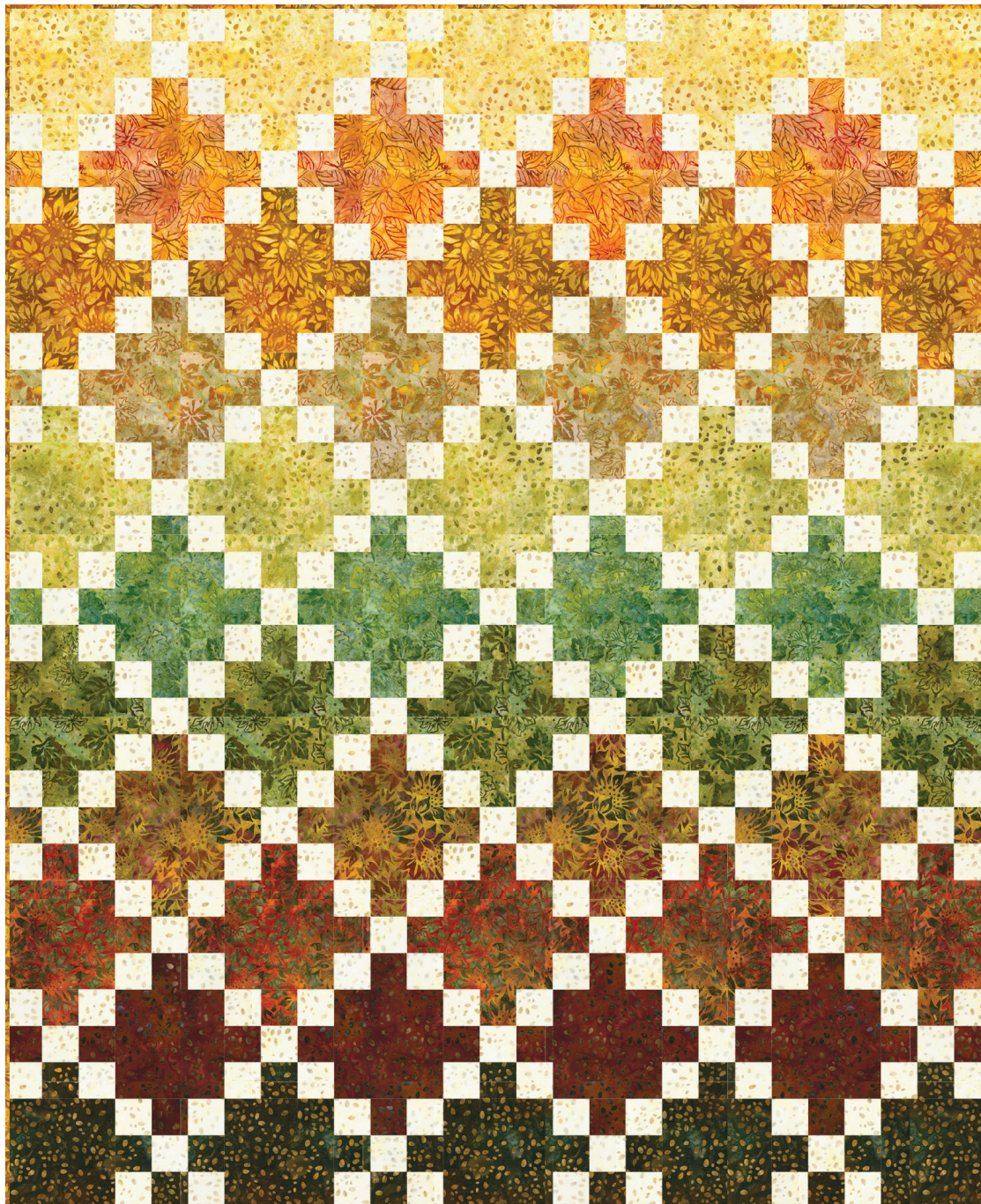

Finished quilt measures: 54" x 66"













## Fabric and Supplies Needed

*Fabric amounts based on yardage that is 42" wide.*

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## Notes Before You Begin

- Read through all of the instructions before beginning.
- All of the seam allowances are 1/4" unless otherwise noted.
- Press seam allowances open unless otherwise noted.
- Width of fabric (WOF) is equal to at least 42" wide.
- Right sides together has been abbreviated to RST.
- Remember to measure twice and cut once!

