

### Notes Before You Begin

- Read through all of the instructions before beginning.
- All of the seam allowances are 1/4" unless otherwise noted.
- Press seam allowances open unless otherwise noted.
- Width of fabric (WOF) is equal to at least 44" wide.
- Right sides together has been abbreviated to RST.
- Remember to measure twice and cut once!

## **Cutting Instructions**

#### From Fabric A, fussy cut:

twelve 7" x 9" blocks.

#### From Fabric B, cut:

five 2-1/2" x WOF strips. Set aside for the inner border.

#### From Fabrics C-V:

select six prints to frame the panel blocks. From each of these, cut the 2-1/2" strip into: two 1-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut:

two 1-1/4" x 7"

two 1-1/4" x 10-1/2"

The remaining 2-1/2" strips in the roll will be used for strip piecing.

#### Assemble the Panel Blocks




**Step 1** Sew matching 1-1/4" x 7" strips to the top and bottom of each of the puppy/kitty blocks. Press toward the sashing.

**Step 2** Sew matching 1-1/4" x 10-1/2" strips to the sides of the puppy/kitty blocks. Press toward the sashing.



#### Assemble the Pieced Blocks

**Step 3** Using twenty 2-1/2" print strips from the roll up, sew together into five strip sets of four prints each. Press the seams all one direction. Cut into 2-1/2" wide segments.



**Step 4** Sew five of the units from Step 3 together to form a block. (NOTE: You may need to re-press the seams in a unit for the seam allowances to alternate.) Repeat to make thirteen pieced blocks. Press the seams all one direction. You will have some units left over.



## Assembling the Quilt

**Step 5** Using the photo of the quilt as a guide, arrange the blocks in five rows of five blocks. Sew the blocks together in each row, pressing toward the puppy/kitty blocks.



**Step 6** Sew the rows together, matching and pinning the seam intersections. Press the row seams all one direction.




#### Assemble Borders

**Step 7** Measure and trim two Fabric B inner borders the width of the quilt. Sew to the top and bottom of the quilt. Press toward the borders.

**Step 8** Sew the remaining Fabric B strips together, end-to-end, then measure and trim two borders the length of the quilt. Sew to the sides, pressing the seams toward the borders.

**Step 9** Gather eight more 2-1/2" strips. Cut in half (2-1/2" x 21"), then sew two more strip sets of four strips each. Cut into sixteen 2-1/2" units.



**Step 10** Using the leftover units from the pieced blocks and the units just made in Step 3, sew them together end-to-end to make two top and bottom borders of twenty-two squares, and two side borders of twenty-nine squares. Press the seams all one direction.

**Step 11** Sew the shorter pieced borders to the top and bottom of the quilt. Sew the longer pieced borders to the sides of the quilt. Press the seams toward the inner borders.

Your quilt top is now complete! Baste, quilt, bind and enjoy!
