Notes Before You Begin

- Read through all of the instructions before beginning.
- All of the seam allowances are 1/4" unless otherwise noted.
- Press seam allowances open unless otherwise noted.
- Width of fabric (WOF) is equal to at least 42" wide.
- Right sides together has been abbreviated to RST.
- Remember to measure twice and cut once!

Cutting Instructions

From Fabric A. cut:

One 12-1/2" x WOF, subcut: fifteen 12-1/2" x 2-1/2" strips Six 9-1/2" x WOF, subcut: eighty 9-1/2" x 3" strips twelve 2-1/2" x WOF

From Fabrics B- M, cut: (Keep colors in sets.)

One 6-1/4" x WOF, subcut:

three 6-1/4" x 6-1/4" squares, cut in half on the diagonal

One 4-3/4" x WOF, subcut:

three 4-3/4" x 4 3/4" squares, cut in half on the diagonal

From Fabrics N & O, cut: (Keep colors in sets.)

One 6-1/4" x WOF, subcut:

Two 6-1/4" x 6-1/4" squares, cut in half on the diagonal Two 4-3/4" x 4-3/4" squares, cut in half on the diagonal

From the Binding Fabric, cut:

Seven 2-1/2" x WOF strips

Block Assembly

Step 1: Align the midpoint of the 3" \times 9-1/2" Fabric A rectangle with the midpoint of one small Fabric B triangle and one large Fabric B triangle. Place the small triangle along one long side the rectangle and the large triangle along the opposite long side, matching centers. Sew the triangles to the rectangle to create a square-shaped unit.

Press seams open.

Pro Tip:


For consistent alignment across your quilt, place temporary diagonal guidelines on your ruler at 5-1/2" and 3-7/8". These lines will help you position the Fabric A rectangle accurately within the square during trimming, ensuring each unit matches perfectly.

Trim to a 6-1/2" square.

Repeat to make eighty assorted squares.

Step 2: Use four different squares to assemble a four-patch. Make twenty 12-1/2" blocks.

Step 3: Layout blocks as desired in five rows of four blocks. Sew a 2-1/2" x 12-1/2" Fabric A strip on the right side of each block in columns 1-3. Press towards Fabric A.


Step 4: Sew four blocks together in rows. (The last block will not have a Fabric A strip on the right.) Press towards Fabric A.

Step 5: Sew twelve 2-1/2" x WOF strips end-to-end to make sashing strips. Cut five 2-1/2" x 54-1/2" strips for horizontal sashing.

Step 6: Assemble quilt top by sewing sashing strips between block rows, and to the sides of the quilt top. Press towards the sashing strips.

Step 7: Cut two 2-1/2" \times 58-1/2" strips. Sew a strip to the top and bottom of the quilt top.

Finish quilt as desired.



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
