

Notes Before You Begin

- Read through all of the instructions before beginning.
- All of the seam allowances are 1/4" unless otherwise noted.
- Press seam allowances open unless otherwise noted.
- Width of fabric (WOF) is equal to at least 42" wide.
- Right sides together has been abbreviated to RST.
- Remember to measure twice and cut once!

Cutting Instructions

From Fabric A, cut:

nine 4" x WOF strips. Subcut:

eighty-four 4" squares for the HSTs

twenty-one 2" x WOF strips. Subcut:

forty-two 2" x 21" strips. Set aside for strip piecing.

six 1-1/2" x WOF strips. Sew together, end-to-end, then trim:

two 1-1/2" x 63-1/2" side inner borders

two 1-1/2" x 56-1/2" top/bottom inner borders

From each of Fabrics B-U, cut:

one 4" x WOF strip. Subcut:

four 4" squares for the HSTs

Subcut the remainder of the strip into:

two 2" x WOF strips. Set aside for strip piecing.

From Fabric V, cut:

one 4" x WOF strip. Subcut:

four 4" squares for the HSTs

Subcut the remainder of the strip into:

two 2" x WOF strips. Set aside for strip piecing.

seven 3-1/2" x WOF strips. Sew together, end-to-end, then trim:

two 3-1/2" x 65-1/2" side outer borders

two 3-1/2" x 62-1/2" top/bottom outer borders

From the Binding Fabric, cut:

seven 2-1/2" x WOF strips

Assemble the Half-Square Triangles (HSTs)

Step 1: Pair a 4" Fabric A square with a 4" Fabric B square, RST. Mark a diagonal line on the wrong side of one square. Sew 1/4" away from both sides of the marked line. Cut on the marked line, creating two half-square triangles (HSTs). Press toward the darker fabric. Trim to 3-1/2" square. Repeat to make eight A/B HSTs.



Step 2: Repeat Step 1 to make:



Assemble the Four-Patch Units

Step 3: Sew a 2" Fabric A strip to a 2" Fabric B strip, along the longest edge, and press toward the darker fabric. Repeat to make a second strip set unit. Subcut the units into twenty 2" x 3-1/2" units.



Step 4: Sew a pair of Step 3 units together, matching contrasting fabrics together and nesting the seam. Press. The resulting four-patch unit should measure 3-1/2" square. Repeat to make ten A/B four-patch units.



Step 5: Repeat Steps 3 and 4 to make:

Assemble the Blocks



Step 6: Gather: five A/B four-patches four A/B HSTs



Arrange the units into three rows of three. Note the fabric placement and block orientation in the Block Assembly Diagram.

- Step 7: Sew the squares together to form the rows. Press the seams toward the HSTs.
- **Step 8:** Sew the rows together, nesting the seams and pressing the seams to one side to form the block.

The resulting block should measure 9-1/2" square. Repeat to make a second A/B Block.

Step 9: Repeat Steps 6-8 to make two blocks from each of Fabrics C-V, for a total of forty-two blocks.

Assemble the Quilt

- **Step 10:** Arrange the blocks into seven rows of six blocks. Note the fabric placement and block orientation in the Quilt Assembly Diagram.
- **Step 11:** Sew the blocks together to form rows. Press the rows to the left in the odd numbered rows and to the right in the even numbered rows.
- **Step 12:** Sew the rows together to form the quilt center. Press the row seams open.
- **Step 13:** Sew the side inner borders to the sides of the quilt center. Press toward the borders. Sew the top and bottom inner borders to the quilt center. Press toward the borders.
- **Step 14:** Sew the side outer borders to the sides of the quilt center. Press toward the borders. Sew the top and bottom outer borders to the quilt center. Press toward the borders.



Your quilt top is complete! Baste, quilt, bind and enjoy!

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