## Cutting Instructions

### **From Fabric A, cut:**

sixteen 2-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut:  
two hundred forty-five 2-1/2" squares

### **From each of Fabrics B and L, cut:**

one 6-1/2" x WOF strip. Subcut:  
five 6-1/2" squares  
from the remainder of the strip, cut one 2-1/2" square  
one 2-1/2" x WOF strip. Subcut:  
sixteen 2-1/2" squares, for a total of seventeen

### **From each of Fabrics D, F, H and J, cut:**

one 6-1/2" x WOF strip. Subcut:  
five 6-1/2" squares  
from the remainder of the strip, cut two 2-1/2" squares  
one 2-1/2" x WOF strip. Subcut:  
sixteen 2-1/2" squares, for a total of eighteen

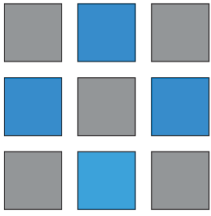
### **From each of Fabrics C, E, G, I and K, cut:**

one 6-1/2" x WOF strip. Subcut:  
four 6-1/2" squares  
from the remainder of the strip, cut two 2-1/2" squares  
one 2-1/2" x WOF strip. Subcut:  
sixteen 2-1/2" squares, for a total of eighteen

### **From the Binding Fabric, cut:**

seven 2-1/2" x WOF strips

## Assemble the Nine-Patch Blocks

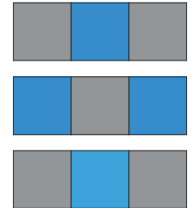


### Step 1: Gather:

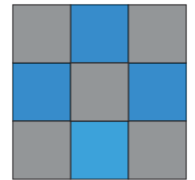
five 2-1/2" Fabric A squares  
three 2-1/2" Fabric B squares  
one 2-1/2" Fabric C square

Arrange the units into three rows of three. Note the fabric placement and block orientation in the Block Assembly Diagram.

