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Notes Before You Begin

- Read through all of the instructions before beginning.
- All of the seam allowances are 1/4" unless otherwise noted.
- Press seam allowances open unless otherwise noted.
- Width of fabric (WOF) is equal to at least 42" wide.
- Right sides together has been abbreviated to RST.
- Remember to measure twice and cut once!

From Fabric A, fussy cut:

one hundred twelve 2-1/2" squares

From Fabric B, cut:

five 6-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut: twenty-eight 6-1/2" squares

From Fabric C, cut:

two 2-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut: twenty-eight 2-1/2" squares

From Fabric D, cut:

two 2-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut: twenty 2-1/2" squares

From Fabric E, cut:

one 2-1/2" x WOF strip. Subcut: fourteen 2-1/2" squares

From Fabric F, cut:

one 2-1/2" x WOF strip. Subcut: fourteen 2-1/2" squares

From Fabric G, cut:

two 2-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut: twenty-two 2-1/2" squares

From Fabric H, cut:

one 2-1/2" x WOF strip. Subcut: fourteen 2-1/2" squares

From Fabric I, cut:

two 2-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut: twenty-eight 2-1/2" squares

From the Binding Fabric, cut:

five 2-1/2" x WOF strips

Step 1: Gather: two Fabric G squares two Fabric I squares four Fabric A squares one Fabric C square

Arrange in three rows of three, as shown. Sew the rows together, pressing the seams away from the Fabric A squares. Sew the rows together, nesting the seams and pressing the seams to one side. The resulting block should measure 6-1/2" square.



Step 2: Repeat Step 1 to make a total of twenty-eight blocks. Refer to the Quilt Assembly Diagram for fabric placement of each block.

Tip: Before sewing any more blocks, arrange the blocks in 28 stacks, in order to ensure that the correct fabrics are used together.


Cutting Instructions

Step 3: Arrange the Nine Patch Blocks and Fabric B squares into eight rows of seven. Note the fabric placement and block orientation in the Quilt Assembly Diagram.

Step 4: Sew the blocks together to form rows. Press the seams toward the Fabric B squares.

Step 5: Sew the rows together to form the quilt center. Press the row seams open.

Your quilt top is complete. Baste, quilt, bind and enjoy!



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
