## Notes Before You Begin

- Read through all of the instructions before beginning.
- All of the seam allowances are 1/4" unless otherwise noted.
- Press seam allowances open unless otherwise noted.
- Width of fabric (WOF) is equal to at least 42" wide.
- Right sides together has been abbreviated to RST.
- Remember to measure twice and cut once!

# **Cutting Instructions**

#### From Fabric A, cut:

sixteen 2-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut: two hundred forty-five 2-1/2" squares

#### From each of Fabrics B and L, cut:

one 6-1/2" x WOF strip. Subcut:

five 6-1/2" squares

from the remainder of the strip, cut one 2-1/2" square one 2-1/2" x WOF strip. Subcut:

sixteen 2-1/2" squares, for a total of seventeen

#### From each of Fabrics D, F, H and J, cut:

one 6-1/2" x WOF strip. Subcut:

five 6-1/2" squares

from the remainder of the strip, cut two 2-1/2" squares

one 2-1/2" x WOF strip. Subcut:

sixteen 2-1/2" squares, for a total of eighteen

#### From each of Fabrics C, E, G, I and K, cut:

one 6-1/2" x WOF strip. Subcut:

four 6-1/2" squares

from the remainder of the strip, cut two 2-1/2" squares

one 2-1/2" x WOF strip. Subcut:

sixteen 2-1/2" squares, for a total of eighteen

#### From the Binding Fabric, cut:

seven 2-1/2" x WOF strips


### Assemble the Nine-Patch Blocks




**Step 1:** Gather: five 2-1/2" Fabric A squares three 2-1/2" Fabric B squares one 2-1/2" Fabric C square



Arrange the units into three rows of three. Note the fabric placement and block orientation in the Block Assembly Diagram.



**Step 2:** Sew the squares together to form the rows. Press the seams toward darker fabric.






The resulting Nine-Patch Block will measure 6-1/2" square. Repeat to make four Blocks in this fabric arrangement.

**Step 4:** Repeat Steps 1-3 to make a total of forty-nine Nine-Patch Blocks, using the Quilt Assembly Diagram and the chart below for fabric placement.

**Step 5**: Arrange the blocks into eleven rows of nine blocks. Note the fabric placement and block orientation in the Quilt Assembly Diagram.

**Step 6:** Sew the blocks together to form rows. Press the rows to the left in the odd numbered rows and to the right in the even numbered rows.

**Step 7:** Sew the rows together to form the quilt center. Press the row seams open.

Your quilt top is complete! Baste, quilt, bind and enjoy!

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