**Step 2:** Sew the squares together to form the rows. Press the seams toward darker fabric.



**Step 3:** Sew the rows together, nesting the seams and pressing the seams to one side to form the block.

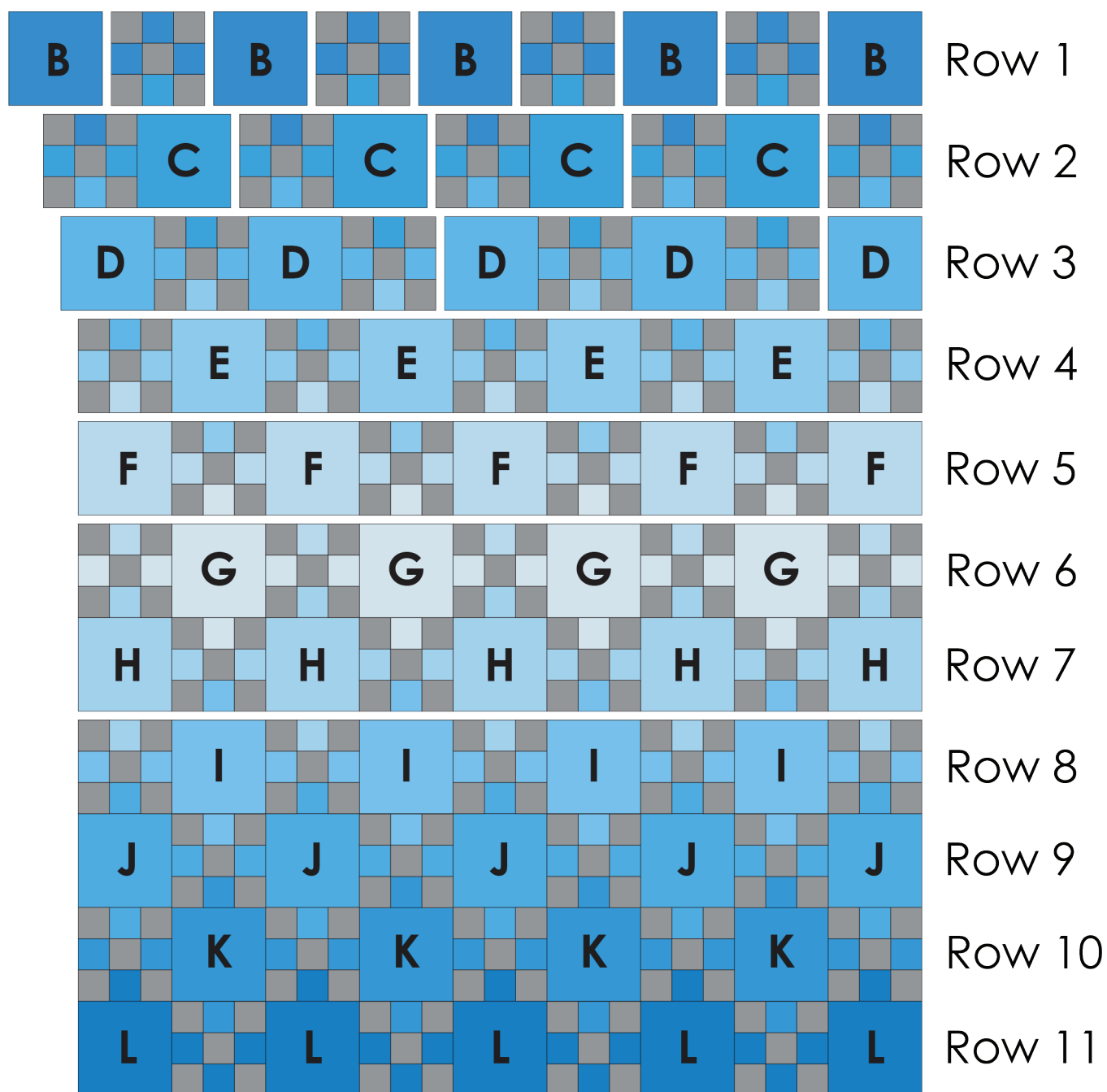


The resulting Nine-Patch Block will measure 6-1/2" square. Repeat to make four Blocks in this fabric arrangement.

**Step 4:** Repeat Steps 1-3 to make a total of forty-nine Nine-Patch Blocks, using the Quilt Assembly Diagram and the chart below for fabric placement.

Row	Fabrics Used (w/five A squares)			# of Blocks to Make
2	(1) B	(2) C	(1) D	make five
3	(1) C	(2) D	(1) E	make four
4	(1) D	(2) E	(1) F	make five
5	(1) E	(2) F	(1) G	make four
6	(1) F	(2) G	(1) H	make five
7	(1) G	(2) H	(1) I	make four
8	(1) H	(2) I	(1) J	make five
9	(1) I	(2) J	(1) K	make four
10	(1) J	(2) K	(1) L	make five
11	(1) K	(3) L	-	make four

## Assemble the Quilt



**Step 5:** Arrange the blocks into eleven rows of nine blocks. Note the fabric placement and block orientation in the Quilt Assembly Diagram.

**Step 6:** Sew the blocks together to form rows. Press the rows to the left in the odd numbered rows and to the right in the even numbered rows.

**Step 7:** Sew the rows together to form the quilt center. Press the row seams open.

Your quilt top is complete! Baste, quilt, bind and enjoy!

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
