

Pattern Notes

- Read through all of the instructions before beginning.
- All of the seam allowances are 1/4" unless otherwise noted.
- Press seam allowances open unless otherwise noted.
- Width of fabric (WOF) is equal to at least 44" wide.
- Right sides together has been abbreviated to RST.
- Remember to measure twice and cut once!

Print 16 copies of Template 1 at 100% scale.

Cutting Instructions

From Fabric A:

trim the selected panel to 22-1/2" x 20-1/2"

From Fabric B, cut:

two 3" x WOF strips. Subcut:

two 3" x 22-1/2"

three 2-1/2" x WOF strips.

Sew together, end-to-end, then trim to yield:

two 2-1/2" x 50-1/2" in length.

three 6-1/2" x WOF strips

Sew together, end-to-end, then trim to yield:

two 6-1/2" x 47-1/2"

From each of Fabrics C and D, cut:

two 3" x WOF strips. Subcut:

two 3" x 22-1/2"

two 3-1/4" x WOF strips. Subcut:

two 3-1/4" x 35-1/2"

three 2-1/2" x WOF strips.

Sew together, end-to-end, then trim to yield:

two 2-1/2" x 50-1/2" in length.

one 6-1/2" x WOF strip. Subcut:

two 6-1/2" x 7-1/2" rectangles. These will be used for paper piecing section 1 of the template.

From Fabric E, cut:

two 3" x WOF strips. Subcut:

two 3" x 35-1/2"

two 6-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut:

sixteen 4-1/4" X 6-1/2" rectangles. Set aside eight of the rectangles. Using the remaining rectangles, cut in half along the diagonal, creating two triangles. From the eight set aside earlier, cut along the opposite diagonal. All triangles will be used for paper piecing sections 2 and 3 of the template.



From each of Fabrics F-K, cut:

one 6-1/2" x WOF strip. Subcut:

two 6-1/2" x 7-1/2" rectangles. These will be used for paper piecing section 1 of the template.

From the binding fabric, cut:

six 2-1/2" x WOF strips

Assemble the Quitl Center



Step 1: Sew the 22-1/2" Fabric C and D pieces to either side of the 22-1/2" Fabric B piece, along the longest side. Press toward the darker fabric. Repeat to create a second unit.

Step 2: Sew the Step 1 unit to the top and bottom of panel, with the Fabric C strips next to the panel.

Step 3: Sew the 35-1/2" Fabric C and D pieces to either side of the 35-1/2" Fabric E piece, along the longest side. Press toward the darker fabric. Repeat to create a second unit.


Step 4: Sew the Step 3 unit to the sides of panel, with the Fabric D strips next to the panel.

Assemble the Paper Pieced Blocks

These blocks are constructed with paper piecing.


Step 5: Sew the pieces in the order indicated on the template, working from section #1-3. Trim seam allowances to 1/4" as each new pieces is added.

TIP: When sewing sections 2 and 3 to the center triangle, angle the fabric as illustrated to best cover the numbered area.



Step 6: Trim the blocks to the template edge, yielding sixteen 6-1/2" x 5-1/4" rectangles. Remove the paper.

Step 7: Referring to the Quilt assembly Diagram, sew the blocks together into two rows of eight blocks each, noting the fabric placement and block orientation. The top row fabrics are in H-G-F-C-C-F-G-H order and the bottom row fabrics are in K-J-l-D-D-l-J-K order. Press seams away from the center seam and press the center seam to one side.



Step 8: Sew the rows from Step 7 to the top and bottom of the quilt. Press seams toward the quilt center.

Add the Final Borders

Step 9: Sew the 6-1/2" x 47-1/2" Fabric B pieces to the left and right sides of the quilt.

Step 10: Sew the 50-1/2" Fabric B and C strips to either side of the 50-1/2" Fabric D strip. Press seam toward the darker fabric. Repeat to create a second unit. Sew to the top and bottom of the quilt, with the Fabric B strip next to the quilt center.

Your quilt top is now complete! Baste, quilt, bind and enjoy!
